

FROM YOUR RECTOR



The Bridge Builder

Once upon a time, there were two brothers. Their father had a large farm and when he became too old to work, he called his sons to him. "I am too old to work anymore," he said. "I will divide my farm in half and give each of you one half. I know that

you will always work together and will be good friends."

When the brothers first started farming on their adjoining farms, they were the best of friends and would share everything together. Then, one day there was an argument between the two brothers and they stopped speaking to one another. For many years, not a word was spoken between them.

One day, one of the brothers was at his house when a carpenter came to his door and said, "I would like to do some work. Do you have any work that I can do?" The brother thought for a moment and then replied, "I would like for you to build a fence on my property. Build it down near the stream there that separates my farm from my brother's. I don't want to see my brother anymore and I would like for you to build a high fence there please. I'm going into town and I'll be back this evening."



Our meeting on October 5th saw Richard introduce John Armand to talk about Unusual Bulbs and how they get to your garden. For over 70 years, Jacques Amand has offered flowering bulbs of many varieties to discerning gardeners. The company began as a flower shop in the Strand when Jean Jacques Amand arrived from the Netherlands in 1927. Since then the company has grown to become a major supplier of bulbs, well-established favourites as well as the rare and unusual. John Amand, is a Director of the family business.

We enjoyed his interesting talk with super slides of many spectacular flowering bulbs. Many of these, such as Liliums, are grown by suppliers in India, near Darjeeling where areas are set up to grow them commercially. We saw how they were cleaned, packed up and shipped by containers. Holland is another vital country for the bulb growers where acres are devoted to building up big stocks of Fritillaries, Alliums etc and of course, tulips. Big numbers mean they can be grown, planted and lifted by machines so the prices can be lower. Many years of work goes into developing new varieties and building up enough stock to sell and his lovely pictures showed fields of colour ready to be cut for the flower markets. John finished his talk with a series of photos showing the setting up from beginning to end, of his glorious stand at Chelsea Flower Show where he has won an amazing total of 31 Gold Medals – so far!! We were very pleased that John had brought a great variety of bulbs for us to buy as well, it's always nice to go home with something!

The competition for a mosaic of seeds and/or plants was won by Jenny Baxter, 2nd Elaine Mctaggart, 3rd Liz Ferris and 4th Christine Leonard. Congratulations. Refreshments and a big raffle rounded off an enjoyable evening.

FLU VACCINATION: The flu vaccination is free if you are a patient of the surgery and are aged over 65 or have certain long term health conditions. FREE SUPPORT TO LOSE WEIGHT:

ALL ARE WELCOME, NONE FORGOTTEN

Every year the nation remembers their sacrifice.

They may have lost a limb last week; or lost their life a century ago.

The ex-servicemen and women who gave — and continue to give — so much towards our safety and security in every theatre of conflict over the past hundred years, are never forgotten by the Royal British Legion. And Binfield's 95-year-old branch plays its proud part in the country's annual season of Remembrance.

The 2017 Poppy Appeal is now underway, with Binfield volunteer collectors manning their posts at The Meadows and our own Parish Appeal Organiser, John Anderson, managing yet another year-long campaign aimed at ever more record-breaking fundraising. Meanwhile, the RBL marches on with its multi-million-pound programme of support for the injured and traumatised who are struggling to make the difficult transition from military to civilian life.

No-one is ever disappointed at the exceptional generosity of donors to the Binfield Poppy Appeal; while enthusiasm constantly grows for taking part in Remembrance events around the village.

On Friday, November 10th, the children of Meadow Vale School are conducting their now-annual Remembrance Assembly, which service veterans and guests look forward to attending, and which commences at 9.15am.

The following day, Saturday, November 11th, marks the 99th anniversary of the Armistice which brought an end to the First World War. The commemoration begins at 10.45am in St Mark's Church grounds, where young people's organisations will join with Service veterans at the Village War Memorial to witness the launch of the eleven o'clock maroon marking the anniversary of the eleventh hour, of the eleventh day, of the eleventh month of 1918 when the guns fell silent.

Binfield Remembrance Parade will muster at Oakmede shops car park at 9.25am on Sunday, November 12th, ready to march at 9.30am sharp along Terrace Road North to All Saints' Church under the measured supervision of the village's illustrious Parade Marshal, serving Staff Sergeant Geraint Davies, Royal Military Police Regiment.

Parade organisers politely ask enthusiastic – and very welcome -- supporters to join the march at the rear, if they wish, in order not to disorient youngsters in their ranks further forward. Many thanks are extended for this understanding.

The Service of Remembrance is set to commence at 10am and will be conducted by Rector of Binfield, Reverend Luke Taylor.

