

## The Magical Mustard Seed

There is an old Chinese tale about a woman whose only son died. In her grief, she went to the holy man and asked, "What prayers, what magical incantations do you have to bring my son back to life?"

Instead of sending her away or

reasoning with her, he said to her, "Fetch me a mustard seed from a home that has never known sorrow. We will use it to drive the sorrow out of your life." The woman went off at once in search of that magical mustard seed.

She came first to a splendid mansion, knocked at the door, and said, "I am looking for a home that has never known sorrow. Is this such a place? It is very important to me."

We hope your 2020 is off to a great start, and with spring just around the corner there's lots of fun going on in Binfield.



#### Richard and Stewart's 1000 miles running challenge



Thames Valley Air Ambulance is a charity, whose sole purpose is to provide rapid and flexible medical attention to people in need of critical care. On an average day, seven people are in urgent need of their services. Within minutes, they bring the expertise, equipment and treatment of the hospital to the most critically ill and injured patients across Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire. On the afternoon of the 16th June, it well and truly met its objective, by saving Binfield man and our good friend Matt Jones.

The charity receives no funding from central government, and only manages to provide this invaluable resource through donations, so we wanted to set ourselves a challenge and raise much needed money for this lifesaving service.

Our goal is to run a combined total of 1000 miles from January 1st through to Saturday 30th May ending at the Stockholm Marathon. Look out for us running around the village over the next few months and if you would like to make a donation to this fantastic charity please visit our justgiving page:

#### Matt's story

Sunday 16th of June 2019, started like many other Sunday mornings for Matt & his wife Sarah, it involved a cycle with friends.

Whilst out cycling, Matt got in trouble and was struck by a car at 11:11am. A 999 call was made at 11:12am, the 999 dispatcher Ben Watts, aided by Dispatch Assistant Megan Fowler made the decision to send the Thames Valley Air Ambulance HeliMed24. HeliMed24 lifted from RAF Benson at 11:16. The aircraft landed with Matt at 11:29, where critical care was provided by HEMS team, Dr Stewart McMorran & Critical Care Paramedic Katy Schofield. Matt was put into an induced Coma by the team. HeliMed24 lifted from Pangbourne at 12:49, and 8 minutes later arrived at the John Radcliffe Trauma Unit.

Matt was in the Neuro ITU unit from Sunday 16th ventilated and sedated in a critical state until Sunday 30th June 2019, when he spoke his first clear words "Hello Love" to Sarah. Matt has thankfully been released from hospital and is doing well back at home amongst family and friends, facing a long recovery road ahead with his customary grace and positivity. If it was not for the swift actions of the Thames Valley Air Ambulance and the dedicated resources of the John Radcliffe, Matt would not be alive today.

You can help in any of the following ways. Please contact us if you are prepared to get involved with one or more of these, or if you think that there is something else that we should add to the list:

 You can sponsor a street and litter-pick it regularly. This scheme is being administered by Binfield Parish Council.

 Bracknell Less Plastic are looking for someone to run the monthly pop-up shop in Foxes Den, so that their core team can start to set-up similar pop-up shops in other parts of Bracknell Forest. (See their Facebook group for more information on who they are and what they are doing).

- There are now more than 50 bird and bat boxes around the parish, and we are looking for people to check that the boxes are still in place and whether they need maintenance. This would only need to be done once or twice a year and we could divide the parish up so that one person is not trying to visit all of them. If anyone is particularly keen we could also visit bird boxes in spring to see if any birds are using them and/or use bat detectors in the summer to see which bat boxes are in use.
- You could come and join one of our monthly work parties, or even help run one (<a href="https://binfieldeg.wixsite.com/binfieldeg/upcoming">https://binfieldeg.wixsite.com/binfieldeg/upcoming</a> or visit out Facebook group). Our next work party is on Saturday 21st March at Wicks Green.
- You could conduct regular surveys of Wicks Green, Blue Mountain or another green-space of your choosing.
   Ideally this should be done once a month, taking about an hour of your time. You can choose whether you want to survey birds, butterflies, bees, plants, dragonflies or other insects.
- This summer we will be surveying the swifts in Priestwood to try and work out where the best place to put swift nest boxes might be.

