FROM YOUR RECTOR



Reconciliation The struggle at the end of conflict.

It's easy to assume that reconciliation happens only at the end of conflict, but of course there are moments, even in the midst of

war, when by the mercy of God there is a space for compassion and peace. We have all heard of the Christmas Truce in 1914; there was a more limited truce again in 1915 and, at times during the worst of the conflict, soldiers who respected one another would pause for a short while. An unidentified soldier reported: "We shouted to the Germans to come and fetch their wounded.....we promised not to shoot, and a man who wore the iron cross advance to assist a wounded man. Another followed and, amidst our cheers, they carried him off. Before going, the first man saluted and said, 'Thank you, gentlemen, I thank you very much. Good day.' The incident quite upset me for a time and I wished we might all be friends again."

At the end of the war, the victorious soldiers marched into Germany and the two nations came face to face. A private in the Scots Guards wrote: "I had serious misgivings before entering Germany. My comrades vowed such vengeance on the people that I anticipated something worse than war...... no treatment was going to be bad enough and cruel enough. What was my surprise to find, after two or three days in Germany, all our roaring lions converted into sucking doves. The army, without any prompting, took up an unexpected attitude of friendliness..."

Reconciliation came sometimes between the families of opposing troops. A German, Egbert Wagner, met a wounded British soldier, Jack Brewster, pulled him into a shell hole, bandaged him and, as he wrote to the distraught British man's parents: "Acting on the command of our Lord Jesus, 'Love your enemies,' I provided him with bread and wine and had a lot of conversation with him." He was able to report Jack's convalescence. In 1918, Jack's parents helped Egbert's brother, then a POW in British hands. A bond of friendship was firmly established between the families.

The last veteran of the war, Harry Patch, who died in 2009 aged 111, spent much time towards the end of his life talking about the need for reconciliation. In 2004, he visited the battlefields and met the last surviving German veteran, Charles Kuentz: "Charles was conscripted just like myself and fought for the Kaiser as I had fought for the King, relations, of course, cousins, so it was a family affair. It shows you how stupid war is." The two men,

through an interpreter, spoke and exchanged presents and shook hands. In Ypres that evening, they sat side by side for the nightly ceremony of commemoration at the Menin Gate; Harry commented: "I felt sorry for what Charles had to go through; no one deserved to go through that war."

I guess the problem is, it is easy to talk about reconciliation when we're not the ones having to do it, but how do you prevent war from breaking out in your relationships? You remember the words of Harry Patch who said, "War is stupid.....no one deserved to go through that war." How do you prevent that from happening again? You try to live out the words of Jesus like Egbert Wagner did, "love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." Matthew Chapter 5 verse 44. Which way will you chose?







The new development at Amen Corner North features the following names

Attlee	Reverend Bernard Henry Bravery, DD FRHC, Clerk in Holy Orders, brother of British post-war Prime Minister Clement Attlee, was Rector of Binfield 1929-35. He was Asst Curate of St Paul's, Haggerston 1897-1901; Vicar of Wolvercote 1901-09 and Vicar of Chieveley 1909-29. During WW1 he was Acting Chaplain, RN 1915-16.
Bonsey	Reverend Hugh Richmond, MA, was Asst Curate of Lambeth Parish Church 1912; Forces Chaplain to 42 nd Infantry Brigade Expeditionary Force in WWI; vicar of Fernhurst, West Sussex 1918, Rector of Checkendon, Oxfordshire 1922 and Rector of Binfield 1927-1929
Chapman	Gunner George, 142 nd Heavy Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery, died aged 33 in February 1921 of malaria contracted while serving in Salonika up to 1919. Born and married in Binfield his name appears on the triptych dedicated at All Saints' Church and he is buried in a Commonwealth War Graves Commission grave in Binfield cemetery.
Duncan	Major General Sir John, KCB, CB, CMG, CVO, DSO, was awarded many other decorations after entering the Army in 1891, retiring in 1928. He lived at Marchfield and died on September 17 th 1948.
Russell	Private Henry George, 6 th Battalion, Royal Berkshire Regiment, born and lived in Binfield, son of Alfred Russell of

Binfield Garden Club

Our speaker on 4th October was Dr Michael Keith-Lucas, a retired senior tutor in plant sciences at Reading University. Michael visited us back in 2016

giving an enthralling talk about the use of pollen in solving crime and certainly didn't disappoint this time round with an equally fascinating talk on "Pollination – The Sex Life of Flowers".

150 million years ago, during the Jurassic period, there were no flowering plants or pollinating insects and plants relied on the wind for pollination. This was extremely inefficient, with the chances of pollen landing in the right place around 1 in a million but during the early Cretaceous period the first insect pollinated plants and pollinating insects started to appear and today the vast majority of plant species rely on insects to transport pollen from male to female flower parts. Relatives of the magnolia and water lily were amongst the earliest flowering plants to appear, attracting solitary wasps, which later evolved into bees, and beetles.

