LETTER FROM YOUR RECTOR



The Woodcutters wisdom.

This is probably my all time favourite story, and I thought I would use it this month incase people were worried about what is happening in politics, the state of the world, the environment, or just life in general. I hope you enjoy it as much as I do.

Once there was an old man who lived in a tiny village. Although poor, he was envied by all, for he owned a beautiful white horse. Even the king coveted his treasure. A horse like this had never been seen before - such was its splendor, its majesty, its strength. People offered fabulous prices for the steed, but the old man always refused. "This horse is not a horse to me," he would tell them. "It is a person. How could you sell a person? He is a friend, not a possession. How could you sell a friend?" The man was poor and the temptation was great. But he never sold the horse.

One morning he found that the horse was not in the stable. All the village came to see him. "You old fool," they scoffed, "we told you that someone would steal your horse. We warned you that you would be robbed. You are so poor. How could you ever hope to protect such a valuable animal? It would have been better to have sold him. You could have gotten whatever price you wanted. No amount would have been too high. Now the horse is gone, and you've been cursed with misfortune."

The old man responded, "Say only this, we shall see. Don't speak too quickly. Say only that the horse is not in the stable. That is all we know; don't worry. If I've been cursed or not, how can you know? How can you judge?" The people contested, "Don't make us out to be fools! We may not be philosophers, but great philosophy is not needed. The simple fact that your horse is gone is a curse."

The old man spoke again. "All I know is that the stable is empty, and the horse is gone. The rest I don't know. Whether it be a curse or a blessing, I can't say. All we can see is a fragment. Who can say what will come next? Say only this, we shall see." The people of the village laughed. They thought that the man was crazy. They had always thought he was a fool; if he wasn't, he would have sold the horse and lived off the money. But instead, he was a poor woodcutter, an old man still cutting firewood and dragging it out of the forest and selling it. He lived hand to mouth in the misery of poverty. Now he had proven that he was, indeed, a fool.

After fifteen days, the horse returned. He hadn't been stolen; he had run away into the forest. Not only had he returned, he had brought a dozen wild horses with him. Once again the village people gathered around the woodcutter and spoke. "Old man, you were right and we were wrong. What we thought was a curse was a blessing. Please forgive us."

The man responded, "Once again, you go too far. Say only this, we shall see. Say only that the horse is back. State only that a dozen horses returned with him, but don't worry.

How do you know if this is a blessing or not? You see only a fragment. Why do you worry so much when you don't know the whole story, how can you judge? You read only one page of a book. Can you judge the whole book? You read only one word of a phrase. Can you understand the entire phrase? "Life is so vast, yet you worry about all of life from one page or one word. All you have is a fragment! Don't say that this is a blessing. No one knows. I am content with what I know. I am not worried or anxious by what I don't. Say only this, we shall see"

"Maybe the old man is right," they said to one another. So they said little. But down deep, they knew he was wrong. They knew it was a blessing. Twelve wild horses had returned with one horse. With a little bit of work, the animals could be broken and trained and sold for much money. The old man had a son, an only son. The young man began to break the wild horses. After a few days, he fell from one of the horses and broke both legs. Once again the villagers gathered around the old man and shared their worries with him.

"You were right," they said. "You proved you were right. The dozen horses were not a blessing. They were a curse. Your only son has broken his legs, and now in your old age you have no one to help you. Now you are poorer than ever." The old man spoke again. "Say only this, we shall see. You people are obsessed all you do is worry. Don't go so far. Say only that my son broke his legs. Who knows if it is a blessing or a curse? No one knows. We only have a fragment. Life comes in fragments."

It so happened that a few weeks later the country engaged in war against a neighbouring country. All the young men of the village were required to join the army. Only the son of the old man was excluded, because he was injured. Once again the people gathered around the old man, crying and screaming because their sons had been taken. There was little chance that they would return. The enemy was strong, and the war would be a losing struggle. They would never see their sons again. "You were right, old man," they wept. "God knows you were right. This proves it. Yours son's accident was a blessing. His legs may be broken, but at least he is with you. Our sons are gone forever."

