



FROM YOUR RECTOR



Don't worry

Years ago, I was enthralled as I listened to a pastor who for several years had faithfully served the church. His executive responsibilities had taken him all over this country. As he concluded his message, he told of one of the most frightening, yet thought-provoking, experiences of his life.

He had been on a long flight from one place to another. The first warning of the approaching problems came when the sign on the airplane flashed on: Fasten your seat belts. Then, after a while, a calm voice said, "We shall not be serving the beverages at this time as we are expecting a little turbulence. Please be sure your seat belt is fastened."

As he looked around the aircraft, it became obvious that many of the passengers were becoming apprehensive. Later, the voice of the announcer said, "We are so sorry that we are unable to serve the meal at this time. The turbulence is still ahead of us."

Then the storm broke. The ominous cracks of thunder could be heard even above the roar of the engines. Lightening lit up the darkening skies, and within moments that great plane was like a cork tossed around on a celestial ocean. One moment the airplane was lifted on terrific currents of air; the next, it dropped as if it were about to crash.

The pastor confessed that he shared the discomfort and fear of those around him. He said, "As I looked around the plane, I could see that nearly all the passengers were upset and alarmed. Some were praying. The future seemed ominous and many were wondering if they would make it through the storm.

Then, I suddenly saw a little girl. Apparently the storm meant nothing to her. She had tucked her feet beneath her as she sat on her seat; she was reading a book and everything within her small world was calm and orderly. Sometimes she closed her eyes, then she would read again; then she would straighten her legs, but worry and fear were not in her world. When the plane was being buffeted by the terrible storm when it lurched this way and that, as it rose and fell with frightening severity, when all the adults were scared half to death, that marvelous child

was completely composed and unafraid." The minister could hardly believe his eyes.

It was not surprising therefore, that when the plane finally reached its destination and all the passengers were hurrying to disembark, our pastor lingered to speak to the girl whom he had watched for such a long time. Having commented about the storm and behavior of the plane, he asked why she had not been afraid. The child replied, "'Cause my Daddy's the pilot, and he's taking me home."

There are many kinds of storms that buffet us in life, Physical, Mental, Financial, Domestic, and...

Many other storms can easily and quickly darken our skies and throw our plane into apparently uncontrollable movement. In times like those, you can take heart from what the Bible says, *Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God which passes all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians chapter 4 verses 6-7.)*

We have all known such times, and let us be honest and confess, it is much easier to be at rest when our feet are on the ground than when we are being tossed about a darkened sky. But when that happens, remember, you can ask God for help because, He is the Pilot. He is in control and He is taking us home... so Don't Worry.

Fundraising Update: The work starts...

We have scaffolding! The first phase of repair work has now begun at All Saints' which is fantastic news, and it would not have been possible without the help of all our fantastic supporters.

We are continuing to raise money so that we can carry out as much of the repairs needed as possible. Our current Tag-a-Tile scheme is now running successfully. For £5, you have the chance to write your message on a tile which will form part of the new roof on the church, meaning your words become part of the building! There isn't much time left to do this before the tiles for this section of the roof will be going up, so if you would like to come down to the church in person to do this, keeping checking our website or Facebook for times you can come up. We are also grateful to the organisers of Party Bye the Pitch who have agreed that we can have a stall at their fantastic event on 8th July. We will have tiles available from 4 to 8pm (or until our tiles run out!).

Everyone has enjoyed coming and personally writing their message on their tile, but we wanted to make this available to people who have perhaps moved away or can't get to the church. There is now an option to buy tiles online at www.binfieldarcproject.org.uk/shop. Please tell your friends and family!

We are also looking to be involved in more summer events. This year we are again taking part in the Summer of Fun kids event run by Binfield Parish Council, by providing a BBQ and refreshments, this time at Farley Wood Community Centre on Wednesday, 26th July.

A team of lovely people are also running a Community Get Together on two August dates in the holiday (Weds 23rd and 30th), at St. Mark's Church, with refreshments and toys available for the younger kids. News from Binfield Patient Group

PRACTICE SURVEY: We carried out our annual survey of the Binfield Practice during the week commencing 5th June. Analysis of this survey will be reported in this column later this year. This survey is important as it helps us and the Surgery to shape future service within the Surgery.

CHILDHOOD VACCINATIONS: These days many grandparents, aunts and uncles and other relatives help by bringing children to the Surgery for their immunisations. Unfortunately, without written consent from one of the parents the Surgery is unable to go ahead and vaccinate. Please ensure that this confirmation is available as it saves much upset on the day.

