

"Also, keep in mind that you will be able to correct any mistakes you might make along the way.


"And the most important part of you is what's on the inside.

The Following is an Analysis of the September 2019 Patient Survey

Executive Summary

This year's patient survey was carried out between 9th and 13th September. There were 483 respondents (~4% of the surgery's registered patients), approximately the same as 2018, with 30% choosing to take part using the on-line option (up 9% on the previous year).

Three quarters of the respondents were evenly distributed across the three age groups between 31-75 years (31-45, 46-60, 61-75), 11% of respondents being over 75 years of age, with 3.5% of these over 85 years (not separately reported in previous surveys). This is broadly representative of the demographics of Binfield surgery's population.

Areas that were identified for improvements from the given options were appointment access, 30%, appointment punctuality (waiting times poor), 23% and the surgery premises and facilities, 18%.

Even though appointment access is the area most noted for potential improvement, many comments are made about how good the system is to be seen on the same day, but that follow-up appointment booking seems to need improvement.

The waiting times are constantly being monitored by the surgery, and patients are regularly made aware when clinicians are running late. Lateness cannot always be avoided and therefore the surgery gives the patients the choice to rebook if preferred.

The surgery premises and facilities are a known issue. The practice has been trying to move, and will look to update the current premises if any move is unsuccessful, and if funding becomes available.

Booking appointments

Almost all patients (93%) are aware of the ability to book an appointment on the same day and to book over the phone and this is highly valued by both patients and within the practice. There were some comments about difficulties in booking follow-up or pre-booking longer-term appointments as well as requests to see a female doctor, which the practice have been made aware of.

Around 40% of patients now know how to access the extended hours service, which has improved, but this could still be better known, so the patient group will continue to support additional communication on the subject to help people's understanding of the choices that are available.

There are a small number of follow-up appointments available to book in advance, yet once these are gone, the on-the-day call is necessary. As we value the ability to be able to see a doctor on the day for emergencies, the patient group feel we

would like to keep this system, as it is the preferred option most of the time. The on the day appointments before 10am are of course not just for emergencies.

There are two systems for seeing a Healthcare professional outside the usual hours:

Practice Extended Access with a pre-booked telephone appointment:

Monday 6.30 -7.30PM (1 doctor) Thursday 6.30 - 7.30PM (2 doctors and 2 nurses)

Extended Hours Service at Boundary House Surgery, every evening and Saturday and Sunday morning with a doctor, nurse or Health Care Assistant from the local area, but not necessarily Binfield.

These options are clear on the web-site under PRACTICE – Opening Hours or APPOINTMENTS

Reception Staff

90% of people rated the reception staff as friendly and helpful which has now been maintained for the last four years with many positive comments including notable individual comments. As a reminder, if there are individual grievances, they need to be raised through the practice manager, so that appropriate action can be taken.

Mental Well-being

The question about mental well-being was asked for the first time in this survey and 90% of patients reported that the healthcare professional in the surgery recognised and/or understood their mental health needs.

However, one of the possible options for positive mental well-being are the activities provided by social prescribing and this level of awareness is very low (only 14% of patients knew about the scheme). The patient group will be doing much more to provide information on the various activities that are available. The practice is participating in the local network DES which will also be providing a social prescriber to the practice.

Blood pressure (BP) machine in surgery premises

There is still relatively low usage of the machine being used in the surgery (21%) which could partly be due to its proximity to the right of the entrance as it is out of sight. The patient group improved this with better signage after last year's survey. However, this does not seem to have changed the outcome usage. It may be that many people have BP machines at home or partly it is an appropriate uptake for the requirements of patients. This will be investigated with the practice in terms of expectations, then further questions asked next year, if appropriate.





We continue to see an increase in keyless car thefts across Bracknell Forest. This is where offenders use scanning equipment from outside the home to hijack the signal between the car and the key which allows them to gain entry and start the car (in models with a stop/start button rather than a traditional key). The cars targeted tend to be high value vehicles (which are then shipped abroad) or high powered vehicles (to be used in other crime). We do also see thefts from cars where the same technology is used to unlock the car in order to steal from within. This can be done with the stop start fobs as well as keys. The best way to prevent these types of crime is to block the signal by placing keys/fobs inside a Faraday pouch (very inexpensive to buy) or failing that wrapping them in tin foil or placing in a metal box. Keys should also always be kept away from view of doors/windows so that they can't be stolen through the letterbox.

In more positive news we have a couple of new team members in the Northern Parishes team. PCSO Olivia Harrison and PCSO Chloe Keeping started with us last week, and although they do not have direct responsibility for Binfield you will no doubt see them on patrol in the area at some point with Magda.

We have also recently had our first conviction at court for speeding following from the implementation of the new Speed Watch equipment that was funded by Binfield Parish Council (jointly with Warfield and Winkfield). This was very much a test case for the team and was a great relief that the court accepted the evidence obtained through this new technology and the hard work of the community volunteers. Bracknell Forest Council are promoting 2020 as The Year of the Garden, and they are keen to encourage us to do more for nature within gardens, including green space associated with schools and places of worship.