The woodcutter said, "Say only this, we shall see. It is impossible to talk with you. You always worry. No one knows. Say only this: Your sons had to go to war, and mine did not. No one knows if it is a blessing or a curse. No one is wise enough to know. Only God knows."

The old man was right. We only have a fragment. Life's mishaps and horrors are only a page out of a grand book. We must be slow about drawing conclusions. I don't know where the woodcutter learned his patience. Perhaps from another woodcutter in Galilee. For it was this Carpenter who said it best:

"Do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself." Matthew Chapter 6 verse 34³ He should know. He is the author of our story. And he has already written the final chapter.

The vestry roof in particular is still in need of re-tiling and reinforcing; the drainage still needs to be improved to make sure water is being taken away from the building and stonework, and we are hoping we can start looking to make some improvements inside of the building (such as installing running water for making tea and coffees!). 



Did you know that we have a newt reserve in Bracknell? Bracknell Forest Council maintains a set of former clay pits in Whitegrove. This site is another of Bracknell's hidden gems with benches and an impressively large sculpture of a newt. As Binfield and Warfield were famous for their brick-works it seems fitting that the clay-pits are providing a home to one of

our scarcest residents, the great crested newt. The great crested newt is another Bracknell Forest Council biodiversity action plan species. Although we have at least



are more likely to see smooth newts.

Newts breed and lay their eggs in still water. These eggs hatch into larvae which have gills and hence are able to breathe under water. When the larvae metamorphose into adults, they lose their gills and have to breathe air. Adult newts will travel some distance from the ponds where they were born, but will usually favour damp habitats such as log-piles and ditches.

Great crested newts are the largest native species growing up to 17cm in length. They have a distinct 'warty' skin. The underside is bright orange with irregular black blotches. In the spring, males grow a

jagged crest on their backs. Due to declining numbers over the last hundred years, the great crested newt is legally protected and it is an offence to kill, injure, capture or disturb them.

The smooth newt is the UK's most widespread newt species, and the most likely to be found in garden ponds. They can grow up to 10cm and are usually brown with a yellow or orange belly with small black spots, but no warts. Like great crested newts, male smooth newts grow a wavy crest along their backs in spring.

Bracknell Forest Council is encouraging community groups to build new ponds. In Binfield we might not need to do this as we have new, or improved, ponds in several of the new housing developments. With help from a friendly local ecologist we are hoping to survey some of these ponds next spring. We'd love to hear from you if you want to get involved.

Sensory Toy Library

At the time of writing, 62.5% of carers of disabled children we surveyed had a less than average total family income. A huge 87.5% believed their children would benefit from specialist sensory toys and the vast majority didn't feel their child's



sensory needs were completely met by current services.

I am fundraising to start a local sensory/special needs toy library where families with disabled children can borrow specialist toys to help improve their quality of life.

Having two disabled children myself, I know just how important these types of toys are, but they are incredibly expensive! Often, many families find themselves buying costly toys only to find their child doesn't really like them.

Any local family with a child with additional needs can borrow specialist toys for free at pop up events every second Saturday of the month at the Foxes' Den Café (9am-11am) and see if their child benefits from them. Sometimes, children with special needs can become completely overwhelmed with daily life challenges and it is great for them to have the chance to relax and play in their own homes with toys specially catered to their needs.



Binfield Garden Club

With Autumn well on its way it was a good time to have a very interesting and informative evening with Claire Brown on flowers and colour in the garden and in vases all year round. Claire has her own business; Plant Passion in East Clandon, Surrey, selling a year round variety of seasonal flowers to florists, DIY brides and local flower lovers.