The relationship between plant and insect is mutually beneficial and flowering plants have evolved to use colour, scent (both fragrant and downright disgusting), pollen, nectar and even some sneaky mimicry to make themselves as appealing as possible to the insect world. The bee orchid, for example, has flowers which look like a female bee - the males fly in to mate with it and end up pollinating the flower. Bees are attracted to ultra violet wavelengths and many flowers have patterns of UV within their petals which point out the nectar and pollen at their centre. Some flowers, particularly alpines, have spots on their flowers which change colour once visited. Whilst insects are by far the most common pollinators, birds, bats and some small mammals also play a part and the plant adapts its flowers to attract the most advantageous pollinator. Birds are particularly attracted to red flowers, whilst bats are drawn to white or cream flowers which emit a rather obnoxious scent resembling their own.

It's difficult to say which came first, the plant or pollinator, as both have evolved together – in some instances to such an extent that a particular plant species may only be pollinated by one particular insect. There is a Madagascan orchid with a tubular flower a foot and a half long. Darwin predicted that it must be pollinated by a gigantic moth (undiscovered at the time) with a foot and a half long tongue. Sure enough 20 years after his death such a moth was discovered!

After the refreshment break the monthly competition results were announced. Unfortunately this year's early cold weather and the subsequent summer heatwave wasn't the best for potatoes but well done to Nancy Bowen, the winner of October's competition for the "Largest home grown potato".

Spaces for the members-only Christmas trip to Wisley on 6 December are now extremely limited but there will be a waiting list should anyone, who has not yet done so, wish to put their name down.

On Thursday 1st November our speaker will be Geoff Hawkins with a talk on "House plants". Geoff was head gardener at the private estate of Mill Court near Alton, Hampshire until he retired in 2012. Since then he has been a horticultural speaker, broadcaster and gardening consultant.



Ways to Remember Great-Grandad

To say Thank You seems a very easy thing to do.

But, when the words need to cross generations to reach those who belonged to another age, it's maybe not so simple.

The Royal British Legion has an answer. The #ThankYou100 campaign is covering all walks of life in order that people at home, work and play can convey their gratitude to today's generation for the part their grandparents and great-grandparents played throughout the horrors of World War 1 to protect our enjoyment of freedom.

At summer events large and small, members and supporters of the RBL have taken stalls to display family photos, letters and mementoes which bring to life the images and thoughts of ancestors and friends who experienced the horrors of a century ago.

With this year's Remembrance season upon us, the opportunity presents itself to express our heartfelt message of Thank You in some form which proves to today's friends and colleagues that the contribution of their relatives and ancestors to a world-changing war 100 years ago will never be forgotten.

A pot of poppies in the garden at home; a sing-a-long of WW1 songs at a tea party; a pub quiz with questions testing general knowledge of life at the time of the conflict. How about researching websites on the subject, and sharing findings with children; perhaps printing-out a page or two for them to show their teacher at school – or for you to pin on the noticeboard at work?

Ask your library to source books like *Goodbye to All That* by Rupert Graves or *Undertones of War* by Edmund Blunden. No literature is more effectively infused with the atmosphere of the time than the work of the famous poets and writers from the 1914-18 trenches or the home front.

Binfield Environment Group

The aim of Binfield Environment Group is to encourage the community of Binfield to take pride in their environment by involving groups, individuals and businesses in a variety of projects to enhance habitats for wildlife and to encourage conservation, recycling and the clearing of litter.

Binfield residents know how lucky they are to live in Binfield and to enjoy its open green spaces and the nature that make the parish its home. We are also lucky to live in Bracknell Forest. Bracknell Forest Council have created one of the most coherent plans in the country for how its residents will "continue to enjoy the wonderful natural environment that Bracknell Forest offers". They have done a great job of turning the plethora of EU, national, regional and county strategies and plans into a sensible set of targets to improve the nature of the borough over the next five years. The organisations responsible for delivering these targets range from borough and parish councils to specialist conservation organisations like the Berkshire and South Buckinghamshire Bat Group. Bracknell Forest Council have just launched the latest version of their Biodiversity Action Plan (available from their website), and Binfield Parish Council, Binfield Environment Group and other local organisations contributed to it and will play a part in delivering it.

The Biodiversity Action Plan is based around the six distinct natural habitats that are found in Bracknell Forest, the threats they face and the opportunities for improvement. Five of the six habitats are found in Binfield: grassland; woodland; wetland; farmland and urban. In the plan, these habitats are brought to life through biodiversity action plan species. The species relevant to the habitats found in Binfield are insects (bumblebees and stag beetle), plants (ragged robin, devil's bit scabious, wild service tree, and cowslip), birds (bullfinch and kingfisher, skylark, barn owl and swift), mammals (noctule bat and hedgehog), fish (brown trout) and amphibians (great crested newt).

Binfield Environment Group, with the help of Binfield Parish Council, are developing plans to do our bit to help these species. One of the things that we want to do is get a better understanding of which of these species can be found where in Binfield. So, we would love to hear from you if you have seen any of these species in Binfield.
