A foot has no nose

Of the many interactions I had with my mother those many years ago, one stands out with clarity.

I remember the occasion when mother sent me to the main road, about twenty yards away from the homestead, to invite a passing group of seasonal work-seekers home for a meal. She instructed me to take a container along and collect dry cow dung for making a fire. I was then to prepare the meal for the group of work-seekers.

The thought of making an open fire outside at midday, cooking in a large three-legged pot in that intense heat, was sufficient to upset even an angel. I did not manage to conceal my feelings from my mother and, after serving the group, she called me to the veranda where she usually sat to attend to her sewing and knitting.

Looking straight into my eyes, she said "Tsholofelo, why did you sulk when I requested you to prepare a meal for those poor destitute people?" Despite my attempt to deny her allegation, and using the heat of the fire and the sun as an excuse for my alleged behaviour, mother, giving me a firm look, said ""Lonao ga lo na nko" - "A foot has no nose". It means: you cannot detect what trouble may lie ahead of you.

Had I denied this group of people a meal, it may have happened that, in my travels some time in the future, I found myself at the mercy of those very individuals. As if that was not enough to shame me, mother continued: "Motho ke motho ka motho yo mongwe". The literal meaning: "A person is a person because of another person".

As we approach Lent, a time for giving things up, why not try giving up something different from chocolate this year? Why not give up selfishness. Jesus said, 'Do to others, what you would want them to do to you.' *Luke, chapter 6, verse 31.* Instead of thinking of the

inconvenience you might have to endure to help someone, try remembering that, a person is a person because of another person. This Lent, will you, like the lady in the story, treat people with the dignity that they deserve, whoever they are?



Influential Binfield Victorians by John Harman

This is one of a series of snapshots of families and people who settled in Binfield in the 19th Century. In each I outline their background and then look at what each did, said and wrote - an eclectic, subjective selection but one which can lead to insights on Victorian Binfield. Alfred Caswall and his family were early "incomers".

The Caswalls were a West Country family whose menfolk were usually involved in politics or the Church. Two of Alfred's direct 17th and 18th century ancestors had been M.Ps for Leominster, one of whom had spent a short time in the Tower while his potential involvement in the South Sea Bubble scandal was being considered. Alfred's grandfather was Rector of Swalcliffe, his father Rector of two parishes, Yateley and West Lavington. Many of the male Caswalls were educated at Winchester and Oxford. Alfred did not go to university because he was deaf, not completely and not from birth, but there is correspondence that as a young man he spent time in Prussia seeking to improve his hearing and that he was interested in exploring the effectiveness of hearing aids then available. So Alfred, born in May 1811, denied a career in politics or the Church, chose the Law. He was called to the bar in 1835 and practised corporate law for the rest of his life from his chambers in and around The Temple, publishing works on copyhold - its history and current practice, as well as serving as agent for several estates, including those held by the Bishop of Salisbury.

He married Mary Elizabeth Powell at St John's church in Hackney on June 27th 1843.

The new railways must have been a major factor in Alfred and Mary's choice, in the autumn of 1845, of Grove House in Binfield as the new home for their rapidly growing family. On Thursday 25th September 1845, the directors of the "DIRECT LONDON and EXETER RAILWAY COMPANY (with Extension to Falmouth and Penzance, through Hammersmith...Isleworth.... Bracknell ... Binfield ... Salisbury... to Exeter) took their company to market." The GWR Paddington to Twyford line had been running for five years. Binfield was a short coach drive from Yateley, and one railway line offered access to Salisbury as well as to his father's second parish of West Lavington, while the Paddington/Twyford line handily connected to near Grays Inn. Sadly, Alfred's father died less than a year after his son's purchase of Grove House and the projected station at Binfield never really materialised.

The inset shows, however, that Alfred and Mary had indeed purchased a "comfortable and commodious residence".

