

Our first service back is on Sunday 16th August 2020.

Due to Covid 19 things will be very different so please read the safety measures we will have in place which are detailed below.

Until 16th Aug All Saints' Church will **ONLY** be open for <u>private prayer</u> Wed (11am–1pm) and Sun (10am-12pm)
The first hour will be in silence and the second hour will have Church music playing quietly in the background.

#### SERVICE DETAILS AND SAFETY MEASURES

The following safety measures will be in place:

- Social distancing
- Additional Cleaning
- Distanced seating
- Sanitising stations
- A one-way system
- The loo will be in use for one person at a time.
- Bread only for communion.
- Face masks to be worn inside the church.

There will be one service per weekend on Sunday at 10:00 am. It will be a Said Communion Service with no singing. Due to Covid 19, Communion will be the bread only. There will be anti-bacterial hand sanitiser out for people to sanitize their hands before receiving communion and after eating the bread.

The order of service will be on display on the screen at the front of church. It will also be sent out in an email prior to the service so that you can use your phone or tablet to follow the service as not all seating will be able to see the screen. Some of the seating will be in the Lady Chapel and the choir pews.

The seating will be socially distanced at 2m apart and seating will be marked with a yellow cross. Please sit only where the cross is located in the pew. Sitting elsewhere could mean you are too close to someone. There will be marked seating for 28 people in total for the service. If there are multiple attendees from the same household, then the household members may sit together. This will enable us to have more than 28 people in Church.

Unfortunately due to Covid 19 rules, none of the following will be allowed:

- Singing
- Talking/socialising in church (if you wish to catch up with family and friends, please can you do so outside in the church yard and away from the porch for social distancing reasons)
- Refreshments
- Creative table
- Wine with Communion.

While I am probably the worst culprit for telling children that it is ok to run around the Church and climb on the pews, I am afraid that due to Covid 19 rules, this will not be possible. Therefore, if families wish to attend the services, I must ask that all children remain in their pew for the duration of the service unless they need to use the bathroom or they are being taken outside.

Sadly, if too many people attend, we might have to limit attendance to every other week or every third week.

We are looking into the possibility of recording the service and posting it onto the website so that those who are not able to join us can watch it afterwards. It is unlikely that the Service will be broadcast live.

There will be anti-bacterial wipes available to clean the pews after the Service, but if you have some of your own, it would be very helpful if you could bring them along and clean your own area after the service. This will also avoid the possibility of a queue forming to obtain wipes.

### Believe what you feel

On this day, Morrie says that he has an exercise for us to try. We are to stand, facing away from our classmates, and fall backward, relying on another student to catch us. Most of us are uncomfortable with this, and we cannot let go for more than a few inches before stopping

ourselves. We laugh in embarrassment.

Finally, one student, a thin, quiet, dark-haired girl whom I notice almost always wears bulky, white fisherman sweaters, crosses her arms over her chest, closes her eyes, leans back, and does not flinch, like one of those Lipton tea commercials where the model splashes into the pool.

For a moment, I am sure she is going to thump on the floor. At the last instant, her assigned partner grabs her head and shoulders and yanks her up harshly.

"Whoa!!" several students yell. Some clap. Morrie finally smiles. "You see", he says to the girl, 'you closed your eyes that was the difference. Sometimes you cannot believe what you see, you have to believe what you feel. And if you are ever going to have other people trust you, you must feel that you can trust them too - even when you're in the dark. Even when you're falling".

At times like these it can sometimes feel like we are falling in the dark and not in control of anything. This is when we need to trust, trust God and trust each other. The Bible says, Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not depend on your own understanding. Proverbs chapter 3:verse 5.

Trust can be difficult because we often want things done in the way that they have always been done, or our way. Sometimes you just have to trust. I guess the question is; In whom or what do you trust?



#### The Parish Council building & The Foxes' Den Café

The Parish Council building remains closed for general use. This includes the meeting room space and public toilets. However, The Foxes' Den Café (open 10am-4pm Monday to Friday, and weekends now too) is open for takeaways only and can supply garden waste bags at £1 each – cash or cheque (made payable to 'Binfield Parish Council') in an envelope accepted. You can also leave donations for Bracknell Foodbank with The Foxes' Den if the parish office reception is closed. Parish Council and Committee meetings are running virtually and you can see Upcoming Meetings on the home page of the Council website. Please check the Parish Council website and Facebook page for news on the building re-opening in line with government guidance.

#### Community grants & CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) awards – July 2020

The Parish Council considered and approved (14 July 2020) the following:

Community Grants: 10 organisations received grants ranging from £250 to £500 and totalling £4,100 which is 32% of the 2020/21 grant fund of £13,000. The remaining 68%/£8,900 will be allocated in January 2021. The deadline for January 2021 applications is 14 December 2020.

