OPEN DOOR




The Open Door team have, after much thought, prayer and heart searching, sadly decided to discontinue the monthly Open Door service.



As the nights are drawing in and Halloween is approaching it feels fitting to write about owls. We are fortunate in Binfield to have three species of owls making the parish their home: tawny owls; little owls; and barn owls (pictured).

Tawny owls are the commonest and are the ones that you are most likely to hear, mainly in autumn and winter. The males are more vocal and their calls are variations on "tu-hu-hu". The female responds with a shorter "twik". Hence, the "twit twoo" much loved by children's authors and film makers is actually a combination of the call of female and male birds. Tawny owl numbers are declining, possibly due to a loss of suitable nest sites. Occasionally, tawny owls can be found in Binfield's woods in daylight as their sleep is disturbed by small birds mobbing them.

Little owls are the smallest of our native owls and are the ones most likely to be seen in daylight sitting on tree stumps or fence posts. They were introduced to Britain in the late 1800s, as it was thought that they would enhance parkland estates. Their numbers have declined since the 1980s, reflecting the decline in their preferred prey, small mammals and large insects. I have yet to see one in Binfield but I am reliably informed that they do nest here, and I am fairly confident that I have heard

them. Their calls are a surprisingly loud "keeroo" noise sometimes accompanied by a "kip-kip-kip".

Barn owls are the species that tends to get the best press, and often feature in falconry displays like the bird in the picture above. Over the last 50 years their population has declined due to a loss of traditional nesting sites and declining numbers of small mammals. A campaign was launched to build nest boxes. This seems to have been successful as the UK barn owl population is now on the increase. Barn owl boxes can be found at Garth Meadow and Bracknell sewage works. This year seems to have been a good one for barn owls as it has been a good vole year and fairly dry. As I write this, some of the boxes around Binfield are being used for second broods. Barn owls are less vocal than the other two species but sometimes make a shrieking noise which can be disconcerting at night.





We would like to pass on our thanks to those at the Binfield Neighbourhood Action Group, the Parish Council and the local residents who give up their spare time to make this initiative work.

PC Lucia and PCSO Magda have been working on a number of problem solving issues relating to anti-social behaviour (ASB) in the area, particularly around the new SANG at Blue Mountain. Unfortunately we do always see an increase in ASB during the school holidays and we do work closely with the schools to try and educate the younger members of our community around how their behaviour impacts on others. We are very aware that these issues can arise again as we approach Halloween and we will be putting extra resources in place during this time.

Cass and the Northern Parishes Team



Bishop of Oxford's Berkshire Pilgrimage

Bishop Steven Croft, Bishop of Oxford undertook a pilgrimage around the deaneries of Berkshire during the first week of September. He visited 38 churches (including All Saints, Binfield) and the chaplaincy of Reading University, travelling by boat and bike as well as walking 50 miles. He left a blessing on every church, written in chalk, the letters C + M + B (Christus mansionem

benedicat) which translates as 'Christ bless this house'.

At every church on the pilgrimage he prayed for our government and parliament, for the communities and churches as well as for Olivia Graham—pictured right— as she prepares for her consecration as Bishop of Reading.

He took a picture of the font in every church (see his Facebook page) and prayed for the renewal of all the ministry which flows into and out of the font:

- * Our welcome to the youngest members of the community whose parents have just enough faith to bring them to baptism
- * Our nurture and care for children and young people in parishes and schools
- * Walking with adult enquirers as they come to faith as disciples of Jesus and come to baptism and confirmation
- *The ongoing formation of every Christian as we live out our baptism every day of our lives and seek to be a more Christ-like Church for the sake of God's world.

He was moved by the welcome and those who came to pray in every place. He met hundreds of people across the week and heard some wonderful stories of hope and grace in the life of the local churches as well as stories of difficulty. "It was very good to spend time in our churches: these beautiful places of prayer and stillness often hallowed by hundreds of years of prayer."

The journey transformed his view of Berkshire. Normally traveling by car often on motorways and major roads and to the large, urban centres, he was able to see the beauty of the county in new ways by boat, on foot and by cycling and to build a clearer picture of ordinary church life. BINFIELD PATIENT GROUP

Raising awareness of key public health messages

Encouraging appropriate use of relevant services, e.g. self-management courses and Talking Therapies Healthmakers Talking therapies

Improve communications by:

Building two-way relationships between patients and the practice

Monthly Patient Information, published in the Binfield Beacon (distributed to all houses in the Binfield area)

Information posters on community noticeboards/social media (if you are aware of a noticeboard without this health information, please contact the patient group)

Improving the practice leaflets and website

Influence the development of services by:

Advising on the development of new or existing practice premises

Representing patient views on the purchase of health services

Co-ordinating with other patient groups to improve wider healthcare delivery

Collaborating with the practice to provide new services

Representing local views on the services provided by the wider NHS organisations

To summarise all of the above we exist to make the relationship between patients and our practice stronger, which is critical to the provision of modern, high-quality general practice.

Established Patient Group Members

Karen was the original chair of the current patient group in 2010, has championed a plethora of health and well-being topics and as a result of this was the Lay Member for Patient and Public Engagement for Bracknell Forest & Ascot, taking her skills further afield than just Binfield. She now represents public and patient views as a Lay Member on several NHS England committees across Berkshire and the Thames Valley. She is the founder of HealthMakers which encourages patients to lead healthier lives.

Online Tributes to Personal Memories

When the Second World War was declared 80 years ago last month, the Royal British Legion was already 18 years old. The enormous responsibility for care and support of ex-Servicemen and their families was to increase beyond imagining following the Great War which had ended only 21 years earlier.

An average of 21,000 people, Armed Forces and civilian men, women and children on every side of the conflict died each day around the world between September 1st, 1939 and September 2nd, 1945, the date of the surrender of Imperial Japan. The daily cost of the RBL's programme of care for veterans of every theatre of conflict has today risen to more than £1.7m.

No reminder is needed of the approach of the UK's annual Remembrance Season which includes the Albert Hall service and the Remembrance Sunday ceremony and march past at London's Whitehall Cenotaph. Perhaps less well-known are the six Fields of Remembrance and many local Remembrance Gardens in towns and villages around the country which afford the opportunity for members of the public to create and plant Tributes containing their own personal messages to lost loved ones.

Volunteers annually plant more than 120,000 Tributes in fields across the UK, and modern technology allows these personal dedications to be ordered online and planted on a contributor's behalf.



The Fields of Remembrance in Belfast, Cardiff, Gateshead, Swindon, Westminster Abbey and the National Memorial Arboretum are officially opened in early November with special services

which include a Two Minute Silence at 11 am when a bugler plays the Last Post and the Exhortation is read. It should be noted that on Armistice Day, November 11th, every location can become crowded. The Legion maintains a special Remembrance Garden in the cemetery at Royal Wootton Bassett, the Wiltshire town which was granted Royal Title in October 2011, following residents' public tributes at military repatriation funeral processions at the time of war in Iraq and Afghanistan.

The 94-year-old Binfield Branch of the Royal British Legion meets four times a year at the Binfield Club and supporters of the largest and oldest ex-Service charity are invited to come along and join in.

News of highly regarded author Hugh Sebag-Montefiore's plans to write a definitive book on the WWII Arctic convoys to North Russian was received with great interest; Bracknell branch has been proud to assist with the author's early research, including personal reminiscences from 'White Beret' and Ushakov decorated S/M Ron Miller, who clearly recalls the horrors of RN and MN seamen from his days fighting the enemy and the ice from beneath a gun turret in HM Light Cruiser Diadem.


