The other side of the wall

There was a young woman who took great pride in the growth and care of the flowers in her flower garden. She had been raised by her grandmother who taught her to love and

care for flowers as she herself had done. So, like her grandmother, her flower garden was second to none.

One day while looking through a flower catalogue she often ordered from, a picture of a plant immediately caught her eye. She had never seen blooms on a flower like that before. "I have to have it," she said to herself, and she immediately ordered it.

The Binfield ARC project: Fundraising for essential repairs to our historic Parish Church

All Saints' Church Needs Your Help!

Donations Received: Binfield PCC: Charitable Grants:

£171,016 £100,000 £42,000

NEW PHASE 2 TOTAL: £50,481

Project Phase 2 Cost: £260,000

Fundraising Update:

We are pleased to report that Phase 1 is now officially closed – the final bills have now been paid! This means that we can now confirm the good news that Phase 1 cost less than the amount initially forecast:

Phase 1 Fundraising Target: £230,000

Total Phase 1 Funds Raising (inc grants): £211,648

Phase 1 Actual Cost (minus VAT reclaimed): £162,535

Donations carried over from Phase 1: £49,113

This means that we have been able to rollover the additional amount of donations contributed into Phase 2.


We now also have estimates for how much the next Phase of repairs will also cost. The goal is for all outstanding repair work to be combined into one lot of work. This however depends on the next round of fundraising and how much we are able to raise. The work will be broken down based on available funds if necessary, and the actual figures may again change once the work is put out to tender. The amount held by the PCC will once again be used as a fundmatching base for the additional grants we will be applying for.

Phase 2 Fundraising Target: £260,000 Current Phase 2 Fundraising Total: £50,481.

So now we have these figures, the Fundraising Team are all ready to crack on with those grant applications and hopefully again helping to coordinate a series of fun events which we can all enjoy while we raise the money to complete these vital repairs to our beautiful church.

So please get in touch if you have any ideas or any event you'd like to run this year. No idea is too small and all your input and support is always appreciated!



- 1. When you need help fast but it is not an emergency and the surgery is closed **TELEPHONE 111.** When the surgery is **OPEN**, ALWAYS telephone the surgery in the first instance.
- 2. If your health need is urgent please telephone Binfield surgery Monday to Friday (01344 286264) before 10.00am. You will generally be offered a same day appointment.
- 3. The Bracknell Urgent Care Centre is open 7 days a week, 365 days a year from 8.00am to 8.00pm for minor injuries and 6.30pm to 8.00pm for minor illnesses. Telephone 01344 551100. BEFORE telephoning Brants Bridge and when the surgery is OPEN, please telephone the surgery (01344 286264) to find out if this is the most appropriate service for your needs. When the surgery is closed please TELEPHONE 111. They will direct you to the most appropriate service for your needs.
- 4. Call **999** for life-threatening conditions.
- 5. DO NOT FORGET THE NEW EXTENDED HOURS SERVICE for PLANNED care, NOT Urgent Care. This service is provided by Berkshire Primary Care Ltd on behalf of all the Bracknell and Ascot surgeries. The new appointment times on offer are 6.30pm to 8.00pm Monday to Friday and 8.00am to 2.00pm on Saturdays. these appointments are of 15 minute duration and held at Boundary House Surgery in Bracknell. They should be booked Monday to Friday through Binfield surgery,

01344 286264, at normal Binfield surgery opening times. There is plenty of car parking and Boundary House surgery is close to public transport.

REPEAT PRESCRIPTIONS:

Repeat prescriptions are NOT available by telephone request. Repeat prescriptions are ONLY available by the following two methods:

- 1. Fill in a repeat prescription form at the Binfield surgey reception desk.
- 2. Through the computerised EMIS ACCESS system. If you are not yet on EMIS please attend Binfield surgery with 2 forms of ID and speak with a receptionist. They will guide you through the EMIS system. Once you are 'up and running' you can then order repeat prescriptions from your home computer.

The EMIS system also allows you to peruse your personal medical records and book appointments. Many other items are also available using this computerised system.



<u>Parish Council Office extension works underway</u> It's exciting to share with you all that the Parish Office extension works, with a new Community Hub and extended car park for Foxley Fields, has started! The work commenced during February and the site is fully contained. This means that the site has all of its own parking, with no contractors parking in the surrounding areas, but this will mean the car park is now closed during the works.

