## LETTER FROM YOUR RECTOR



# The two hospital patients

Two men, both seriously ill, occupied the same hospital room. One man was allowed to sit up in his bed for an hour each afternoon to help drain the fluid from his lungs. His bed was next

to the room's only window. The other man had to spend all his time flat on his back. The men talked for hours on end. They spoke of their wives and families, their homes, their jobs, their involvement in the military service, where they had been on holiday.

And every afternoon when the man in the bed by the window could sit up, he would pass the time by describing to his roommate all the things he could see outside the window. The man in the other bed began to live for those one-hour periods where his world would be broadened and enlivened by all the activity and colour of the world outside.

The window overlooked a park with a lovely lake. Ducks and swans played on the water while children sailed their model boats. Young lovers walked arm in arm amidst flowers of every colour of the rainbow. Grand old trees graced the landscape and a fine view of the city skyline could be seen in the distance.

As the man by the window described all this in exquisite detail, the man on the other side of the room would close his eyes and imagine the picturesque scene.

One warm afternoon the man by the window described a parade passing by. Although the other man couldn't hear the band - he could see it in his mind's eye as the gentleman by the window portrayed it with descriptive words. Days and weeks passed.

One morning, the day nurse arrived to bring water for their baths only to find the lifeless body of the man by the window, who had died peacefully in his sleep. She was saddened and called the hospital attendants to take the body away. As soon as it seemed appropriate, the other man asked if he could be moved next to the window. The nurse was happy to make the switch and, after making sure he was comfortable, she left him alone. Slowly, painfully, he propped himself up on one elbow to take his first look at the world outside. Finally, he would have the joy of seeing it for himself. He strained to slowly turn to look out the window beside the bed.

It faced a blank wall. The man asked the nurse what could have compelled his deceased roommate who had described such wonderful

things outside this window. The nurse responded that the man was blind and could not even see the wall. She said, "Perhaps he just wanted to encourage you."

The Bible says this, but you should meet together and encourage each other. Hebrews chapter 10 verse 25.

Imagine how you'd feel if every time you met someone they encouraged you? Why don't you become that person, like the man in the story, for your families, friends, neighbours, colleagues, and everyone you meet?

#### Sell on eBay

#### Donate and Fundraise through Facebook:



# Pastoral Care Visiting Team — need a friend?







We hope you've all had a happy Easter from the Northern Parishes NHPT!

As the warmer weather approaches (hopefully) we often see a rise in rogue traders targeting the area and it is important to know what to look out for, and especially to keep an eye out for the more vulnerable members of our community who are more likely to fall victim to these scams. These often involve cold calling at addresses and telling occupants that certain work, such as roofing or gardening, needs doing on their homes (most of the time this is completely untrue). They will use high pressure sales techniques, or even start the work without permission and then pressure the occupant into paying. Even if work does need doing the work will often be of poor quality and vastly overpriced. They will often only accept cash and have been known to physically drive vulnerable victims to the bank to obtain the money. Our advice is always to seek out reputable tradesmen through trusted recommendations or through legitimate websites such as Checkatrade, and never say yes to the cold callers – reputable businesses do not need to drum up business in this manner.

If cold callers leave literature/leaflets with you then these are of interest to West Berkshire Trading Standards (who cover Bracknell Forest) who investigate these rogue companies. If you feel that you, or a neighbour or relative may have been scammed then please report to Police and/or Trading Standards as soon as possible and keep a record of any paperwork or vehicles indexes etc. If you believe the crime is in progress then please call on 999.

Also, a quick reminder that our lovely volunteer Staria works from Binfield Parish Council offices on Monday and Friday mornings for any small Policing enquiries you may have, or as usual you can contact the team on BracknellNorthernParishesNHPT@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk

### Your Church in Binfield giving to Charities

Did you know, All Saints' and St Mark's Church Parochial Church Council (PCC) supports a number of charities each year through charitable donations?

At the start of each financial year, the PCC choose 3 charities to support: one local; one national; one overseas. At the end of our financial year, we donate up to 10% of the Voluntary Income we have received throughout the year. This is normally split equally between the 3 charities.

This year we are supporting: Bracknell Food Bank (local); Oasis Charitable Trust (national); Five Talents (overseas).

In the first of 3 articles, Rachael gives an overview on the work of the Oasis Charitable Trust.



Founded in 1985 by the Rev. Steve Chalke, Oasis is a Christian charity that has done amazing work across the UK for nearly three decades. The first Oasis project, a hostel for homeless young women in Peckham, London opened in 1990. The vision and work of Oasis is based on five core Christian values: Inclusion; Relationships; Equality; Hope; Perseverance.

