### FROM YOUR RECTOR



### **The Cracked Pot**

A water bearer in China had two large pots, each hung on the ends of a pole which he carried across his neck. One of the pots had a crack in it, while the other pot was perfect and always delivered a full portion of

water. At the end of the long walk from the stream to the house, the cracked pot arrived only half full.

For a full two years this went on daily, with the bearer delivering only one and a half pots full of water to his house. Of course, the perfect pot was proud of its accomplishments, perfect for which it was made. But the poor cracked pot was ashamed of its own imperfection, and miserable that it was able to accomplish only half of what it had been made to do.

After two years of what it perceived to be a bitter failure, it spoke to the water bearer one day by the stream. "I am ashamed of myself, because this crack in my side causes water to leak out all the way back to your house."

The bearer said to the pot, "Did you notice that there were flowers only on your side of the path, but not on the other pot's side? That's because I have always known about your flaw, and I planted flower seeds on your side of the path, and every day while we walk back, you've watered them. For two years I have been able to pick these beautiful flowers to decorate the table. Without you being just the way you are, there would not be this beauty to grace the house."

If you feel more like the broken pot, and you focus more on your flaws, why not try focusing on all the beauty and grace that you bring to this world. If as you read that last sentence you have just thought I don't, then write down three things every day that you have done to help others. Very soon you will begin to see how, like the broken water pot, you too can make a difference in this world. And remember as well, that the Bible says you are "fearfully and wonderfully made." Psalm 139 verse 14. And God doesn't make mistakes!



#### **Happy New Year!**

We hope you all had a wonderful time over Christmas and have enjoyed seeing in 2018.

We are ready to start another year of fundraising, especially since we've started to feel a difference with the church seeming to be warmer inside already! This photo, taken by Liz Hall during the recent snowy weather, shows how the new roof at the East end, with the new tiles, felt and insulation is effectively keeping out the cold, while the part which has yet to be worked on is not doing such a good job!

In the next phase of work, we are hoping that repairs will be carried out on the rest of the roof to match it all in and increase the benefits we are already seeing. Worryingly, there was some water ingress in this other part of the roof before Christmas, so we know that these repairs are now vital too.

We are currently waiting on further cost information for the outstanding repair work, so that the Fabric team can put the work out to tender again, and we will then have a better idea of how much it will cost to complete, and how much more we need to raise.

We would like to thank those who have been continuing to help us raise those funds, including Liz Hall and all the 1st Binfield Rainbows and Brownies who took part in their carol singing session at Tesco's in Warfield on 4<sup>th</sup> December. They did such a great job entertaining the shoppers, and raised a fantastic £391.82!

Thanks also to Margareta Hawkins who raised £400 selling her wonderful gingerbread houses and churches over Christmas, and Liz Ferris has now raised over £400 through her jewellery sales.

We appreciate all these efforts, so please get in touch if you have any ideas or an event you'd like to run this year.



The founder, Jacob Jacobson, wanted to consistently brew the best beer so a laboratory was set up in 1875 with the aim to develop a scientific basis for the malting, brewing and fermenting operations of beer. The new laboratory was established in 1896.

It was here that Soren Sorenson introduced the concept of pH to measure acidity, critical in brewing beer. Richard, being a scientist, could have lost some of us here, but he cleverly kept us entertained describing how the pH scale works and how useful it is, not only for constant beer quality but also essential for farmers and gardeners to provide plants with the ideal soil they require. It is certainly something we will all think about in future and maybe get testing our own garden soil.

## Nineteenth Century Rectors of Binfield: Edmund Savory

**Edmund Savory**, Dr Randall's curate was born in 1826, came to Binfield in 1853 and was rector from 1859 until 1903, when he retired and, it is reported, moved to Wallingford. So, with his six-year curacy, he attended to the religious needs of the parish for 50 years, mostly as rector immediately following the 28 year rectorship of Dr Randall. He also served as the Rural Dean of Maidenhead, from 1881 to 1902, and was appointed an honorary Canon of Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford from 1881 until his death at Woodlands, in Crowthorne in 1912.

While serving as Binfield's curate he married, in the autumn of 1853, Diana Maria, James Randall's younger daughter. Previously, he had studied at Oriel College, Oxford - the cradle of the Oxford Movement and we know that he shared the relatively conservative high church religious perspectives of his father-in law. He received his BA in 1847, and became the fourth fellow [teacher] to be appointed to the then recently established Radley College. He took Holy orders in 1851, and left Radley in 1852 presumably to take up his appointment in Binfield. In 1849, it was Edmund Savory and a colleague who first took some Radley boys rowing on the river thus initiating the school's eventual fine reputation in the sport. In his memoirs, Philip Gurdon, Radley's first rowing blue, describes the event: "The beginning was this - one morning Messrs Savory and Howard chose six boys and me as cox, took us up to Sandford where an eight was lying - I don't know where she came from. We all got in and rowed her to the new boat house."

