

LETTER FROM YOUR RECTOR



God's Intervention

This was written by a Doctor for a Hospice of Metro in Denver USA.

I just had one of the most amazing experiences of my life, and wanted to share it with my family and dearest friends:

I was driving home from a meeting this evening about 5,

stuck in traffic on Colorado Blvd., and the car started to choke and splutter and die - I barely managed to coast, cursing, into a gas station, glad only that I would not be blocking traffic and would have a somewhat warm spot to wait for the tow truck. It wouldn't even turn over. Before I could make the call, I saw a woman walking out of the "quickie mart" building, and it looked like she slipped on some ice and fell into a Gas pump, so I got out to see if she was okay.

When I got there, it looked more like she had been overcome by sobs than that she had fallen; she was a young woman who looked really haggard with dark circles under her eyes. She dropped something as I helped her up, and I picked it up to give it to her. It was a nickel.

At that moment, everything came into focus for me: the crying woman, the ancient Suburban crammed full of stuff with 3 kids in the back (1 in a car seat), and the gas pump reading \$4.95.

I asked her if she was okay and if she needed help, and she just kept saying "I don't want my kids to see me crying," so we stood on the other side of the pump from her car. She said she was driving to California and that things were very hard for her right now. So I asked, "And you were praying?" That made her back away from me a little, but I assured her I was not a crazy person and said, "He heard you, and He sent me."

I took out my card and swiped it through the card reader on the pump so she could fill up her car completely, and while it was fueling, walked to the next door McDonald's and bought 2 big bags of food, some gift certificates for more, and a big cup of coffee. She gave the food to the kids in the car, who attacked it like wolves, and we stood by the pump eating fries and talking a little.

It was so incredible to be a part of someone else's miracle.

And of course, you guessed it, when I got in my car it started right away and got me home with no problem. I'll put it in the shop tomorrow to check, but I suspect the mechanic won't find anything wrong.


We are determined that Party Bye The Pitch will return next year in all its glory. Please keep safe and healthy.

News from the Parish Office – JUNE 2020

A Parks & Open Spaces Update (correct as at 21 May 2020)

Firstly, thanks to all of you who have complied with the current government guidelines thus far. As a community, Binfield always pulls together and offers help and support to those that need it the most.

At the time of writing this update, the government advice is that people can go out more than once for their daily exercise. This means you may sit and enjoy one of the open spaces around the village. The tennis courts and the multi-use games area, both located at Foxley Fields, are also now open (from Wednesday 13 May). However, the play equipment is still closed. This is in line with current government guidance and is for your own family's safety as well as others. We understand that this may be frustrating but the health and well-being of everyone is paramount. Any changes to this position will be posted on the parish Facebook page and website: www.binfieldparishcouncil.gov.uk

Please also be reminded that fly-tipping is against the law. This also includes the tipping of garden waste. We appreciate that whilst the refuse centre was closed, this made things difficult but please keep hold of any waste items until it is possible to dispose of them safely and in the correct manner.

Thanks to the majority of dog walkers who keep to the rules within the open spaces. Dogs must be kept on a lead on Foxley Fields and Silver Jubilee but can be off their lead at Wicks Green. Please ensure that you clean up after your dog, which means disposing of dog waste bags in the litter bins too. Please do not leave any dog waste bags hanging in trees as this is not a pleasant sight particularly where a bin or a pocket can be used.

Finally, just a quick reminder that our 'Sponsor a Street' initiative is still ongoing. Thank you to all the volunteers who litter pick a street/area of their choice as part of their daily exercise. With the increased amount of footfall around our streets and open spaces, it has never been more important to keep the village clean and tidy. Enjoy the wonderful open spaces in Binfield, help us to keep them clean and tidy, please adhere to the social distancing guidelines, and stay safe.

Over the last few months many of you have been enjoying the sights and sounds of spring across Binfield including nesting birds and their fledglings. I have seen pictures and videos from across the parish of robins, blue tits, great tits and starlings rearing their first broods of the year. Some of these birds are using the nest boxes that people have put up in their gardens or that have been put up in public places. In addition to the species mentioned above, I have had reports of boxes in public places being used by squirrels, tree-creepers and jackdaws.

