Many of you have already come forward to volunteer for one of the three shifts and we really appreciate everything that you do. However, we are still in need of some volunteers for the night shift (we only ask you to do every other week and you can sleep!) That is Tuesday nights from 9.45pm to 7am.

Of course you are more than welcome to come along to the evening shift every week if you so desire. We just need to ensure we have a minimum number of volunteers on shift to allow us to open our doors.

There are all sorts of jobs that need doing—from driving the mini bus to collect our guests to cooking to doing the laundry. We are even wondering if there are any counsellors or people with other skillsets that we haven't thought about that might like to pop in to see if they can help.

We will be more than happy to chat over your ideas and queries you may have about contributing to this much needed and worthy annual project. 



As we reach the completion of the first phase of restoration repairs to Binfield All Saints' Parish Church, we would like to reflect on the amazing works that have been undertaken by our contractors and how, together, we have achieved this milestone.


New stone works

All Saint's Church has stood on its site for hundreds of years; some of what you see today can be dated back to the 1300s.

The restoration of the roof and parts of the stone works has enabled us to uncover craftsmanship from the past, which is difficult to replicate today. However, the contractors who have worked to restore All Saints' are specialists in their field and have worked on most of the churches in the area. We are blessed to have them.



As we gather pace working towards phase two of the project (which will see works completed to the roof elevations of the South Aisle and Nave areas) we have already been blessed with giving of £50,000 towards the total of £200,000 (inc VAT). In addition, we anticipate the first phase final costings Lennox forming new leadwork will come in slightly under budget, which will give

continued fund-raising. We thank you for all that you have done and everything that you will do over the coming year.







### Binfield Garden Club

LADYBIRD, LADYBIRD FLY AWAY HOME...One of our best known and loved insects was the subject of our talk on November 2<sup>nd</sup> and what an interesting evening it turned out to be.

Andrew Halstead, whose new edition of his book – Pests and Diseases – will be out next March, told us there are 45 species of ladybirds in the UK. I'm sure most of us can't tell the difference but we enjoyed the photos of ones such as the 24 spot, cream spot, kidney spot and scarce 7 spot. Other amazing ones are the waterside ladybird which can change colour for camouflage and the larch ladybird which has no spots at all!

The harlequin ladybird has been in the news as it arrived in the UK in 2004 and now outnumbers all the others due to the fact it lays more sets of eggs each year. Andrew said it is not all bad as it has a voracious appetite for aphids and also eats up other alien species!

Ladybirds have few natural enemies, their bright colours act as a warning and, if threatened, they produce an orange bitter fluid. They all over-winter, often in houses where they will wake up if it gets too warm and then it is kindest to put them outside to find food and another sheltered place to sleep.

Andrew then expelled the old myth that we need a hard winter to kill off the bugs. NO, bugs all hibernate, but a cold winter will kill off many young birds such as blue tits so when the bugs all wake up in Spring there are fewer birds to eat them!

After tea, questions and a vote of thanks from Richard our chairperson, November's competition winners were announced. Ist for her 'Floral Firework' display was Christine Leonard, 2<sup>nd</sup> Jenny Baxter, 3<sup>rd</sup> Elaine McTaggart, 4<sup>th</sup> Carol Fraser – well done, everyone.

December is our members' Christmas Party and then we look forward to 2018 with our speakers presenting a most exciting range of topics from bats to fungi, Surrey gardens to house plants and many more. **ILLNESS:** Could your pharmacist help? For minor ailments visit the pharmacy to see if they can help rather than a GP. Where the pharmacist cannot help, please call your GP SURGERY (Binfield: 8.00am - 6.30pm, Mon -Fri). Outside of these days or hours please call 111. Please DO NOT call 111 or attend the Urgent Care Centre for an ILLNESS during Binfield Surgery hours of opening. ALWAYS call the surgery first during Surgery Opening Hours.