Today, Oasis works through what it calls a "community hub" model, which involves a joined-up approach in the provision of a range of essential and integrated support services to 36 communities across the UK.

(The nearest hub to Binfield is in Waterloo).

Volunteers work side by side with professionals in providing these services. The range of support services provided by Oasis in the UK falls into seven practice areas: Education; Personal and spiritual development; Housing; Youth-work; Advice and support; Health (in partnership with healthcare providers); Community.

Oasis is also active outside the UK including: 'Stop the Traffik' (global coalition to end human trafficking) and have 15 community hubs in other countries. However, our support is focused on their initiatives in the UK.



### **Influential Binfield Victorians, 2** by John Harman

#### **Powell and Caswall Ancestors**

Alfred Caswall's ancestors were influential, affluent upper-class professionals, mainly politicians, bankers or churchmen, including Sir George Caswall M.P. a banker whose dealings with the South Sea Company caused him to spend some time in the Tower. Of the churchmen, John Caswall, Alfred's grandfather [1736-1808] was the first, serving for 40 years as rector of Swalcliffe. John's son, Alfred's father, Robert Clarke Caswall, [1769 – 1846], was Perpetual Curate of Yateley and Vicar of West Lavington, Wiltshire.

Alfred had two brothers, Henry [1810 – 1870] and Edward [1814 -1878], who were ordained - Henry in America, Edward in England. They each became prolific, influential authors on religious topics and neither escaped the notice of the press. But their themes were very different: Edward's devotional writings emphasised the spiritual – he published "Sermons on the Seen and Unseen", Henry favoured the administrative, as when he published a letter to Gladstone supporting the revival of Convocation; Henry was first ordained in the American church, and required an Act of Parliament before he could preach in England whereas after his conversion to Catholicism, Edward played a significant part in the development of the Oratory in Birmingham, composing "See amid the Winter Snow", still a very popular Christmas carol. Henry could be more confrontational, for example when in 1842 he visited the Mormons to beard Joseph Smith, their leader, in an attempt to show him, with the help of a Greek psalter, as a fraud. There are also examples of the earlier secular work of both.

As an undergraduate, Edward wrote some satiric pieces in "The Oxonian" and published two small but successful books, again satirical – "The Art of Pluck" i.e. of failing examinations, and, as Author Quiz, with Phiz as illustrator, "Sketches of Young Ladies". There is extant a letter [held at Kenyon] that Henry wrote on Sunday 5th October 1828 to his father, Robert Clarke Caswall. It shows that Henry was a competent artist. The week before he had visited Niagara Falls, and he sketched them for his father in the letter. Mary Elizabeth Powell, Alfred's wife's ancestors enjoyed successful experience in commerce, manufacturing, medicine and the arts, as well as the church where, it seems from obituaries, they served their parishes well.

Catherine Cotton, Mary Elizabeth's mother, was the granddaughter of Nathaniel Cotton, doctor [sometime counsellor and psychiatrist] and poet. James Powell, Mary's father, was an affluent wine merchant who at 60 had purchased for his three sons, the Whitefriars Glass factory, a small company then making mainly coloured and stained glass, which the sons and a grandson expanded through the 19th century. Mary's three brothers were "Hands-on" directors at Whitefriars, each contributing to the development of new manufacturing processes, not just for coloured glass – much in demand given the increase during the period of church building and extension. Their close involvement with William Morris and the Arts and Craft movement led to the production of decorative glass for the home and when in 1873, Harry James Powell, a grandson, joined the Whitefriars company his deep interest in chemistry led to the production of strengthened glass for industry.

He was awarded an MBE for this development work.

#### HAY FEVER.

For many people across the UK, the arrival of Spring is a mixed blessing. No sooner have you shaken off the winter gloom than you're hit with the onset of the hay fever season. Characterised by a streaming nose and itchy eyes, the condition can range in severity from annoying to debilitating.

In actuality, 'hay fever season' is a bit of a misnomer - it all depends what kind of pollen you're allergic to. According to the Met Office, tree pollen season classically runs from late March to mid May, grass pollen season from mid May to July, and weed pollen season from June until September.

Hay fever is also called allergic rhinitis or seasonal rhinitis. The majority of hay fever sufferers are affected by grass pollen.

Hay fever commonly affects the nasal passages and the eyes, and has symptoms not dissimilar to the common cold. But hay fever is more persistent and has an element of itchiness you may not get with a cold.