Please feel free to go out and see if you can find some of these boxes. As long as you

don't disturb anything that might be using them there is nothing to stop you watching from a safe distance and we would love to know what you see. Some of my favourite places around the village to watch bird boxes are Piglittle Copse (Amen Corner North), Farley Copse and Silver Jubilee Field (Wicks Green). There are also boxes in the new developments at Amen Corner North, Morshead Drive and Parkham Mead. Some species of birds will go on nesting up until August, so there's plenty of time to see who is using these boxes. This is also why it is recommended that we don't cut our hedges until September at the earliest.



There are also bat boxes around the parish. If you can't see a bird sized hole

in the front of the box then it is most likely that you are looking at a bat box. As it is illegal to disturb roosting bats, we can only work out if a box is being used by watching it at dusk or by using a bat detector to see if there are any bat calls coming from within the box. My two favourite places for spotting bats are Murrell Hill Lane and Wicks Green. The bats flitting around these lanes at treetop height are almost always common or soprano pipistrelles. There are plenty of bat boxes in or close to both lanes.

Other things to do this June include getting involved in Bracknell Forest Council's Year of the Garden campaign, involving the whole family in 30 Days Wild, and improving your butterfly identification skills ahead of the 2020 Big Butterfly Count.

BFC have provided a great set of resources related to hedgehogs, swifts and bumblebees at http://www.digforbracknell.org.uk/yog.html along with information about the Year of the Garden scheme.

The wildlife trusts are running their annual 30 Days Wild campaign to encourage us all to do something different each day in June to experience and enjoy nature - https://www.bbowt.org.uk/30-days-wild.

Butterfly Conservation will be encouraging us to count butterflies in July and August, so now is the perfect time to get to know the species that make Binfield home - https://www.bigbutterflycount.org/. I will write more about butterflies next time.

I've included a crossword puzzle this month which you can print off and have a go at, I'd love to see how many of you manage to complete it so let me know when you finish it!


We'll hopefully see you very soon, but until then I hope you have a creative and fun time in lockdown doing lots of things you may never have had the chance to do!


As you can no doubt imagine this has been a challenging time for Policing as a whole. We have had to rapidly adapt our working practices in order to maintain resilience and resource levels across TVP, along with minimising the risk of spreading the virus amongst colleagues and members of the public. Ours is a job that is not particularly suited to social distancing and so hopefully you will join me in thanking the team, and all of the officers and staff at Bracknell and Wokingham, for putting themselves at risk on a daily basis. It goes without saying that we are extremely proud of, and grateful for, the work of all key workers and in particular our NHS heroes.

The processes for us have changed many times and despite this uncertainty the team have maintained their commitment to serve their communities with great enthusiasm and motivation. For some time myself and the PC's were seconded to the core response teams but our amazing PCSO's remained on the Neighbourhood Team and picked up the bulk of our usual work. Of course some things have had to wait for us to return and our work is, as always, prioritised around risk and harm. The officers and I are now back on the department but remain on differing shift patterns, so we are not quite yet 'business as usual'. The team will still play a vital role in ensuring that legislation and government guidelines in relation to social distancing are adhered to. Richard and Stewart's 1000 miles running challenge - update

AIR AMBULANCE As we approach the end of May, two Binfield residents, Richard Haines and Stewart Peters are closing in to the end of a 22 week running challenge that has seen them try to run 1000 miles for





The aim was to finish the challenge at the Stockholm Marathon, but like every other major public event, the marathon has fallen foul to the Covid-19 epidemic and has been moved back to September. At the time of writing the pair are through 850 miles and closing in on the 1000 miles.



The challenge has not been without it's own challenges. The early year storms imposed challenging training conditions and weren't conducive with the thought of putting on running shoes and heading outside, but this was nothing compared to the restrictions imposed by the Covid-19 crisis. Instead of being able to run together, the challenge became a solo one as no social interaction with other households became the mantra. Identifying more local routes to run so as not to stray too far from home and ensuring all due appropriate social distancing etiquette was strictly observed whilst out running whenever approaching or passing other people.

Despite all these challenges, the central focus of supporting TVAA remained ever strong, fundamentally because of the care they provided their good friend and Binfield resident Matt Jones. Without TVAA Matt would not be here today.