MINOR INJURY: URGENT CARE CENTRE, BRANTS BRIDGE, BRACKNELL. TEL: 01344 551100. This centre is open 8.00am TO 8.00pm every day.

SEVERE CHEST PAIN: CALL 999.

## ARE YOU REGISTERED AT A GP SURGERY?

There are many patients living in the Binfield area who are NOT REGISTERED with any doctors surgery in the area, only registering when a doctor's services are required.



It is IMPORTANT to register with a doctors surgery BEFORE a doctor's service is required. This is important so as to receive the many services offered more quickly but also to give the surgery the necessary finance for providing them. Binfield surgery receive funding for REGISTERED

patients only. If YOU are one of these UNREGISTERED people please register as soon as possible at your local surgery.

## QUESTIONS YOU PROBABLY WISHED YOU HAD ASKED YOUR DOCTOR:

Have you, like me, left the surgery after your appointment and remembered something you meant to ask but forgot?

Here are some sample questions, some of which you may want to ask:

WHAT ARE THE DIFFERENT TREATMENT OPTIONS?

WHAT OUTCOME SHOULD I EXPECT?

DO WE HAVE TO DO THIS NOW, OR CAN WE REVISIT IT LATER?

IS THERE ANYTHING I CAN DO ON MY OWN TO IMPROVE MY CONDITION?

WHAT ARE THE SIDE EFFECTS?

WHAT QUESTIONS HAVEN'T I ASKED THAT I SHOULD HAVE?

You probably have more or different questions that you would like to ask. It is a good idea to write your questions down and take the piece of paper with you. Your GP will be only too pleased to answer your questions.

### MEDICINE CABINET:

Is your medicine cabinet fit for the winter? Most common ailments, such as colds, sore throats, coughs, a blocked nose or a painful earache CANNOT be treated with antibiotics

WHAT WORKS INSTEAD ?: Adults: Rest, drink plenty of fluids, take pain relievers such as paracetamol or ibuprofen and ask your pharmacist for advice on getting the relief you need. Ask your pharmacist what medicines should be in your cabinet to help you and your family through the winter season.

CHILDREN: Do not give ASPIRIN to children under 13 years of age. For CHILD illnesses, always make a GP appointment.

## Nineteenth Century Rectors of Binfield: Dr Randall (Pt 2)

It seems that The Reverend Randall devoted more personal time to the needs of his parishioners than either of his two predecessors. After 1845 two curates, Richard Randall and, later, Edmund Savory officiated at some of the births, marriages and deaths in Binfield, but by no means all. Savory, much later, aptly summarised Randall's pastoral achievement as "a gradual and patient building up of Church principles which has marked the great religious revival of our day." By this, presumably, he was referring to the growing influence of The Oxford Movement, incidentally, one in which Miss Caswall's uncle, Edward Caswall was eventually extremely influential as a friend and close associate of Cardinal Newman and as a poet and hymnist - the Christmas carol "See Amid the Winter Snow" probably his best-known work.

While he was Rector, Randall was, in 1846, made chaplain to the Bishop of Oxford. He came to be regarded as an expert in ecclesiastical law and must have advised Samuel Wilberforce on contemporary issues such as those associated with the Oxford Movement. He became in 1855, Archdeacon of Berkshire, holding each of these posts until 1869. He was made a canon at Bristol - probably an honorary post - in 1867 and held that office until 1875.

The Oxford Movement's clash with the Anglican church was rarely quite as sublime as Edward Caswell's carol. sometimes the arguments came close to home in Binfield. So, a letter in the Windsor and Eton Express of January 1st 1859 under the heading, "ALLEGED POPISH PRACTICES" claims "We have scarcely settled down after our pretended [sic] Boyn Hill enquiry than are startled by another case, quite as bad as the confessional, in another county, vis., at Lavington, in Sussex, where the rector, the Rev. R. Randall (who bye the bye is a son of Archdeacon Randall, one of the commissioners in the Boyn-hill case), has been in the habit of teaching, or ordering to be taught, in the schools of the place, that the Holy Communion is also called the "Mass," and that there are seven sacraments in our Church". The writer of the letter, a "Maidenhead Protestant" then reports that the curate at Lavington had resigned and that the schoolmaster and choirmaster had resisted inducements to remain. He alleges, also that Archdeacon Randall had assisted his son's attempts to withdraw his order.

