

Hey Everyone!







The Binfield Scarecrow Trail 2019 was truly 'epic' this year and set a whole new standard of quality scarecrow!

Testimony to the village spirit, Binfield welcomed hundreds of visitors each day to follow the map of 56 unique creations. From start to finish the trail was approximately 6.5km with many grateful parents praising the distance and sweets on offer in equal measure. The success of the trail is down to the efforts of each maker but this year the fundraising was given an extra boost by the Everett family. An incredible daily spread of cakes, biguits, sweets and squash complimented the world


Third Birthday Celebrations

I am going to take a break from telling you about the amazing creatures that make Binfield their home to tell you about the amazing people of Binfield and what they have done for those amazing creatures in 2019.

Binfield Environment Group exists to encourage the community of Binfield to take pride in their environment by involving groups, individuals and businesses in a variety of projects to enhance habitats for wildlife and to encourage conservation, recycling and the clearing of litter. During 2019, more than 30 people have contributed more than 500 hours of their time to our monthly work parties. In addition to this more than 30 more people have helped out with community litter-picks. We have engaged with groups from Newbold Church, Binfield Rainbows, and the local geocaching club.

In 2019, we: cleared holly in Farley Copse; removed brambles and pond plants in Popes Meadow; built bat and bird boxes; planted trees and flowers in Wicks Green; cleared round the specimen trees in Silver Jubilee Fields; and picked lots of litter. We have also started to survey Wicks Green, Blue Mountain and Foxley Fields to gather data on what creatures turn up in those sites and what impact our actions are having. In the Blue Mountain park alone, we have recorded 15 different species of butterflies and day-flying moths, and 52 different species of birds.

need to do the LiRF which is a one day practical course.

With our support, the parish council has just launched a sponsor a street campaign, where local residents will adopt a particular area and litter-pick it regularly. This will free up the parish warden to concentrate on some of the grottier parts of the parish. If you want to help, then please contact the parish council.

2020 will be Bracknell's Year of the Garden, and we will be doing various things to support the urban objectives set in Bracknell Forest Council's biodiversity action plan. This will range from working with schools and faith groups to encouraging hedgehog highways and installing a wide range of bird and bat boxes.

We couldn't do the things that we do without the support of Binfield Parish Council, Foxes' Den and many of you. One small example of this is the development of our logo (see above). Earlier in the year, children visiting Foxes' Den drew a number of possible logos, which then inspired a local graphic designer to produce a logo suitable for use in a number of forms.

We hope to see some of you for our final work-party of the year at Wicks Green on Saturday 21st December, starting at 10:00. There will be mince pies and mulled wine.

RunTogether groups are fun, friendly, inclusive organised group runs/jogs, led by qualified group leaders and all the leaders are trained and insured by England Athletics.

We are looking for people who are interested in volunteering or finding out more about being involved in the organisation and running of this exciting new venture. We are hoping to run it from the Victoria Arms so the social aspect of Binfield Runners will be an important part of the group.

To get the group started we need to have some more Run Leaders in place. To become a run leader you will need to either already have completed one of the following UK Athletics courses delivered by England Athletics: Leadership in Running Fitness (LiRF), Coach in Running Fitness (CiRF) or Qualified Athletics Coach (UKA Level 2 and above) or will

If you are interested in becoming a run leader and are not already qualified this isn't a problem as we have secured a small amount of sponsorship to cover the cost of qualification for 2 or 3 individuals.



Who are we?

You may have heard of us, or seen us hosting pop ups in the village, but who are Bracknell Less Plastic?

Bracknell Less Plastic (BLP) was born in Sept 2018 through the passion of two

ladies - Hannah and Sue - to address the now very high profile concerns around the proliferation of SINGLE USE Plastic. Hannah and Sue created a Facebook group called Bracknell Less Plastic, which now numbers 1000+ members.

In November 2018 Paul joined the group and introduced the Surfers Against Sewage (https://www.sas.org.uk/) framework for Plastic Free Communities which aligns perfectly with the aims of Bracknell Less Plastic. Today we have eight 'activists' within the core BLP team who use their personal networks to progress the aim of reducing/eliminating single use plastics from our lives.

Since tackling the whole of Bracknell Forest Borough is such a daunting task, we have opted to take a Parish by Parish, or Community by Community approach: Warfield, Winkfield, Binfield etc. We already have connections to, and are working with, other Communities in Windsor and Crowthorne who are also working within the SAS Framework.

