



# FROM YOUR RECTOR



# **Father Kolbe**

Several years ago, Tony Campolo had the opportunity to visit Auschwitz, that horrendous Nazi prison camp. He writes; to go to that place is a horrific experience. It's not what you see, but what

you feel that affects you. Something ugly lingers. Vicious hatred and sadness seem to be in the very air you breathe. Beyond all of that, there is a permeating sense of evil. Of all the things that struck me as I toured that demonic place, I was perhaps most moved by this one large room where there was a huge pile of children's shoes. I couldn't help but think of all the children who had once worn them, and how their lives had been destroyed by the diabolical anti-Semitism of the Nazis. But, there was one thing the tour guide showed me that lifted my spirits. It was the cell of a Roman Catholic priest, Father Maximilian Kolbe. He had done something magnificent with his life, even in that terrible place. He had been a blessing in a place that was cursed.

The Nazi captors had an ugly way of deterring prisoners from trying to escape. If ever someone did escape, all the remaining prisoners were lined up and six were chosen at random to be hung. Nevertheless, there were escapes. After one escape, the six men picked for death stood on the scaffold with ropes around their necks, when something incredible happened. Before the trapdoors could be opened and their bodies hung, Father Kolbe asked to be heard. He pled with the commandant to let him take the place of one of the men who were about to die. Pointing to one particular man Franciszek Gajowniczek, he said, "He's from my village. I know him. He's a good man and he has a wife and several children. On the other hand, I am a priest. I am not married and I have no children at all. I do not have a family that needs me. Let me be hung in his place!

The commandant acceded to this startling request and Father Kolbe took the place of the designated man on the gallows, and a few moments later was dead. This was love in action. And, as has been said over and over again, there is no greater love than the love that would cause one person to lay down his life for another.

When Tony visited the cell that had once held Father Kolbe, the tour guide pointed out a vase that contained fresh flowers. She explained that when the war was over the man who had been saved by Father Kolbe's sacrifice moved his family to the town of Auschwitz so that they could regularly come to the cell and place flowers there, to revere the man who had sacrificed so much for them.

Isn't that what happens at Easter? We remember a man who sacrificed his life, so that you and I could live, now, and in heaven. The Bible puts it like this, *This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters. 1 John 3 verse 16.* I guess the only questions that remains is will you? I don't mean will you literally lay down your life for others, although you might have to one day, I mean, will you lay down your ego, your choice, your desire, your wants, your always having the last word, or, stop putting others down and instead build them up?

Will you lay these down so that someone else can live? Will you follow Father Kolbe's example and in some small way, help someone else to live?

## Fundraising Update

### THANKS TO YOU ALL...Phase 1 is GO!

We have raised the money needed to cover the first repairs to All Saints' Church! We are amazed that it only took us a year to get here after the project was launched in March 2016.

A contractor has now been selected and the actual repair work is being scheduled to start in May, with an aim to complete by August time.

However, Phase 1 only identified the most critical work needed, and we really need to keep raising money so that necessary repair work can continue in other areas.

### So now it's on to fundraising for Phase 2..!!

To start us off, the Fundraising Team have sent out letters to local businesses registered in Binfield, Katie Dover has run her 10<sup>th</sup> out of 10 races and raised over £500 for the project (thank you Katie! You can still donate justgiving.com/ fundraising/Catherine-Dover) and we are really looking forward to hearing Dads R Loud play at the live music night on 29<sup>th</sup> April at St Mark's – make sure you get your tickets too.

We are also excited to host our water station/spectator area up at All Saints' for the Binfield 10k again on 21st May. We would love to have volunteers to help hand out water to thirsty runners and cheer them on!

### **New Administrator**



For many years there was a tenancy at will in place to allow the surgery to use the extra land as part of the surgery car park. Sadly, when Bracknell Forest Borough Council sold the land to Spitfire Bespoke Homes Ltd for development, they did not take into account the tenancy at will and sold all of the land.

Spitfire Bespoke Homes Ltd now requires the land to build homes and gardens on the site.

The surgery appreciate that it has always been difficult parking at the surgery and really need your patience as it is now going to get even worse. The surgery is still seeking opportunities for land and funding to enable a move to new premises.

Vice Chair, delivered the Chair's report on behalf of Richard who was unable attend due to a long standing prior commitment.

Richard thanked the Committee members for all their support and also other seen and unseen helpers who's help is invaluable in the running of the Club. Our President, Alan Foster, presented gifts to Dot Green and Rosemary Davies who were stepping down from the Committee. Sarah Baker has volunteered to join the Committee and joins the remaining members who were voted in again 'en bloc'.

Annual Awards (for points gained in competitions throughout the year) were then announced and presented by Alan Foster. Congratulation go to 1st Belinda Thornhill, 2<sup>nd</sup> Nancy Bowen, 3<sup>rd</sup> Christine Leonard, 4<sup>th</sup> Roy Cox and Liz Ferris and David Ireland for more than 5 entries.

Following the AGM proceedings, Rosemary introduced our speaker – Sarah Hyde from H W Hyde & Son, specialist growers of lilies and other bulbs and Chelsea Gold Medal winners. Based in Ruscombe, the company was founded in 1926 by her grandfather and Sarah works in the nursery alongside her siblings, Richard and Elizabeth.

Sarah passed round pictures of the many beautiful lilies available to order. Asiatic lilies, the biggest group, are generally unscented and come in a huge variety of colours from snow white to black. They should be planted 6 inches deep, in well drained alkaline soil and are quite hardy. Asiatics were developed as a cut flower, come from the smallest bulbs and produce multiple flowers. Generally the bigger and blowsier the flower, the bigger the bulb and fewer flowers.

Orientals, another large group produced as pot plants, have scented flowers and are now also available in a double form. The colour selection is limited to white, pinks and carmines. Oriental trumpet crosses produce the biggest and most scented flowers and can reach up to 8 feet tall.

To prolong the life of a potted lily bulb, the top surface of compost, down to bulb level, should be replaced on an annual basis.

This month's competition for "A Vase of Spring Flowers" was won by Roy Cox, 2<sup>nd</sup> Belinda Thornhill, joint 3<sup>rd</sup> Christine Leonard, Liz Ferris and Nancy Bowen.

Lastly the raffle was drawn and a reminder that the next meeting will be April 6th at 7.15pm, when our speaker will be Paul Barney from Edulis Nursery on "Unusual Edible Plants".