A more ordered account of this dispute – perhaps an attempt to find oil for troubled waters – can be found in the correspondence between Randall's son and the Bishop of Chichester which was published in the Oxford Journal of 29<sup>th</sup> January 1859. It is also worthy of note that James Randall was a signatory of a joint letter to the Bishop of Oxford, published in the Berkshire Chronicle of March 12<sup>th</sup> 1859, supporting Oxford against allegations that he had "sanctioned any peculiarities of the Romish system". Nevertheless, both Randall and his son-in-law attended the funeral of Edward Pusey who had become the leader of the Oxford Movement in the early 1840s when John Henry Newman converted to Catholicism.

As Archdeacon of Berkshire, Randall became involved in the issue of the disestablishment of the Church. No wavering here. At his first visitation to Reading in 1855 he stressed "the advantages arising both to the Church and the State from their union; the injury that both (more especially the State) would sustain if their separation were effected" and called "upon all who felt the reality of their membership to stand forth at all times, and in all places, in defence of a Church whose foundations they believed God himself had laid".

As the Rector of Binfield, he became occupied in the temporal as wellas the spiritual needs of his church, principally in the restoration of the building. In his article "In Memoriam - James Randall", in the parish magazine for August 1887, Savory extols Randall's influence on the restoration, at the same time, linking it to changes in the attitudes of the laity demanded by church reforms of the first half of the 19th century. "People resented reform for which they themselves were scarcely ready, and the good of which they scarcely recognised. Restoration meant rates - it meant, in many instances, giving up a cushioned corner in a padded enclosure; it meant, in fact an awakening, and people do not like to be disturbed."

The Reverend Savory, Randall's curate, son-in-law and successor itemises what Randall the restorer achieved: getting rid of the large square pews; cleaning the Chancel roof; strengthening the Chancel walls; removing the galleries; reseating the whole church; building the North Aisle; restoring the Tower. Alongside those improvements to the fabric of All Saints was the building of the church schools and the pastoral work in the village so that, as Savory put it, "Still grew the love of the people for their Church, and with its growth the desire to honour and embellish God's House."

Perhaps less controversial was Randall's work in ensuring the maintenance and success of schooling in Binfield. He ensured pragmatic, business-like management of the Vestry meetings from the outset, and in 1833, very soon after he became Rector, a Sunday school was established. The minutes in 1833 record a resolution, "That a Sunday school be established and that a salary of £5 be allowed to the master of the National School for his attendance thereupon".

Private lives were rarely explored in the Victorian press unless they could be linked to sensational events. Butit seems certain that the Reverend Randall enjoyed [ensured?] a close knit-family. His aged father-in-law and three of his female relatives were part of his family at the Rectory in 1841. He must have been proud, too, in 1845 when "a young gentleman, son of the Rev. Mr. Randall, of Binfield, presented her Majesty with a nosegay, which she was pleased accept" during her passage through Binfield. He would have taken pleasure in the marriage of his daughter to his curate, and in the holiday at the prestigious Crescent Hotel Buxton that he and his wife shared with them in August 1861. Finally, and significantly, he was resident at The Rectory when he died in November 1882, aged 92.

The Reverend Savory, the subject of the next part, conducted his funeral service at All Saints Church in Binfield.


### **Foundation Governor vacancy**


1st BINFIELD SCOUT GROUP


The cost is only **30p per card**. Each envelope will be stamped with the Scout Post logo, before being delivered on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> December .
