LETTER FROM YOUR RECTOR



A Very Special Bank Account

Imagine there is a bank which credits your account each morning with £86,400, carries over no balance from day to day, allows you to keep no cash balance, and every evening cancels whatever part of the amount

you had failed to use during the day.

What would you do? Draw out every pound, of course! Well, everyone has such a bank. Its name is Time. Every morning, it credits you with 86,400 seconds. Every night it writes off, as lost, whatever of this you have failed to invest to good purpose. It carries over no balance. It allows no overdraft. Each day it opens a new account for you. Each night it burns the records of the day. If you fail to use the day's deposits, the loss is yours.

There is no going back. There is no drawing against the "tomorrow". Therefore, there is never not enough time or too much time. Time management is decided by us alone and nobody else. It is never the case of us not having enough time to do things, but the case of whether we want to do it.



Binfield Runners is a new, relaxed and fun running group, without being overly structured or competitive. We are based in Binfield and will be offering a variety of runs over different distances and terrains. We welcome anyone interested in running, from complete beginners to experienced runners and anyone in between (over the age of 18).

Our aim is to support both physical and mental health and well-being through running together.

Each run will be led by an England Athletics (LiRF) accredited run leader, who will guide you around the chosen routes and the runs will be categorised as follows:

Get Me Started – These sessions are for beginner runners/ joggers or if you've not run for a while and want a gentle introduction. There is no minimum standard or level of experience. It's fine to walk a bit, jog a bit, walk a bit more. As the name suggests it's about helping you to get started.

Keep Me Going – These runs are for you if you generally run at least twice per month and feel comfortable running/ jogging around 5km without stopping.

Challenge Me – These run sessions are for those who typically run at least once every week and are looking to increase their pace and/or running distance.

We are launching on April 1st initially with 2 weekly runs:

Moving Up To 10k - starting Wed 1st April Every Wednesday 6pm meet at Foxes Den

This is a **Keep Me Going/Challenge Me** group with the aim of helping runners currently comfortable with running 5k to move up to 10k, perhaps with a view to running the Binfield 10k in May

Couch to 5k - starting Tue 7th April Every Tuesday 9am meet at Foxes Den

This is a **Get Me Started** group with the aim of helping anyone who would like to eventually be able to run 5k non stop

Year of the Garden

2020 has been nominated as Year of the Garden by Bracknell Forest Council. They are encouraging Bracknell residents and community groups to garden in a way that is good for nature.

In recent months, Binfield Environment Group have been planting wild-flowers and native trees in Wicks Green and, with the help of FoBS, in the grounds of Binfield Primary School. There will be some planting of native spring flowering plants on the boundary of Foxley Field in memory of a former village resident. With the help of Binfield Parish Council, we will also be repeating our popular guerrilla planting event and providing residents with bulbs to plant in particular areas around the village.

The Year of the Garden initiative is also intended to encourage us to take action for the three priority species in Bracknell Forest Council's Biodiversity Action Plan: swifts, hedgehogs, and cowslips.

As far as we know, swifts don't currently nest in Binfield but they do nest in Priestwood, so we will be surveying the known colonies to determine where in Binfield we can site swift nest boxes to encourage these incredible summer visitors to nest here.

Hedgehogs should be emerging from hibernation by now. Bracknell Horticulture Association are hosting a website linked to the Year of the Garden that gives you more information on what you can do to help hedgehogs. One of the best things you can do is cut holes in your fence to create hedgehog

highways. Have a look at the website to see what else you can do - http://www.digforbracknell.org.uk/helpahog.html.

By the time you read this cowslips should be in bloom. This pretty yellow flower was once common in hay meadows, woods and hedgerows.

As the picture shows, each stem holds a number of down-

facing flowers, which distinguishes it from the earlier flowering upward-facing primrose. The cowslip's name is supposed to derive from cow-slop or cowpat because it was often found in the meadows into which cattle were moved in spring. As meadows, woods and hedges succumb to development, or even our penchant for "tidying" so cowslip numbers have declined. Unfortunately, this appears to have happened along



Harvest Ride where the north verge, which used to host a spectacular number of cowslips, has been turned into a manicured lawn fronting the new development. We can do our bit for cowslips by asking landowners not to cut the areas where they are known to grow until later in the year, when they have flowered and set seed. You can also plant your own in your garden or grass using plug plants.

Bracknell Forest Council will be announcing various ways that we can all improve our own gardens, and community gardens, for nature. The Year of the Garden will be launched at the Jocks Lane Spring Day on April 5th.

Binfield Garden Club

A cold, very wet day in March ended with a warm, friendly evening in the Memorial Hall when the Garden Club welcomed a return visit from Troy Scott Smith.

Troy, one of Britain's best-known Head gardeners is now in charge of a 7 year renovation at the award-winning and internationally renowned, Grade 1 registered Iford Manor



Gardens and he gave us a wonderful insight into the history of Iford and the life of Harold Peto. The Tudor/Georgian house nestles in the valley of the River Frome. The garden belonged to the Arts and Crafts designer Harold Peto, from 1899 to 1933, and due to his love of Italy it includes a cloister garden of Pompeian scale and many terraces with his vast collection of statues, urns, sarcophagi and terracotta placed amongst magnificent plants and trees. The photos looked so lovely that we would love a club trip there but as it is reached by very narrow roads and the garden contains many steep, narrow and uneven paths, as well as long flights of steps without handrails, maybe not by coach!

Our new chairman, Ralph, thanked Troy for his excellent talk and we were able to buy from the healthy selection of plants Troy had brought.

SOCIAL PRESCRIBING:

Social Prescribing - sometimes known as Community Referral - is a means of enabling nurses and other health and care professionals to refer people to a range of local, non-clinical services.

Social Prescribing can meet many different types of non-clinical need, ranging from support and advice for individuals experiencing debt, unemployment, housing or mobility issues, or tackling loneliness by building social connections through joining local community groups.

For an appointment with the Binfield Surgery Social Prescriber, patients can ask at reception or ask a GP or nurse. Please be aware that this is NOT an appropriate service for under 18's or anyone actively under the Community Mental Health Team.

Binfield Surgery patients can also self refer.

If your health need is urgent please telephone Binfield surgery Monday to Friday before 10.00am. (01344 286264). You will generally be offered an appointment that day. After 10.00am you may be triaged by a GP telephone call.

The Bracknell Urgent Care Centre is open 7 days a week, 365 days a year from 8.00am to 8.00pm for minor injuries and 6.30-8.00pm for minor illnesses. Telephone 01344 551100. Firstly, please telephone 111 to find out if this is the most appropriate service for your needs.

Call 999 for life-threatening conditions.

Blood tests are ONLY carried out at Binfield surgery for the frail and/or elderly patients, and those patients whose medicines mean that they are monitored in Primary Care (shared care agreements), Warfarin monitoring (international normalised ratio (INR). All other patients, after referral for a blood test by their GP, should visit the extended hours service at Boundary house (pre bookable in advance through Binfield surgery) or Heatherwood or Wexham Park Hospital where 'walk-in clinics' are held.