Don't forget that 2020 is Bracknell Forest's Year of the Garden and Bracknell Forest Council will soon be announcing various ways that we can all improve our own gardens, and community gardens, for nature. It is likely that this will be launched at the Jocks Lane Spring Day on April 5<sup>th</sup>.



#### The most often complained about issues in Binfield? Litter, dog foul, and inconsiderate parking

Please can we ask that you pick up your own litter and, if not by a bin, dispose of your litter when you next reach one or take home. Same for dog mess please! Please also note that dogs must be kept on a lead in Foxley Field. Also, we politely request considerate driving and parking, particularly avoiding parking on pavements that pedestrians need to use.

#### Thefts from vehicles – be vigilant!

The Neighbourhood Policing Team have advised that thefts from vehicles have been reported to them in the Bracknell area, including Binfield and Warfield. Windows have been smashed and some visible items have been taken. In some cases, people have forgotten to lock their car doors.

Most offences of theft from vehicles are opportunist. If valuable possessions (e.g. handbags, laptops, sat navs, iPods, mobile phones, cameras) are left on show inside a vehicle, it is much more likely to be targeted by thieves. Even items of little value, such as shopping bags and clothing, may tempt a potential thief to break into the vehicle to see whether they contain anything worth stealing and drivers are asked to stay vigilant.

#### **Follow-up Appointments:**

The surgery has looked at the system for follow-up appointments on many occasions and if they were to offer this type of appointment they would no longer be able to offer the book on the day system they currently run. In all past patient surveys, it is evident that this system is the preferred option by most patients. If a GP at the surgery wants you to be seen in a follow - up appointment, they will notify reception to book you one. If a doctor at the hospital, or at the out of hours service, want you to be followed up at the practice, a surgery GP will decide whether you need to be seen, when you need to be seen, or if a telephone consultation will serve. The surgery offers a limited number of book in advance appointments for the same reasons.

#### Screening:

The surgery would like to thank patients who attend for their screening appointments when invited, and try to persuade those not attending to consider the importance of the programmes. The surgery has been telephoning patients to explain the reasons for screening and to give patients an opportunity to ask questions. The screening figures have increased over recent months:

Cervical screening:76.1% as at June 2018. 77% by March 2019.

Bowel screening: 61.3% aged between 60 and 69 as at June, 2018. Increased to 66% by March 2019.

Flu vaccinations: Well done to the over 65's. 77% of you have had your flu vaccination. The national target is 75%.

Flu vaccinations for the under 65's with long term conditions. Only 49% of this group have been vaccinated. The national target is 75%. If you are in this group and still have not had your flu vaccination, it is not too late. Please come to the surgery reception in the morning or afternoon (Monday - Friday) when a clinician will vaccinate you.

#### **Care Quality Commission:**

Binfield surgery was inspected by the Care Quality Commission on 08 January 2020.

The surgery was rated as GOOD.

#### **Dispensary Services:**

From January this year the surgery resumed offering dispensary services to patients who live more than one mile from a pharmacy.

#### **Patient Access:**

This service is available to Binfield surgery patients. You can book appointments and order repeat prescriptions, with many other items available. If you do not already use this service please contact the surgery on 01344 286264 for further details.

I have had a (tiny) bit of experience applying for personal grants but that is nothing compared to the scale of what's needed for a start up not-for-profit.

Unfortunately, while the voluntary input of time, skills and experience we have received has been absolutely astounding, what we need right now is money. Although we have no staff costs (we're all volunteers), to put our costs into perspective, a single toy can cost in the region of £400 and beyond, an essential repair could be into the £100s, and a set of deliveries to our most vulnerable families is around £10 per evening.