If you believe you have hay fever you should talk to your local PHARMACIST. The first line of defence is antihistamine pills. Some antihistamine pills can cause drowsiness, so ask your pharmacist for a NON DROWSY pill.

GP prescriptions are not normally issued for Hay Fever. They are sold as over the counter medications at your local pharmacy.

If you are allergic to pollen, it's important to have a shower or wash your face when you come in from outside, so as not to transfer pollen on to bedding. Other sensible measures include closing windows and doors and fitting a pollen filter in your car. It's also wise to avoid alcohol (as many drinks contain histamine) and cover up your eyes and hair - for instance, by wearing a hat and wraparound sunglasses.

## **Binfield Environment Group**



With spring in full swing, it is hard to pick a special species to write about, so I am going to give you a whistle-stop tour of some of the special species that make Binfield their home at this time of year.

In the village, we have stag beetles and wild service trees, overhead we can see swifts and buzzards. Within half a mile of the village centre is a river with kingfishers. Walking round the village you will hear skylarks and bullfinches. As I write this, the early butterflies are beginning to appear, but as spring turns to summer, we may see purple hairstreaks and silver-washed fritillaries in the village.

Lots of people care about the nature of Binfield Parish. The village has at least one badger sett, monitored by an active badger group. There are people in the village who care about butterflies, hedgehogs and trees. I know that my neighbours feed the birds, and many join in the RSPB's annual garden bird-watch.

I have written before about how new housing estates may benefit nature. If you walk around an estate like Peacock Farm, there seems to be more bird-life than there was when it was farm fields. In part this may be down to the high proportion of households feeding the birds, the protection of the copses, and the creation of wildflower meadows. There also seems to be a thriving colony of house martins, despite the absence of built-in nest-boxes.

As summer moves on, we will be able to visit a number of different wild-flower meadows, on what were farm fields, each of which will be a riot of colour with flowers, moths, butterflies and beetles.

The population of some species continues to decline around here. A local author, writing in the 1970s, talks about hearing nightingales and turtle doves in a local copse. The copse is still there, but you won't hear turtle doves and you'll be extremely lucky to hear a nightingale. However, you will hear red kites calling overhead and see little egrets on a nearby pond, neither of which were there in the 1970s.

If you are reading this, I hope that you share my love for Binfield's nature, and will take the opportunity as spring turns into summer to get out and enjoy it. Look out for opportunities to find out a bit more through some of walks and talks that a range of different organisations offer. I want to learn more about the local butterflies and bats. What about you?

## A New Branch and a Relentless Patrol by Terry Dilliway

News of healthy funds and plenty of plans for the year ahead greeted shipmates of Bracknell Royal Naval Association meeting at Binfield Club in April. History played a leading part in latest talks enjoyed by members. The History of the Household Cavalry was the subject chosen by guest speaker Peter Storer, curator of the Household Cavalry Museum; the Cavalry's Combermere Barracks in Windsor is the destination for a visit organised by Bracknell RNA Shipmate Secretary June Boddrell.

Binfield plays its tiny part in the history of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, which was the subject of a well-researched talk given to the April branch



meeting by Shipmate Denise Fuller. The CWGC manages and maintains 1.7 million graves worldwide, five of which sit in Stubbs Hill Cemetery.

Able Seaman Reginald Arthur Sumner's plot is kept tidy by the RNA branch, and the Royal Navy seaman, who crossed the bar in service in 1942, is remembered with poppies every Remembrance Season.

The newest branch of the Royal Naval Association is the Bikers' Branch (motorcycle enthusiasts) who are planning to obtain their own Standard. The new branch has received a grant from the General Secretary's Fund and welcomes any further assistance from established branches and shipmates. Following the recently reported atrocities at a New Zealand mosque, Royal Navy connections across the globe were remembered with a letter of condolence from RNA Central Office to RNA Christchurch, NZ.

A relentless patrol under the world's seas by the nuclear submarine service of the RN reaches an unbroken half-century this year, a commitment unequalled by any other mission of the Senior Service. Events across the UK will celebrate 50 years of dedication by submariners on the longest operation ever carried out by British armed forces. Services of thanksgiving and parades will take place in London and Edinburgh, including a May 3rd noon commemoration at Westminster Abbey, in recognition of Operation Relentless which, since 1969, has ensured a 24-hour non-stop deterrent reaching out from Clyde Naval Base. First Sea Lord Admiral Sir Philip Jones will be presenting new 'badges of honour' to Trident submarine veterans.