Once settled in Binfield, Alfred became a member of the Vestry Committee and, as with most of the better-off Binfield residents, regularly contributed to local funds and charities a practice maintained after his death in May 1855 by his wife. In addition, his professional expertise would have been particularly useful when, quite soon after the Caswall family had moved to Binfield, he became part of the committee responsible for overseeing the building of the north aisle of All Saints', a project initiated by the Reverend Randall.

And he contributed a stained-glass window to the church – a copy, his daughter Katharine believed, "of one in Magdalene Church, Oxford" - probably created at the Whitefriars Glass factory, which had been purchased in 1834 by Mary's father, James Powell and after James' death in 1840 directed by her brothers, Arthur and Nathaniel. Grove House was situated at the end of Monks Alley, on a large site next to Marchfield House. The Caswalls eventually changed the name to "The Elms". Mary Caswall, now a widow, purchased "Binfield Place". It remained in the family home until just after the death of Alfred's last surviving child - Katharine. John.harman@ntlworld.com

Parish Council building – Landscaping and car park markings

The works will cause some minor disruption and please respect closure notices and other signs so that we can get the work done as quickly as possible.

By the end of March, the final car park layout with markings will be complete, including two disabled parking bays and the drop-off bay. Please note the drop off bay cannot be used for parking between 8.00am-9.00am – drop off only – and at all other times there is a maximum of 30 minutes parking time.

We are also starting soft landscaping work, adding trees, shrubs and British native hedgerows around the building.

The Parish Council is responsible for the play area off York Road, adjacent to the Red Rose Allotments. We would welcome your input into a proposal to improve this area. The site is not being used to its full potential and, over the last few years, has started to fall into a state of disrepair, therefore the Parish Council will be closing the play area in the near future.

Please come along as we would welcome your input on considerations such as off-road parking for allotment holders to reduce congestion on Red Rose, a community garden for more people to enjoy gardening without needing to commit to a full allotment, improve the play area to increase its usage by local families.

Parish & Bracknell Forest Borough Councillors will also be available on 9 March during this time at their <u>Drop-in Councillor</u> Surgery to answer any general questions you may have.

Reception Staff

87% very satisfied/satisfied, which is similar to the 2016 and 2017 survey, with many positive comments about reception staff. As a reminder, if there are individual grievances, they need to be raised through the practice manager, so that appropriate action can be taken.

Nursing Staff

There is high awareness of the ability to see the practice nurses about vaccinations (81%), dressings (70%) and suture removal (53%). There is lower awareness of the ability to have an ECG (39%), family planning (42%) and long-term conditions (43%). There is some confusion over the ability to book ear-syringing or an ECG with a practice nurse without having a doctor's referral. There was a suggestion to provide a list of services available from the practice nurses, without requiring a GP consultation, the patient group will follow-up with this suggestion.

Doctors

The quality of healthcare provided by GPs and the attitude of the doctors were regarded two of the top-rated areas in the survey. There were isolated comments about the ability to see a female doctor and although this is not something that will change, the Patient Group can ensure information about seeing specialist nursing staff is as clear as possible, as this may be an appropriate choice for some.

On-line Access

Awareness of on-line access and ability to access medical records, order repeat prescriptions and make appointments is quite high (72%), yet further information could be made available to increase this number. The patient group will generate further information to this end. **Blood pressure machine in surgery premises**

There is very low usage of the machine being used in the surgery (21%) which could partly be due to its proximity to the right of the entrance and is out of sight. The patient group will improve this by appropriate signage.

Waiting Area

Some comments stated that the waiting area has improved since last year, which is encouraging, as this was an action following the 2017 survey which was put into place very quickly. There is still the ongoing issue of securing new premises, about which information will follow when relevant.

This amazing bird is a nightjar, whose folk-names include fern-owl, goat-sucker and dew-fall hawk. This scarce summer migrant hunts for moths, and other insects, at dawn and dusk and sleeps during the day hidden by its incredible camouflage.