Nineteenth Century Rectors of Binfield: Dr Randall (Pt 1)

James Randall was Rector of Binfield from 1831 to 1859. He was baptized at Compton in Hampshire 20th November 1790. We know that his father was not in orders since he is listed as "gent" in the entry for James in the Alumnii Oxoniensis, the record of Oxford University graduates. Like Dr Gabell James was educated at Winchester. In fact, as explained in the previous part, he would almost certainly have been taught by Dr Gabell. After Winchester he went, in 1809, to Trinity College, Oxford where he eventually became a fellow. His academic career was brilliant, as is indicated by his scholarship to Winchester, his First in Humanities at Oxford, his fellowship between 1818 and 1821 at Trinity College and his law studies. In addition he published at least two theological works and several pamphlets in his lifetime.

One of the theological works, "Sermons on the Books of Joel, Jonah, Nahum, Micah and Habakkuk, and on some passages of Isaiah and Ezekiel" may still be read online by searching online with the above title, so it is possible to consider whether, as stated in the preface to his Sermons, they achieved their goal of assisting "members of country congregations in understanding and profitably applying some of the prophecies most frequently brought under their notice in the services of the Church." In addition, to consider whether the review of the Rector's work published in the Bath Chronicle of July 14th 1843 is justified. The reviewer states, "Our inspection of these discourses authorises us to say, without hesitation, that the author has discharged the above important duty in a manner which establishes for him a high character as Christian minister, and with a degree of literary ability which stamps him as a writer of considerable talent." He goes on to support his claim, concluding by saving that "these sermons [would be] admirable, adapted for family reading", a statement that allows considerable speculation as to the conduct of family prayers at the time - at least in the better-off houses, since the volume of sermons cost half a guinea.

Much earlier in his life Randall spent some of the time between graduating in 1813 and taking up his fellowship, as an assistant master at Rugby School. His time at Rugby was just a decade before Webb-Ellis is alleged to have "picked up the ball and run with it" - to begin the history of the game of Rugby football - and about 15 years before Thomas Arnold began to introduce his influential educational reforms at the school.

There was tricky beginning to his rectorship. The Reading Mercury of December 5th 1831 reported a meeting in Binfield. "At a respectable Meeting of the Tithe-Payers in the Parish, held at the Stag and Hounds Inn, Binfield, Tuesday last, with a view of coming to some arrangement with the Rector respecting future payments of the Tithe, it was resolved to adjourn till Monday next, December 5th at three o'clock in the afternoon precisely, when it

will be proposed to nominate a Committee wait on the Rector to point out several inequalities in the present mode of rating, and to come to an amicable arrangement of all matters in regard to the Tithe in the Parish. All persons who feel aggrieved at the amount of the rent of their Tithe are requested be punctual in their attendance." Tithes were a national issue around the time of the 1832 Reform Act, but there appears to be no newspaper report either of the meeting of December 5th or of any subsequent committee waiting on the Rector, so presumably, in Binfield, the issue was resolved

Katherine Caswall, in her 1921 memoir of mainly Victorian Binfield reports that James Randall had practised law before taking orders a claim is confirmed by Canon Carter's reference in the obituary notice in "The Guardian" of November 24th 1882 to Randall's "legal knowledge". It seems that he studied Law after his short teaching career. He was a barrister at law in Lincoln's Inn in 1818. Other than this, much of Randall's early career mirrored Dr Gabell's: both won scholarships to Winchester, both went on to become fellows of an Oxford college, and both became teachers before entering the ministry.

But there were differences in their ecclesiastical careers. Randall took a parish quite early in his career, and he was a busy rector. There is no record of any curate conducting a funeral service in Binfield between 1836 and 1845. Either he had no curate for those years, or he was relying for some of the time on the help of his sons, James Leslie and Richard, acting as assistant curates.

The 1841 census lists Randall as "Clerk". His wife and two daughters were at the Rectory The census shows, also that his father in law, Richard Lowndes, then 80 years old was living with them, and that there were three younger Lowndes relatives: Eliza [20], Sarah [15] and William [10].

Randall was absent from The Rectory on the night of the 1851 census in Binfield, but his wife, Rebecca [62] and his daughter, Diana [25] were at home together with 4 house servants, a butler and a gardener.

In the 1851 census James' son, Richard Randall is listed as the assistant curate of Binfield. It shows that Richard [26], lived near to the Church, along The Terrace [now Terrace Road North] with his wife, Wilhelmina, née Bruxner [29], daughter of the then resident of Binfield Manor, and their son. Richard G Randall [5]. The Randall's other son, James Leslie Randall went on to enjoy a distinguished career in the Church. Ordained deacon in 1852, priest in 1853, he was the curate of Warfield from 1852 to 1857, and rector of Newbury from 1857 to 1878, thence becoming archdeacon of Buckingham, and eventually being made suffragan bishop of Reading. It seems, incidentally, that keeping the curacy of a parish within the family, was guite common practice - at least around Binfield. The rector in 1817, the Reverend William Cookson had had as his curate his elder son, George Cookson.



Foundation Governor vacancy


We have a vacancy for a Foundation Governor to serve as part of the Governing Board at our lovely village Church of England Primary School.