#### **Becoming Maths Masters**

With the changes to the national curriculum, staff and pupils have been developing their Maths knowledge and skills. The approach taken is to develop a mastery approach using concrete apparatus, visual images and then abstract representation

It's a very different style of learning Maths which builds deep understanding and requires children to explain their reasoning and prove their answers to be correct.

Last month we had 12 teachers visiting us to see how well we are developing our Mastery Maths teaching in KS2. Class 4RN hosted all of the teachers for a lesson on Area. The children were really challenged in their thinking and were a real credit to the school in their Maths learning, attitude and behaviour.

The visiting teachers then worked with our staff to develop their own learning.

Well done to Class 4RN, Mrs Norman, Mr Sutton and Miss Ridnell.



All junior children are becoming experts at recalling their times tables and they are using TT Rockstars (a computer program) to help them. They are able to challenge each other and even compete with their teachers.



Saturday 7:30 pm, 4th April
at St Mark's Church

Psalms and Schubert will be sung by Thames Voyces as they make the first of two visits to St Marks Binfield this season on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> April at 7:30pm

The concert includes Handel's *Dixit Dominus*, Telemann's *Laudate Jehovam*, Monteverdi's *Beatus Vir* and Schubert's *Mass in G*. The choir will be conducted by Nick Austin and will be accompanied by organist Ben Giddens, and the Keats Ensemble who specialise in early music.

All three psalms were written in the baroque style, Dixit Dominus was written at the beginning of the eighteenth century, when Handel was in his early twenties and living in Italy. It was likely to have been first performed at the Church of Sante Maria in Montesanto, whilst he was working under the patronage of the Colonna family.

Schubert's Mass in G was written just over a century after Dixit Dominus in 1815. It is the second mass he wrote, and the writing focusses on the devotional mood of a religious composition rather than the romantic style of his contemporaries.

## Huge Anniversaries and Stories in Ink

Powerful images of identity, comradeship, bravery and sacrifice are often depicted in tattoos worn by ex-Servicemen and members of the Armed Forces.

The Royal British Legion and the National Memorial Arboretum this year combine with renowned photographer Charlie Clift to feature tattoos and their stories in an exhibition touring the country.

TributeInk opened its doors at the National Army Museum, adjacent to the Royal Hospital Chelsea, on January 31<sup>st</sup> and runs until April 17<sup>th</sup>.

This year the UK and Commonwealth will commemorate the 75th anniversaries of the ceasing of military conflict in May and August 1945 in both Europe and the Pacific, which signalled the end of the Second World War. In all its theatres around the globe, the bloodiest conflict in human history split nations into two opposing military alliances.

Overseas campaign tours planned by the RBL in partnership with the Commonwealth War Graves Commission and the Royal Commonwealth Ex-Services League will provide the opportunity for descendants and veterans of unimaginably intense conflict in Burma (now Myanmar) and the Asia and Pacific regions. Applications for these worldwide visits, with travel and accommodation funded by the RBL, are now being invited.

At home, the Legion will play a major role in commemorative events nationwide. Young families are encouraged to attend locally organised services and parties to share remembrance with veterans of Armed Service and add the thanks of today's generation to the reminiscences of those who served. Future issues of the *Beacon* will include full details of Binfield Parish Council's Victory in Europe Day 75 planned for Wicks Green on Friday May 8<sup>th</sup> and Binfield Club's 1940s party on Saturday May 9<sup>th</sup>.

Meanwhile, some decisions taken by the RBL Trustees can prove controversial. In January, a new policy was adopted which means the closure of the Legion's four break centres and the end of the Handy Van service. The break centres provided affordable short-term respite for ex-Service personnel and families and angry response has been received from some members; the estimated £5.8m saving achieved by these changes will be redirected to fund other services, according to a statement.

British Legion Annual Conference 2020 will take place at Southport Theatre and Convention Centre on May 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. And the next meeting of Binfield Branch RBL is set for 7.30pm on Wednesday March 18<sup>th</sup> at Binfield Club.