Claire's top tip for our gardens is to take photos all year round so we can remember where we have patches of colour and where we need to add extra plants. She advised not to plant just one of anything if we want to make a splash and that we can never "over-do" it with bulbs. Yes, bulb foliage takes a while to die down but careful planting of perennials or annual seeds will come pushing through. Richard, our chairman, has frequently mentioned we should test our soil and Claire endorsed this as it's no good trying to grow plants on soil they dislike. Another tip was to empty our compost bins in the autumn and spread it all on the borders to settle in. We should also do some tidying up to get rid of diseases like black spot so they don't sit in the soil. Claire has her own battles with slugs and snails and said now is a good time to get rid of them before winter, and then another purge in February!

Foliage is very important for providing colour so include some evergreens and grasses and variegated. Pittosporum provides a lovely purple.

Claire told us to "live head" as well as "dead head". If we cut a flower in bud to enjoy in our vase inside, the plants will create new shoots within a couple of weeks to enjoy in the garden.

Some of Claire's suggestions were Cyclamen Coum for January, Hellebores for February, Daffodils for March, Choisya Aztec Pearl for April, Alliums for May, Geraniums for June, Daisies for July, Rudbeckia for August, Sedums for Sept, Asters for October, Hesperantha for Nov and Sarcococca for Dec.

So, thanks to Claire, we are now all inspired to fill Binfield gardens full of colour all year round and to cut and enjoy our flowers indoors as well!

During the evening we also heard the lovely ideas for our visits for 2020 and signed up for our Christmas lunch at St Anne's Manor. The winners of the competition - Vases of grasses and foliage were 1st Belinda Thornhill, 2nd Doug Ferris, 3rd Jenny Baxter and 4th Christine Leonard – well done. The many prizes of the raffle were distributed and we look forward to our meeting on Nov 7th with a talk by Jan Haseler on Gardening for Butterflies and Moths. 7.15pm at the Memorial Hall. Please remember visitors and guests are always welcome.



LIVE ON—To the Memory of the Fallen and the Future of the Living

"It's a Great Place to Be"

"We are a global Navy supporting a global Britain. We are not withdrawing from the world stage – quite the opposite."

So said First Sea Lord and Chief of the Naval Staff, Admiral Tony Radakin, when addressing the September Defence and Security Equipment International Conference in London.

The Admiral stressed how the Royal Navy is benefiting from its largest recapitalisation programme in 70 years. The two new futuristic aircraft carriers *HMS Queen Elizabeth* and *HMS Prince of Wales* will enter service soon, flying off the fifth-generation version of the F-35 joint strike fighter. And radical new systems are being employed on replacement nuclear submarines, two new types of frigate and new support ships.

"The upshot is the Royal Navy is growing for the first time in 70 years, and that's a great place to be," said Admiral Radakin.

Another great place to be is the successful Bracknell Branch of the Royal Naval Association. Meeting in October at the Binfield Club, shipmates heard from S/M Standard Bearer Anthony Boddrell that the Bracknell Standard joined approximately 50 RNA Standards from the UK and around the world in the Biennial Parade at London's Cenotaph. Shipmate Secretary June Boddrell marched in the parade, which was reviewed by the First Sea Lord.

Shipmate Secretary June announced that the regular yearend collections for branch funds were arranged for Warfield Tesco on Thursday and Friday December 5th and 6th, and Martins Heron Tesco on December 10th.

Branch funds were reported to be in a healthy state by S/M Treasurer Martin Powell.

A visit to the Army Air Museum had been enjoyed by 11 shipmates, and Maidenhead Sea Scouts sent a report of a 'transitional month' with events and training set to fill the remainder of the year.

With the planned guest speaker unable to attend, the October meeting concluded with a well-received talk by S/M Branch Chairman Mike Daley on his 'Naval Life and Experiences'. S/M Mike's 15-year Naval career began when, at 17-years-old, he entered the RN training establishment HMS Raleigh at Torpoint, Cornwall. Trained as a Navy cook, the S/M Chairman went on to meet Lord Louis Mountbatten aboard ocean survey vessel HMS Hecate, after serving in warships including the famous Commando carrier HMS Hermes.

Ex-Servicemen and women and supporters of the Senior Service would be welcomed to meetings of Bracknell RNA at 7.30pm on the first Wednesday of every month in Binfield Club.