PREGNANCY: Please be aware that should you be pregnant, your ante-natal care will be by the midwife team and you will not need to visit a GP unless there are any concerns. As soon as you find that you are pregnant, please telephone the Surgery and make an appointment with the midwife team for when you will be 8 weeks pregnant.

WHEN THE SURGERY IS CLOSED: If you require urgent medical assistance which cannot wait until the Surgery re-opens, then please telephone 111.

If the emergency is life threatening then please immediately telephone 999.

EXTENDED HOURS SERVICE: This service has improved access for local people and is run by a federation of all practices in Bracknell & Ascot, using local GP's and Practice Nurses. Please note that the GP you see may not be from the Binfield practice. However, your computerised medical records will be available to the GP at your appointment. These appointments are for PLANNED care and NOT urgent care. They are bookable appointments ONLY for patients who cannot see a GP at normal Binfield Surgery times. You should, as usual practice, book an appointment through the Binfield Surgery at their normal Monday -Friday opening times, telephone 01344 286264. The appointment times on offer are: 18.30hrs - 20.00hrs Monday to Friday and 08.00hrs to 14.00hrs on Saturdays. The service is being hosted at the Boundary House Surgery in Bracknell. These appointments are of 15 minute duration. There is plenty of parking and Boundary





Nineteenth Century Rectors of Binfield by John Harman

For the greater part of the 19th Century there were only four rectors of Binfield: the Reverends Cookson, Gabell, Randall, and Savory. Their service to the village covered just short of a hundred years - from 1804 to 1903. This account, in seven sections is an enlarged - though still rather scant - version of an appendix in "The Caswalls and Victorian Binfield", copies of which can be found in the local history sections of the Binfield and Bracknell local libraries.

The Reverend William Cookson, Rector of Binfield between 1804 and his death in 1820, was born in 1754 the second son of William, a mercer of Penrith. He entered St John's College, Cambridge as a student on March 6th 1772, gained his BA in 1776, an MA in 1779, a Bachelor of Divinity in 1786 and a Doctorate in 1801. He was a fellow of the College from 1776 to 1789 and became Rector of St Peter and St Mary in Forncett Norfolk from 1788 - the year of his marriage on October 17th to Dorothy Cowper - to 1804 when he was granted the living of Binfield. From 1808 to 1820 he was also Rector of West Ilsley and, busy churchman, a Canon of Windsor from 1792 to 1820, where he was at times responsible for the tuition of three of the royal children.

So, Cookson was at least acquainted with two leading romantics even though, one, Constable, was a committed conservative in all matters other than his art and, as is clear from encounters with Wordsworth, Cookson did not share the looser morality of the Romantic movement, and was almost certainly rooted in the traditions of the 18th century, with the possible exception of an acceptance of the slave trade, since he was a close friend of William Wilberforce.

But Cookson's academic achievement, alongside his appointment as tutor of the royal princes, clearly indicates a man of outstanding intellectual ability. Nevertheless, he may still have been dissatisfied. In his book, John Constable and the Fishers, Ronald Brymer Beckett reports that Cookson had been unsuccessful in his desire for further advancement even though, "Like the Bishop [John Fisher, of Salisbury, uncle of John rector of Osmington, but also a friend and patron of Constable] he was a canon of Windsor and like the bishop was in favour with George IIIrd having had no less than three royal dukes for his pupils. His only alleged weakness was his desire to become 'a dignitary of the Church': a bishopric or even a good deanery would have satisfied him." Beckett's source is a rather gossipy account, Farrington's Diaries, which goes on the

suggest that Bishop Fisher thought that Cookson would have found the expense of a bishop's life more than he could afford.

The Reverend Cookson nevertheless left a substantial estate, estimated at more than £20,000 "He was able to leave £5000 to each of his children." albeit after a serious illness since Beckett reports: "Another death in the same season was that of Fisher's father-in-law, Dr Cookson, who succumbed to a painful malady which made it necessary to give him a hundred drops of laudanum each day." On her husband's death, "Mrs Cookson and her unmarried daughter [Elizabeth] then went to live at the Archdeacon's [her son in law Dr Fisher's] house in Salisbury." But she did not long survive her husband. Fisher reports to Constable in a letter of 14th of April 1820, "Mrs Cookson is however in a very precarious way". She died very soon after.