Diana and Edmund had a son and a daughter. James Henry was baptised at Binfield on April 15th 1855. He was educated at Winchester College and, from 1874, at Trinity College, Oxford, receiving his MA in 1885. The next year he became vicar of Little Dalby in Leicestershire, subsequently in 1896 getting the chaplainship of the chapel at Bayham Abbey until his death in August 1903. The Savorys' daughter, Mary Rebe Diana Ellen Savory, was born in 1866, 11 years after James and there appears to be no records of other birth or deaths in between. She was still living at the Rectory in 1891. Subsequently there is no record of a marriage, but also none of her death.

From the addresses he wrote in the Parish Magazine, a forerunner of the Binfield Beacon, and something he initiated, it seems that Savory was a "hands on" rector - aware that he had a responsibility for more than just the spiritual needs of his parish. He attended to what he saw as Binfield labourers' social and cultural needs with skill and imagination. One is dealt with in this part in some detail.

As well as developing the parish magazine project, he was clearly the motivating force behind the establishment of the Working Men's Club. The parish magazine records its progress from the first meeting, in early 1884, when 80 men of the village met and "expressed warmly their approval of the proposed club." In pressing for such a club Savory expressed the hope that "the establishment of this institution would promote the happiness and mutual benefit of the working men of this parish." And there was pace and effort in the early stages of the planning: within a month nearly £200, just under half of the eventual capital cost of the club, had been given or firmly promised. Despite some setbacks an enforced change of site and difficulties in raising the balance of the sum required - the building was completed and a constitution established.

The club opened in mid 1885. In the Parish Magazine of January 1886, we can estimate its early success, detect something of Savory's motives in pressing for it, and share in his satisfaction. He writes: "The rules have been kept without any symptoms of discontent. The rooms are bright and cheerful and it is pleasant to see so many men enjoying themselves thoroughly in a quiet and rational manner." Possibly a little patronising, but he was almost certainly trying to convince the subscribers - certainly not numbered among the "working men" of the village - that their subscriptions had been put to good use. After all, there was a book by Samuel Smiles in the Club's library.

Nearly 10 years later in 1895 he has clearly retained his interest in the Club and its associations. So, for example, on the 19th of October, the Reading Mercury can report: "BINFIELD. Working Men's Band - A most enjoyable evening was spent by the members of the Binfield Working Men's Club String Band, on October 9th, when they were entertained to supper by the Rev. Canon Savory, president of the Club. A capital supper was provided by Mrs. Spencer, at her house in Terrace Road. A unanimous vote of thanks was accorded the President for his kindness, and the remainder of the evening was spent in the revision of many old favourite pieces."

Furthermore, the Rector's interest was not just Presidential. In 1888, with the club clearly well-established, there came the need for a steward. On September the 29th, an advertisement was placed in the Reading Mercury: "WANTED, for a Working Men's Club, a married man without encumbrance, to act as STEWARD. He might take other work by day, but must devote his evenings to the Club. Apply to Rev. E. Savory, Rectory, Binfield."

The next parts will outline Reverend Savory's further village and church initiatives.

## **Binfield CE Primary School (VA)**

**Thinking of others at Christmas**As usual, the run up to Christmas was a very busy time in school. Amongst the celebrations, which included

Christmas Lunch for 500, a visit from Father Christmas and, of course, our Nativity services, we held a Christmas Jumper Day which raised £360 to be split between Save the Children Fund and Shelter. We really enjoyed seeing the children embracing the theme and their awareness of the charities' beneficiaries being those less fortunate than us. Additionally, the collections taken at the Christmas performances raised a total of £297, which will be donated to Helen and Douglas House Hospice Care for Children and Young Adults.



#### Binfield Primary School is 30 in 2018!

Binfield CE Primary School (VA) opened in 1988 when a piece of farm land was turned into what is now known as Foxley Fields. Prior to this, the children of Binfield were taught at two village schools, St Mark's and All Saints'. As the village expanded, these schools became too small to support the growing population and our primary school was built incorporating both schools. However, we have retained continuity with the past - outside the Headteacher's office is the

school bell from All Saints' School dated 1852, and each child in Year 6 is invited to ring the bell on their last day in school in July!

In March this year we will be celebrating our 30<sup>th</sup> birthday with a visit from the Bishop of Reading, together with the opportunity for past pupils, staff and those with community links to the school to join guided tours of the site.