Thames Valley Air Ambulance are an amazing charity, who only last week responded to a Road Traffic Accident in the centre of

Binfield, touching down in Newbold College. This is a charity that relies solely on public donations to operate their life saving services. Particularly now as TVAA has put out an emergency appeal predicting a £1m hole in its finances due to the Corona virus. The majority of lost revenue will be the result of cancelled community and business fundraising events. At a time when we are struggling to come to terms with all that is going on in the world at this time, dealing with the new challenges that come with being locked in your home, not being able to see friends and family or just popping to the shops for some retail therapy or doing your weekly activities, I found myself thinking what can I do to make a difference. I'd cleaned out every kitchen drawer, twice, painted the garden shed, cleaned the grout in the shower and was now looking for an excuse to avoid all those other mundane jobs on that never ending list!



Watching the news I saw the appeal for scrubs, sewing has always been a hobby I love, but I never find the time to do, my grandmother was a seamstress and along with my textiles teacher at school, taught me all I know, but over the last 30 years I've only used this skill to make blinds and curtains (for personal use I must add).

So I set myself a challenge to make a set of scrubs and enlisted a few close friends who didn't all know each other, but whom I know shared my passion.

On the 14th April, I contacted Garth who were working in partnership with Frimley Park Hospital and three days later I collected 6 patterns and delivered to the other ladies. We are all amateur sewists and were all excited, but nervous of taking on this challenge. I created a group chat to use, so we could support each other and keep each other motivated, we were now the "Amateur Scrubbers"!!!

On the 17th April, We dug our sewing machines out from the back of our cupboards, watched a tutorial and were all itching to get stitching! There were tears and tantrums, followed by smiles and hi fives (on zoom of course, due to social distancing) We all achieved our first set! Yay!

We had got our mojos back and there was nothing stopping us. I hosted a zoom call on Sunday evening and we toasted our efforts and got to meet each other! By the end of the first week we had produced 25 sets of scrubs and wash bags. It was an emotional day delivering them to Garth, it was like handing over your first child's, first ever babygro! We had put our heart and soul into producing the scrubs and now knew they were going off to be worn by these amazing people in the NHS working in the toughest conditions, putting their own lives then In turn their families lives at risk to care for those affected by this awful virus.







Word was getting out about what we were doing, I had put out appeals for fabric donations on local Facebook sites and worked with Sian Gilbert from the People help, the people Facebook page to request donations and created an Amazon wish list for the resources we were running out of to produce the scrubs. Within an hour we had raised £250 and our wish list was empty. I was overwhelmed by the response from our local community. By midday my home had turned into Widow Twanky's laundry! Messages of support for what we were flooding in, I had a local Mum turn up on my doorstep with a sewing machine, bouquets of flowers for all the ladies and a massive collection of cakes and cookies to share among us - I stood on my doorstep and wept!

The group started to expand, ladies like myself, wanting to avoid home Schooling and zoom calls with great Aunty Enid, were contacting me to offer help, and support. I am proud to say I now have an army of lovely ladies across Berkshire working with me to produce the scrubs and other needed resources. It was time we introduced ourselves to the community and let them see the amazing creations we were sending to the hospitals. it was at this stage I figured we couldn't publicly be identified as "Amateur scrubbers" and although the quality of our work meant we were now "professional scrubbers" we felt we would

attract the wrong audience to join our Facebook page - this was when Rainbow scrubs was born! The name reflected the bright colours we are using to create our scrubs, but also depicts the symbol we all now recognise that symbolises the NHS. Each day we wait with anticipation to see what we've each managed to create from an unwanted bed set and this team of ladies never cease to amaze me - the thought that goes into making these scrubs is unbelievable as you can see in the pictures.

I am also working with local business Estrellas Boutique who is selling these adorable t-shirts with all profits going to the NHS. Lauren has kindly donated T-shirts to the children at Alder Hey children's hospital And is now in touch with a local hospice to do the same.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone that has been involved and helped in some way to make Rainbow Scrubs so successful. Special thanks go to Mr Grainger, Mr Mandeville, Mr Crouch, Mrs Jarvis, Mr Turnham, at Garth College and my original scrubbers Hannah, Carley, Sian, Kerry, Sandra and Mandy! And a massive thank you to everyone in the community that has given us fabric, donated money and bought items from our wish list as well as all the messages of support and encouragement! I am proud to be part of this project.

