

Almost There!!

We are now so close to reaching our first target, standing at just over 90% of the way towards the amount needed to pay for the first phase of repairs. Preparations are underway to have a contractor ready to start on the work on All Saints' as soon as possible.

We are continuing to look at ways we can push on to raise the total amount needed for Phase 1, and to look towards carrying on the work in the next Phase!

Lent is coming early this year, so if you are planning to give up chocolate or wine, perhaps you might consider donating the money you save to the project.

Or do you think your employer might consider making a donation? Thanks to a great suggestion from a member of the congregation, we have created a template for members of the Parish to use to approach their employers and to ask them to consider making a donation to the project. The Business Donation Letter is available to download via the website at www.binfieldarcproject.org.uk/ howtohelp, or email the fundraising team or church office and ask for a copy. We would be happy to give them publicity in return for their contribution!


Parking. Parking. Parking.

Many of us are affected by the challenges caused from inconsiderate parking. This is the number one cause of complaints received here at the Parish Office. Whether to do with the school run, Saturday morning football or someone blocking a drive to pop to a shop it's a real bug bear throughout the parish. The Neighbourhood Policing team are trying to support by being around at peak congestion times but that isn't always possible.

This is not just the rambling of the short, feisty Northerner in the Parish Office... This is actually "legal stuff" that you will find in the Highway Code – you may have read that, many moons ago, in order to pass your driving test...!

In particular see rule 243! You can find the Highway code at www.gov.uk

Here are the biggest issues reported:



On double yellow lines outside of the chemist – (or any other double yellow lines for that matter) unless you display a disabled permit. For the rest of you, everyone else thinks you are a lazy toe rag*. Everyone - they are all looking at you and thinking "you lazy toe rag". No-one cares if you are picking up verruca medicine or special fried rice, the double yellow lines are there for a reason, and these aren't it. PS... it doesn't matter if you are on the road side of the yellow lines or the pavement.... See below

On verges and pavements. Some people go out without cars. I know.....who knew? Walkers, with or without dogs, people in wheelchairs or with mobility scooters, people with small children, runners. So, in the absence of extra parking being provided it is down to all drivers to ensure they park as safely as they drive.

And yes, of course, this is written a bit tongue in cheek, and certainly not aimed at offending anyone but this is a real issue that is not going to go away unless people take responsibility for their role in it.

We'll be back next month with a more sensible update about projects and other parish goings on. SEPSIS AWARENESS: The UK Sepsis

Trust estimates that there are more than 120,000 cases of sepsis and around 37,000 sepsis deaths each year in England. A nationwide campaign was launched on 19th December, principally aimed at parents and carers of young children aged up to 4 years, which will help them to recognise the symptoms of sepsis to protect young children and save lives.

Leaflets are available at your GP surgery.

COMBATING LONELINESS: A recent

study featured in the British Medical Journal found that loneliness and isolation are associated with a 30% higher risk of having a stroke or developing heart disease. The health impact of loneliness is said to be the equivalent of smoking 15 cigarettes a day. More than three quarters of GP's nationally report that they see between one and five lonely people a day. A report by the Local Government Association, which represents more than 370 councils in England and Wales, warn that the impact of loneliness and isolation on health and social care mean that it must be recognised as a major public health issue. There are thought to be over one million people aged over 65 who are lonely- around 10-13% of older people. This is likely to increase as people live longer. If you know of a lonely person, please contact your local council to see if any help is available.

CHANGE4LIFE CAMPAIGN: Recent

newspaper headlines highlighted the fact that many children consume half the daily recommended sugar intake before school. Public Health England's new Change4Life campaign urges parents to take more control of their children's diets. A new free app has been developed to highlight just how much sugar, saturated fat and salt can be found in everyday food and drink that their children consume. It works by scanning the barcode of foods helping parents compare brands and features food detective activities for children and mini missions the whole family can enjoy. You can download the free Be Food Smart App from the iTunes Store or Google Play

Binfield Garden Club

On February 2nd Jim Buttress talked to us about his experiences as Superintendent of The Royal Parks and we were all certainly "royally" entertained!

Jim, who began as an apprentice gardener at 15 and worked his way up to the top job, said it had all been a pleasure and honour. He retired early due to the immense changes caused by privatisation and went on to cruise the world giving on-board talks, helped Tom Hart-Dyke make his famous World Garden, and now is a judge for RHS shows and appears on radio and tv programmes.

Jim gave us an interesting insight into all the precision planning and care that make our Royal Parks the best of any city in the world, totalling almost 5 thousand acres including 15 miles of river and 21 lakes and ponds in central London. 14 million plants are raised each year in the Parks' own nurseries under 11 acres of glass to ensure there is colour somewhere all year round. Plants are grown individually in pots bigger than themselves to avoid becoming potbound and are often sprayed with growth retardant to produce the wonderful uniform displays. In the Spring, 5 thousand extra tulips are grown as reserves, enabling any gaps due to damage to be replaced overnight.

London's highrise buildings help protect the parks from severe frosts and snow but today's cleaner air means more black spot and rust to deal with. Thousands of trees were lost to Dutch Elm disease and the fight is now on to save Horse Chestnuts, oak and beech from similar problems.

Jim showed us photos of many beautiful areas, herbaceous borders, the rose garden in Regents Park and the 40 acres of azaleas in Isabella Plantation, Richmond Park which certainly rival our Savill Gardens and entry is free!

Over the years, organisation and responsibility for these wonderful parks has changed and today with their Charitable status and trustees and no government funding, events must be staged to ensure income so the parks regularly come alive with concerts, sports activities and much more.

How thankful we must be that the Crown Land Acts 1851 had the vision to preserve these wonderful open spaces, open from dawn to dusk and welcoming 77.7 million visitors a year.

We certainly enjoyed Jim's talk which was also peppered with anecdotes, including one of him sitting with the Queen Mother admiring the flowers and sharing large glasses of her "little something!"

After tea-time, a thank you to Jim, any questions and the excellent raffle, the competition winners for a bowl of hyacinths were announced as 1st Christine Leonard, 2nd Belinda Thornhill, 3rd Liz Ferris and 4th Nancy Bowen. Congratulations.

March 2nd will be our AGM and The Committee would be delighted to recruit some new helpers, so if anyone feels they could join our friendly happy bunch, please put your name forward. There is only one Committee Meeting a month.

Following the AGM business there will be a talk by Sarah Hyde about Lilies. The competition is "A Vase of Spring Flowers".