Grants are awarded to: Age Concern Bracknell Forest (ACBF), Berkshire Multiple Sclerosis Therapy Centre (BMSTC), Bracknell Sensory Toy Library (BSTL), Citizens Advice Bracknell & District, Cruse Bereavement Care, Keep Mobile Community Transport CIO, Kerith Community Church, Revitalise Respite Holidays, Thames Hospice and Youthline Ltd.

<u>CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy):</u> Five projects were awarded CIL totalling £282,300 – Bowmen of Warfield, Binfield Football Club, Latika Tennis all received funding for projects along with two parish council projects - Pockets Copse Allotments, York Road Redevelopment.

We will be sharing more details of these projects on our website in the coming months.

#### **Major Projects Update**

<u>York Road Development</u>: Parish Councillors are deciding upon a contractor to begin the works for the York Road Development. It is anticipated that works will start in September 2020. There will be **parking restrictions** along York Road to enable heavy vehicles to access the site. York Road residents will receive a leaflet drop and all are advised to please keep an eye out for signage at York Road and notices on the <u>Parish Council website</u>.

<u>Pockets Copse Allotments (Amen Corner North):</u> Talks are underway to finalise the handover of the site to the Parish Council. Plans are being discussed on the layout of the site with contractors able to make the ground ready for the new tenants. The Parish Council are hopeful the site will be ready by the end of the year. There are currently 40 residents signed up for a plot. If you are interested in joining the waiting list, please complete an <u>Allotment Waiting List Request</u> or, if you prefer, contact the parish office.

#### Arts Week - cancelled for 2020

After much consideration it has been decided that it is impossible to run Arts Week in October/November 2020 in any meaningful form due to the coronavirus pandemic. All Arts Week 2020 events including workshops, performances, the Brownlow Hall Art Exhibition and Craft Fair and school's art are cancelled. The Arts Week Committee are now planning for Arts Week 2021. Please check the Arts Week website next year for more details on the 2021 event programme.

We have remained open at Binfield since Lockdown, including over the holidays. Staff have worked tirelessly to support children in school and at home.

Learning and exploring in our outdoor area (BOLE) has been aided by the good weather we have experienced this term.



Both within school and at home remotely, learning has continued.



We have run a holiday club for Key Worker and vulnerable children.





We have supported those at home by delivering hot meals and loaning laptops so children can access their learning remotely.



In my opinion, one of Bracknell's most beautiful residents is the silver-studded blue butterfly. The male of this heath-land specialist has iridescent blue upperwings. Both the male and female have silvery-blue patches on their hind wings that give them their name, and a beautiful pattern on their under-wings that distinguishes them from other kinds of blue butterfly.

This butterfly also has a rather incredible life-story. The female lays her eggs on heather, or other similar plants, in relatively sheltered areas. When they hatch, the caterpillars quickly fatten-up by eating these plants. Once they have grown, the caterpillars start to produce a milky secretion that is attractive to black ants (another heath-land specialist). The ants carry the



caterpillar into their nests providing it with protection from birds, mammals and reptiles. In the nest, the caterpillar turns into a chrysalis. Peter Marren, in his lovely book 'Rainbow Dust', writes "One of the most amazing sights of the butterfly world, one discovered only recently, is the emergence from the ant's nest of a Silver-studded Blue butterfly with anything up to eight ants frantically licking its body. The hour which every butterfly has to spend drying its wings is perhaps the most vulnerable of its whole life. But with a posse of fierce ants to stand guard, the chances of survival are much greater."

So, silver-studded blues need sunny heath-land sites sheltered by scrub, the presence of black ants, and for the heather to be kept relatively short, for example by rabbits. They also tend to live their entire lives within about 20m of the ant-nest from which they emerged, so any damage to that area of heath could wipe out an entire colony.

The UK supports about a fifth of the lowland heath in Europe, but the UK had about 5 times as much lowland heath in the 1800s. Berkshire, which is one of the counties that still has lowland heath, and silver-studded blue butterflies, had about 50 times as much in the 1800s. Bracknell Forest has about a third of Berkshire's lowland heath. This rare habitat is currently given the highest possible level of protection. Although some heath-land restoration has happened in the last twenty years, the pressure on lowland heath in this area remains high.

The best time to see silver-studded blues is on a still warm day during June or July. In perfect conditions, clouds of hundreds of butterflies can be found over a relatively small patch of heather. If you are lucky enough to see one then take the time to inspect it closely.

If you want a simple guide to identifying butterflies, then I recommend the Field Studies Council's 'Guide to the butterflies of Britain and Ireland'. If you want to know more about butterflies and the history of the people who named them, collected them and painted them then read 'Rainbow Dust' by Peter Marren.

Binfield's Royal British Legion Branch, formed only four years after the foundation of the charity by first National Chairman Tom Lister and first National President the Earl Haig, celebrates its 96<sup>th</sup> anniversary next year.