Binfield Garden Club

June is almost here. Sadly we can have no meetings or outings for the foreseeable future but with the weather being kind we can, not only enjoy our own gardens but also other people's as we walk round the village.

This month, of course, is the time of beautiful roses. So.... "Take time to smell the roses!"

Roses have been celebrated for centuries for their beauty, fragrance and what they represent. Each colour offers a meaning: red, the lover's rose; white humility and innocence; yellow friendship and joy; pink gratitude and admiration; orange enthusiasm; while lilac and purple roses are said to represent enchantment and love at first sight. Most of us just love them all and the question has been asked whether nice people grow



roses or growing roses makes people nice?

Here are six simple must-haves and you'll be on your way to growing the perfect rose.

- 1. Site. Roses crave sun, at least 6 hours a day
- 2. Soil. Plant roses in rich, well-draining soil
- 3. Mulch. Add a 2-3 inch layer of coarse, organic mulch
- 4. Water do not let them dry out
- Inspect regularly
- 6. Prune as advised by the label

Instructions for pruning and feeding can be found anywhere but here are a couple of lesser known tips. Coffee grounds are good for rose bushes because of their high nitrogen content. In addition, bugs and pests are repelled by coffee grounds. If you (or rather your roses!) <u>do</u> suffer from diseases and pests and you don't wish to buy bottled chemicals, here is the recipe for a home-made fungicide.

Mix baking soda with water, about 4 teaspoons to a gallon (4L) of water. You can use potassium bicarbonate instead. Put in a washed out old spray or squeezy bottle.

So we all love and enjoy our roses, but maybe NOT the thorns! There is no gathering the rose without being pricked by the thorns. You can complain because roses have thorns or you can rejoice because thorns have roses and in these difficult times we must look for the beauty and remain optimistic.

We are all looking forward to the day when we can meet up again as a club and may you all stay well and safe until that time. I will let the roses have this final say which I feel is appropriate to where we are in life now.

Do not watch the petals fall from the rose with sadness, know that, like life, things sometimes must fade before they can bloom again.

Virtual Shipmates in Viral Times

General Secretary Bill Oliphant has lavished praise on Royal Naval Association Branch Secretaries for their valued service to Shipmates in keeping the fabric of the RNA together during the difficult Covid-19 crisis.

Bracknell Branch Secretary S/M June Boddrell has continued to maintain contact through emails, texts and phone calls, monitoring the welfare of Bracknell Shipmates. And a successful May meeting of the Branch was held by 'Zoom' video with the help of S/M IT guru and Standard Bearer Anthony Boddrell, with S/M Nigel Carpenter in the virtual chair.

The 'Zoom' meeting included S/M Treasurer Martin Powell's report of healthy funds, and a decision was taken to donate to the RNA NHS and Ventilator Appeal. Bracknell Shipmates enjoyed joining the field of new communication methods being recommended and supported by Central Office and, although several members were absent, enthusiasm exists for further meetings.

National Chairman S/M Keith Ridley has expressed regret at the loss of members who have crossed the bar, and whose passing has not been marked by a traditional RNA funeral because of government social distancing guidance. However, Chaplain of the Fleet the Venerable Martyn Gough QHC may consider a service of commemoration for these Shipmates. And, if more evidence were needed of these extraordinary times, RN supercarrier *HMS Queen Elizabeth* quietly slipped her Portsmouth moorings and put to sea, in stark contrast to previous fanfares and crowds of onlookers.

News of the ongoing transformation of the fleet is meanwhile stirring excitement among serving and veteran RN Shipmates. Latest 'Astute' class submarines will be supported by Poseidon P8 maritime patrol aircraft and new Type 26 frigates in the North Atlantic; carrier strike group capability is being brought to full fruition with the operational exercises of *Queen Elizabeth* and *Prince of Wales*; and new 'River' class patrol vessels will be deployed out of Gibraltar.

Five Type 31 frigates will enter service after completion at Rosyth, and three Type 23s will also join the Fleet soon. Unmanned systems are to exploit the potential for future safer and more cost-effective Mine Countermeasures.