The project is expected to be completed by mid-September 2018 with the new car park able to accommodate a total of 22 spaces, including disabled parking bays, and a dedicated drop off area. The Parish Office Team have the following suggestions for Binfield Primary School drop off/pick-ups:

- A car share with neighbours or friends?
- Dropping older children further away to give them valuable experience of making some of the journey on foot on their own?
- Starting a walking bus with friends sharing the walks?
- If driving is the only option are there other places to park? A friend's drive? Popes Meadow? The Daruchini are happy for their car park to be used at school drop off/pick up times with walking options straight down Terrace Road South or a quicker route around Foxley Lane onto Benetfeld Road.

Annual Parish Meeting – 8pm on Thursday 15 March at the Binfield Memorial Hall Every year the Parish Council is required to hold an "Electors' Meeting" where residents can come and find out about the work of the Parish Council – what projects it is planning, how public monies are being spent. This year the meeting is in March and we welcome all residents to come along. If there are topics you would like to know about or want us to include please do get in touch.

<u>Considerate driving and parking</u> We do receive a lot of concerns from residents about inconsiderate driving and parking in Binfield.

Please remember the following:

- "Park and Stride" consider parking further away if possible and walking part of your journey
- Avoid driving and parking on the pavement as children are taught that the pavement is a safe place
- Parking restrictions single yellow lines, double yellow lines, school keep clear yellow zig zag lines
- **Dropped kerbs** are there to assist people with pushchairs and wheelchairs to cross the road, Verges do not park on verges as the damage is unsightly & costly to repair
- Speed please drive slowly & observe speed limits
- **General inconvenience** avoid double parking or blocking residents' driveways, and please always be polite when speaking with people about these difficult issues.

Binfield Garden Club

Our speaker on 1 February was Joy Craig from Avoncourt Fuchsias in Earley. Joy treated us to an extremely interesting and informative talk and slideshow on "Fuchsias: my way for the garden

and show bench". Joy is a member of several societies, including the British Fuchsia Society and a national judge. Joy's "addiction" to fuchsias really started in 1979 when she visited the flower marguee at the King's Meadow Horticultural Show in Reading and came away with a Dollar Princess fuchsia. Joy was encouraged to join the Reading & District Fuchsia Society where she met George Bartlett to whom she credits most of her knowledge. In 1980 Joy bought her first greenhouse and from there it just grew and grew. She learnt how to take cuttings, how best to feed her plants and combat insects and rust. After winning her first novice's cup Joy was spurred on to enter other shows and realised she had a knack for growing fuchsias and geraniums, winning many cups over the years. In her 60's Joy was encouraged to take a stewards course and is now a National Steward for the British Fuchsia Society as well as a National Judge which is about as high as you can really go in the fuchsia world.

Joy keeps her show and pot plants in a heated greenhouse over the winter and waters ever 2-3 weeks just to keep the soil damp. At the end of February she starts to feed weekly with a high nitrogen feed. From the beginning of April to the end of August this is replaced with a fully balanced feed. Show plants are fed on a daily basis for a profusion of flowers and patio pots once a week. Joy recommends using a good quality, fine, multi purpose compost and uses Rose Clear Ultra to control whitefly, greenfly and rust. Rust is highly contagious so if you spot it on your plant you should remove the rusted leaves and isolate it from the others. Hardy plants should be fed once a week and not cut back until April. When taking cuttings Joy finds that she has better success when she puts 5 or 6 small cuttings in a pot together. She takes small tip cuttings with stems of about 1cm long from the stock plant and tucks them round the edge of a small pot. She dates and labels the pot and gives them a drink (always watering from the top) and in about 4 to 5 weeks they should start to root.

Joy's talents also extend to crafts and cake making and we are very much hoping to sample these during a visit to her garden later in the year.

After tea and questions, our February competition winners for "Display of foliage and/or stems" were announced -1^{st} Christine Leonard, 2^{nd} Nancy Bowen, 3^{rd} Belinda Thornhill, 4^{th} Caroline Matthews.

Our next meeting, which is also our AGM, is on 1 March. Our speaker for the evening will be Rose-Ann Movsovic who will be giving us a talk on "Bats in the Garden" and the monthly competition is "St David's Day pot or vase of daffodils".