In our first year we have concentrated our efforts in Binfield and the positive response has been phenomenal. We have a total of five Binfield business who have eliminated three or more items of single use plastic from their operations. We have a meeting with Binfield Council (November 13th) to establish a joint Steering Team and to secure formal support for our and other Community Groups efforts in this programme. We have held a number of successful refillable 'pop-up' refill stalls, kindly hosted at Foxes Den Café who have been extremely supportive of our efforts so far. An Eco Christmas Fayre took place on November 23rd, also at Foxes

With Binfield setting such a fantastic standard, we are extremely close to our community award, aiming to obtain

SAS Plastic Free Community Status for Binfield early in 2020. This is just the beginning of the longer journey towards Plastic Free Status for Bracknell Forest and we would love to tell you all about it. Please join us for an informative evening on Thursday 16th January, 7.30pm at Foxes Den. We will be sharing our ongoing plans, explaining our efforts so far and bringing our pop up stall. Everyone is welcome.





Binfield Garden Club

Our November speaker was Jan Haseler from the Bucks, Berks and Oxon Wildlife Trust who gave us a very informative talk on gardening for butterflies and moths,

accompanied by some beautiful photos of the many different varieties we might expect to see in our gardens throughout the year.

There are around 60 species of butterfly and over 2,500 species of moths in the UK. Having hibernated through the winter, the first butterflies start to appear around March and



the lifecycle begins. There are 4 stages in the metamorphosis of butterflies and moths – (1) eggs are laid on plants by the female; (2) caterpillar (the feeding machine); (3) pupa and (4) adult. Throughout the Spring and Summer months many more species appear and some, such as the Peacock butterfly, Red Admiral and Painted Lady, can be seen well into late Autumn. Spring flowers are vital for butterflies coming out of hibernation and Autumn flowers help butterflies build up their reserves for winter. Buddleia, verbena bonariensis, lavender and perennial wallflowers are all a great source of nectar for the butterfly but Jan's top tip plant for attracting butterflies to the garden is marjoram.

Moths are particularly attracted to plants with an evening fragrance such as night scented stocks, lilies and evening primrose. Although mainly night fliers, some will fly during the day. They come in a wide variety of structure and colours and some are masters of disguise.

If anyone is interested in finding out more, Jan suggested the following websites - www.butterfly-conservation.org and www.upperthames-butterflies.org.uk as being a great source of information.

when unfortunately we see a national rise in

burglaries due to the dark evenings. It is important to think about home security at this time. We tend to see burglaries committed early evening when houses are unoccupied. You can take some simple steps to make sure your property is protected as best as possible – these include ensuring lights are on inside with curtains and blinds closed, leaving TV's and radios on and also shouting 'goodbye' as you go out to make it appear that your house is occupied. Quite often entry is gained from the rear, so ensure that access to the rear can be prevented (locks on gates, not leaving bins next to fences/ gates to be used to climb) and not having anything heavy and moveable in the garden that could be used to smash a window/patio door. It is definitely worth thinking about investing in

a door bell camera (there are lots available in different price ranges). These can alert you to movement outside your property and the video quality is very good when it comes to gathering evidence should the worst happen. And finally, look out for each other as a community - if you see something/ someone suspicious then call it in -

a suspected crime in progress can be reported on 999.




Christmas Concert Handel's Messiah

The Parish Remembers Again

The national champion of Remembrance prepares for another year of care and support for Commonwealth families of the

fallen and survivors of more than a century of conflict.

As always, Binfield Royal British Legion branch played its part in the traditional Season of Remembrance when exservicemen, parents and children gathered at the village War Memorial to commemorate the 101st anniversary of Great War Armistice Day.

A parade of Service Standards and Scout Movement flags opened the

proceedings, before Rector Rev Luke Taylor and RBL Chair Ms Karen Hatt thanked the substantial number of parishioners for their attendance.

As autumn sunshine filtered through the trees surrounding the Memorial at St Mark's, rapt silence greeted perfectly rehearsed readings by young members of Scouts, Guides and Brownies whose contribution earned appreciative applause.

Remembrance Sunday's Parade was piped though the village to another successful service led by Rev Luke in a packed All Saints' Church. The Rector's theme was forgiveness, and hymns and prayers resonated among stunning displays of seasonal poppy decorations. Ian Freeman, deputy head teacher of Meadow Vale School, read a modernised Lord's

Prayer addressing today's lifestyle of borrowing and debt.

Children from Meadow Vale and 3rd Binfield Brownies were dressed in Allied Forces uniforms as they read reminiscences of World War I and II soldiers, including a precis of the Service life of Binfield's centenarian 'Desert Rat' Len Burritt, and the entire content of General Dwight David Eisenhower's



order to the 'Soldiers, Sailors and Airmen of the Allied Expeditionary Force' who were waiting to embark on the 'Operation Overlord' invasion of the Normandy beaches.

A captivating performance by 3rd Brownies and the choir of Meadow Vale School singing 'Remember Them', a memorial hymn written by Ms Karen Hatt, drew an enthusiastic reaction from the congregation. The Meadow Vale children have become affiliated members of the village branch of the Royal British Legion.

The traditional laying of wreaths and casting of poppies beneath the Parish Roll of Honour was followed by The Exhortation, The Last Post, two minutes silence and the Kohima Epitaph.