The males attract mates and defend their territories by making a strange other-worldly churring sound.

They probably don't nest in Binfield, but on rare occasions might be seen or heard here. However, Binfield resident's actions could play an important role in the future of the local nightjar population. Their preferred habitat is open sandy heath, and they nest on the ground. This makes them susceptible to disturbance by people and dogs during their breeding season. Dog-walkers amongst you may have noticed the proliferation of new parks around the village, but have you found all of them?

I have counted seven, four of them in Binfield Parish (Larks Hill, Cabbage Hill, Popes Meadow, Blue Mountain, Peacock Meadow, Piglittle Meadow, and Stokes Farm), with at least one more subject to planning approval. These parks are all Suitable Alternative Natural Green-spaces (SANGs) and are being developed to compensate for new homes that are being built within five miles of the Thames Basin Heath Special Protection Area (SPA).

Thames Basin Heaths are the remnants of the sandy lowland heath that was common in this area but has been fragmented by development. Sandy lowland heath is the preferred habitat of the nightjar and a number of other special creatures. Development and especially new houses bring people and dogs and many of the special species that make

sandy heaths their home don't get on well with dogs, even well-behaved ones.

A well-built SANG will deliver benefits to more than dogowners. For example, the Blue Mountain park will have a path suitable for runners, a community orchard, five ponds, and several areas of wildflower meadows. Although Binfield is blighted by developments, one upside is the opening up of private land to all of us, so go and make the most of it!

You could also go and have a look at some of the sandy heath to the south, keeping your dog on a lead if the signs ask you to do that. I also recommend joining a summer evening nightjar walk to see and hear these incredible crepuscular birds. Local walks are offered by Bracknell Forest Council, BBOWT and the RSPB – more details can be found on their websites.

'Overlord' +75 --- and Our Thanks to Paul ---

Just before sunset on June 5th they will set sail on a voyage taking them back 75

years. Escorted by a warship of the Royal Navy, 300
Normandy veterans will be transported, aboard the specially-chartered MV Boudicca, back to the beaches where they landed on the morning of June 6th, 1944, in the largest and most well-known seaborne military invasion the world has ever seen. To commemorate the landings -- forever remembered as D-Day -- events were announced by Vice Chief of the Defence Staff General Sir Gordon Messenger when recently visiting the city from whence much of the Allied invasion fleet set sail 75 years ago. The Royal British Legion, Ministry of Defence and Portsmouth City Council together will hold a five day series of activities including a military parade along the seafront; performances by military bands; readings by VIP guests; and a flypast featuring period aircraft.

Portsmouth Revival Festival will also feature food, music, dancing and vehicles of the time; and the Navy's home port's activities will culminate in a Sunset Concert for Heroes, with acts including the Military Wives' Choir and the D-Day Darlings. Funded by the RBL and a LIBOR grant from HM Treasury, the ex-Servicemen's ship will accommodate them for the duration of their visit to Normandy. The Secretary of Defence has written an open letter to D-Day veterans, inviting them to contact the Legion if they should wish to take part in the trip which will conclude with an evening of music and entertainment beside the beaches in Arromanches.

From our nation's thanks to Allied troops for their part in that momentous WWII operation to enormous Binfield thanks from village RBL members to retiring Branch Secretary Paul Hammerstone, who has wielded the secretarial pen for 94-year-old Binfield RBL Branch with extraordinary efficiency and dedication since 2007. Failing eyesight has eventually caused Paul to call time on the wonderful service he has given; and further sincere appreciation must be conveyed to his popular wife, June, for having provided valuable help during recent difficult months.

A warm welcome is extended to Paul's successor, Denise Fuller, who has previously held the post. Very well-known villager Denise filled the role of Parish Clerk for almost 20 years from 1979 into the 90s. The Legion in Binfield remains in utterly capable hands and the first 2019 meeting of the branch is set for Wednesday March 13th in Binfield Club.