Nineteenth Century Rectors of Binfield: Edmund Savory

(Part 2 of 3) by John Harman

Canon Savory, as he eventually became, was a keen local historian. In the Binfield Parish Magazine, he produced a series of notes on the history of Binfield, gleaned from All Saints' archives and from his wider reading. As mentioned last month, he was the force behind the Parish magazine, which flourished towards the end of the 19th Century, eventually selling 250 copies monthly. And he continued the church restoration started by his father-in-law: providing the display in All Saints listing all the rectors of the parish and, in 1887, arranging the memorial to his father-in-law. It was described in Kelly's Directory as "a beautiful carved reredos, in three compartments".

His interest in local history meant that he could, when in 1899 the Berkshire Archaeological Society made an "excursion" to All Saints, give them a very full account of the church's monuments and history. The account is summarised in the Reading Mercury's edition of June 3rd 1899. Canon Savory's interest in local history was again recognised in May 1903 just before his eventual retirement, when he became the Binfield "helper", offering copy for the New Victoria County History which was being prepared.

He was interested also in demographic patterns in Binfield. He used census material to plot the growth in the population of the village, showing it [though not tabulated as below] to be a regular steady increase of about 70 inhabitants each year:

And he reported each year the numbers of births deaths and marriages, sometimes, as in 1885 when there was a 50% increase in deaths recorded in the village, commenting on these inexplicable blips in the statistical pattern, and breaking down the incidence of the deaths into age ranges, which showed [again not originally tabulated]:

Age ranges [between] 0 10 20 30 40 50 60 70 80 Deaths in each range 7 0 1 1 0 4 6 4

Such figures seem to suggest even in 1855 a death rate in the village of about 1.33 per 100 villagers so, despite the concerns of 1885, Binfield in the late 19th century seems a healthy place to live. Savory's interest in these figures suggests that he appreciated that tracing socio-economic trends could be beneficial to his parish. For example, in 1886 when there had been only three marriages, he lamented the fact that two of the six people involved still could not write their signature. So he understood the growing need for universal literacy, and was an advocate of the public library facility that had been set up within the village "In this age of intellectual advancement, no

Parish ought to be without its public lending library. . . . The need for an institution of this kind is felt by more than one class of people." - again a practical, parish self-help philosophy.

Concerns such as these indicate that the Reverend Savory as keeping abreast of the social developments of the 19th century; a Blue Book approach to health, the library movement and the trend towards universal education - all flavoured by the "Self Help" approach popularized by Samuel Smiles. He became involved, also, in the development in Binfield of a branch of the Royal Berkshire Friendly Society. Friendly societies had evolved from the Clothing Clubs that sprung up in the earlier part of the century. Both kinds of organization sought to promote thrift - insurance against a rainy day. Savory was with Mr Hutchinson Browne who had settled in Binfield after retiring as a high-ranking administrator in Australia - closely involved in the development of the Binfield branch. And there is evidence that he sought to promulgate self-help insurance projects elsewhere. For example, the Reading Mercury of February 8th 1883 headlined "INSURANCE WITH RESPECT TO SCHOOL TEACHERS", and reported. "This subject which was discussed at the last meeting of the Association at Sandhurst was resumed by the Rev. E. Savory, of Binfield, who read a second paper on the subject. In the course of is remarks the rev. gentleman said that on the general advantages of life insurance he need say nothing. They had only to take up the prospectus and report of any of the great Insurances Companies to find cogent arguments prove that no individual was justified in neglecting it, and that it was of the almost importance to every class of community. Certainly school teachers could not claim exemption from the general obligation."

And, as a sporting footnote , seemingly against the tide of opinion, the Rector supported the introduction of football in the Village, obviously understanding some of the problems of the game, and claiming for it qualities that many modern professionals could benefit from appreciating more fully: "I know of no game which teaches, better than football, the difficult lesson of self-command; which helps better to enable you to keep your temper under aggravating, sometimes very aggravating, circumstances." His understanding of the game arose from his son's ability. James Henry played both Football and Cricket for his school, Winchester College, in 1873 and 1874, and then at university for his college, Trinity, Oxford. Picked for the University team, he played at half back in the Oxford side that lost 1-2 to Wanderers, six-time FA Cup winners between 1871 and 1878, in the final of 1877. And he was a double Blue, having played in the Varsity matches against Cambridge in 1877 and 1878. The 1877 match was played in front of crowds at Lords of more than 10,000 on each day. James Henry went in at number 6 with the score at 25 for 4 wickets. He was bowled for a duck, but Oxford eventually won the match over two innings.