During 2020 we will use these Beacon articles to give you ideas about how to encourage wildlife into your gardens. We will highlight national campaigns, point you towards helpful websites, and provide timely tips. In return, we would love to hear about what is in your garden.

The third week of February is National Nest Box Week. This campaign has been run since 1997 to encourage us all to put up nest boxes in our local area. There are lots of websites that show you how to make your own nest box (e.g. https://www.rspb.org.uk/birds-and-wildlife/advice/how-you-can-help-birds/nestboxes/). If you don't fancy building your own, you can buy boxes from the RSPB or from garden centres. The RSPB also provides helpful advice on where to put your box (follow the links on the website above).

If you already have nest boxes in your garden, the British Trust for Ornithology are asking people to monitor their nest boxes regularly (https://www.bto.org/our-science/projects/nbc). There are already more than 50 bird and bat boxes around Binfield in public places and in new housing developments. By the time you read this, BEG will have put up more than 10 new boxes. Many of these have been sponsored by Binfield residents.

Different types of boxes attract different types of birds. The most common boxes in Binfield, with a single small hole, attract blue tits, great tits, and other small birds. We also have open fronted boxes for robins, and larger boxes with



holes for starlings and greater spotted woodpeckers. In Binfield there are also a few communal nest boxes for house sparrows and specialist boxes for tree-creepers, kestrels, tawny owls and barn owls.

We are currently investigating whether there is a suitable location for swift nest boxes. There are two colonies of these summer migrants in Priestwood and they are often seen flying and feeding over Binfield but as far as we know they don't currently nest in Binfield.

If you have nest boxes, then please let us know what is using them and consider putting out food and water to make it easier for the adult birds to support their young.

Dixit Dominus 1.1 Saturday 7:30 pm, 4th April at St Mark's Church

Psalms and Schubert will be sung by Thames Voyces as they make the first of two visits to St Marks Binfield this season on Saturday 4th April at 7:30pm

The concert includes Handel's *Dixit Dominus*, Telemann's *Laudate Jehovam*, Monteverdi's *Beatus Vir* and Schubert's *Mass in G*. The choir will be conducted by Nick Austin and will be accompanied by organist Ben Giddens, and the Keats Ensemble who specialise in early music.

All three psalms were written in the baroque style, Dixit Dominus was written at the beginning of the eighteenth century, when Handel was in his early twenties and living in Italy. It was likely to have been first performed at the Church of Sante Maria in Montesanto, whilst he was working under the patronage of the Colonna family.

Schubert's *Mass in G* was written just over a century after *Dixit Dominus* in 1815. It is the second mass he wrote, and the writing focusses on the devotional mood of a religious composition rather than the romantic style of his contemporaries.

Super Funds, Supercarriers, Super Ambulance

News of extraordinarily successful fundraising, and an enthralling guest speaker, launched Bracknell Royal Naval Association branch into

2020 at their January meeting.

Shipmate Nigel Carpenter in the chair welcomed members to the first meeting of the year. Branch President S/M Shelagh Pile was especially welcomed. Best wishes were extended to shipmates unable to attend due to illness.

Standard Bearer S/M Anthony Boddrell reported that the branch standard was paraded at the funeral of S/M Eric Angell, ex-Fleet Air Arm (including two Arctic convoys), where a rank of young family members walked ahead of the cortege and stood with the standard throughout the service at Easthampstead.

Maidenhead Sea Cadets sent a report of a successful conclusion to 2019; S/Ms Branch Secretary June Boddrell and Standard Bearer Anthony attended as guests at the Cadets' presentation ceremony where S/M Anthony presented the Unit's awards.

Included in S/M Secretary June's report was a planned visit to RNA Central Office Semaphore Tower on Friday, August 7th, and an announcement that *HMS Prince of Wales*, second of the Royal Navy's new 65,000 tonne supercarriers, has arrived for the first time in Portsmouth and been commissioned. *Prince of Wales* is due to join operations with her sister *HMS Queen Elizabeth*, flying off 36 F35B fighter jets and four

helicopters, dramatically enhancing RN capability worldwide.

Branch Treasurer S/M Martin Powell informed the meeting that record sums had been donated by generous Tesco shoppers during the annual December collections; shipmates will decide in February what charities and future activities may benefit from the healthy branch funds.

Previously an officer with St John Ambulance, guest speaker and fire safety consultant Graham Forster held the attention of the meeting with stories and statistics from the work of the Thames Valley Air Ambulance Service. Funded by private and corporate donations, the helicopter emergency medical services of the late 1990s has grown to become the recognised Air Ambulance with nationwide stations answering on average 35,000 emergency calls annually.

The Thames Valley service, with its training facility at RAF Benson, flies an H135 helicopter supported by four critical response vehicles equipped with state-of-the art medical capability and expert doctors and staff who can attend an emergency mission within eleven minutes of a prioritised 999 call. An average of seven missions per day are attended by Thames Valley Air Ambulance. *Terry Dilliway*
