#### LETTER FROM YOUR RECTOR



#### The Housewife

Tony Campolo writes that his friend and prominent radio preacher Steve Brown eloquently described a housewife who was washing dishes in the kitchen sink one day after the children had left for school. She looked at one particular plate. She stared at it for a long time and asked over and over again, "How many times have I washed this plate? How many times have I dried it? How many times will I wash it and dry it again?" She then set down the plate, took off her apron, packed a few of her belongings, and left.

That night she called home to tell her husband that she was all right, but that she just could not come home again From time to time, over the next several weeks, she would call just to see how her husband and children were doing. But she would never tell them where she was, nor accede to the pleas from her family to return.

The husband hired a detective to search for her, and after picking up a few leads, the detective tracked her down. She was in another state, living in a small apartment over a luncheonette where she had a job as a waitress. Her husband set out immediately to bring her home. When he found the place she was staying, he knocked on the door of her upstairs apartment. She opened the door, saw him, and did not say a word. She went into her bedroom, packed her belongings, and silently followed him out to the car. Then, in silence, he drove her back home.

Several hours later when the two of them were alone in their bedroom he finally spoke, and he asked her, "Why didn't you come home before? Over the phone I begged you to return. Why didn't you come?"

The wife answered, "I heard your words, but it wasn't until you came for me that I realized how much you cared and how important I was to you."

It can be said that though the prophets in the Old Testament section of the Bible may have tried to tell us about God's love, we never really got the message until God showed up among us. The Bible puts it like this, *The Word, (Jesus) became human and lived among us. We saw his glory – the glory that belongs to the only Son of the Father – and he was full of grace and truth. Johns' gospel, chapter 1 verse 14.* He broke into history and became one of us, and as one of us, showed us His love.

#### **VIRTUAL CHRISTINGLE SERVICE - CHRISTMAS EVE**

This year, sadly, we are unable to hold our traditional and hugely popular Christingle service, we are hoping to broadcast a livestream Christingle service. Daisy will be posting a DIY Christingle video so you can make your own at home, then we can all join together for a short 'service' on Christmas Eve at 5pm from the comfort of your own homes! #### **HOW TO MAKE A CHRISTINGLE**

#### You will need:

- 1 orange
- 1 small candle (a birthday cake candle will be fine)
- enough red ribbon to go round an orange with a small overlap
- 4 cocktail sticks
- a few sweets or some dried fruit such as raisins or sultanas
- small piece of foil measuring about 4cm by 4cm
- Pencil to make a hole in the orange

#### What you do:

- 1. Carefully push the pencil into the top of the orange to make a small hole.
- 2. Put about 3 sweets or dried fruit onto the cocktail sticks.
- 3. Push the cocktail sticks into the orange in four different directions slightly above the fattest part of the orange and pointing slightly upwards.
- 4. Take the foil and gently wrap it around the candle at the bottom before firmly wedging the candle into the hole that you had made in the orange. Once in position mould the foil into a shallow cup shape to catch any drips of candle wax.
- 5. Tie the ribbon round the orange and fasten with a bow, or just overlap the two ends, and secure with a pin to keep it in place.

If you want to light the candle make sure a grown-up is there to help you as lighting candles can be dangerous.

#### Parish Profile: Your new Church Warden

John Hargreaves is the new Church Warden for All Saints'. The aim of a Church Warden is to support the Parish Priest with the whole mission of the Church including pastoral, evangelistic and social elements. John has been attending All Saints' church for around 10 years and has been a regular member of the worship band at the 11am meeting. We caught up with John and asked him to comment on his new role.

It is really great to have the backdrop of All Saints' for Sunday Services, a very picturesque setting, steeped in history. Major fund-raising activities have been on-going for several years and through

this the church managed to complete a much-needed partial roof replacement. Dave Saunders, the previous Warden did a lot of work along with other members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and there is still much to do, with plans to further improve the facilities.

St Mark's is also an important building and is fundamental in supporting some of the on-going work the Church is doing, e.g. running a night shelter or providing a base for a wide range of community events. There is some urgent work needed on this building to secure the fabric and maintain the facility. Fortunately, we have another Warden Neil Harrison who is responsible for this and there are a number of other people who work behind the scenes to keep the Church operational (Matthew 6.6).

The Church of course is really the body of God's people, who are actively seeking to put Christ at the heart of everything they do. A key part of this is the development of relationships, delivering the mission of the Church and the Wardens have an important role to play. There appears to be no set formular for this work and freedom in how each individual approaches the role, so I will be trying to discover the best approach over the next few months.

There are many scriptures that speak directly to me, for instance Romans 1:20, talks about God's invisible qualities and divine nature being clearly seen, from what has been made. I occasionally try my hand at painting landscapes and have found that sitting and observing what is around us, really does heighten your awareness of a creative hand in the universe. There really is a strong argument for the concept of Intelligent design<sup>1</sup>.

I look forward to working with the Reverend Luke Taylor and the PCC as we emerge from the lock down and start to progress the mission of the Church.

# Select and Collect your favourite books and virtual children's Christmas events.

With the new restrictions in force from the 5<sup>th</sup> November, Binfield Library is now temporarily closed. Whitegrove Library will now be offering "Select and Collect" and you can park there for free. Please check our website,

https://www.bracknell-forest.gov.uk/libraries, for updates or call Bracknell Library at 01344 423149.

While the lockdown restrictions are still in place, four libraries are open: Bracknell, Whitegrove, Crowthorne and Sandhurst for you to collect reserved items.

#### Select and Collect your favourite books!

Select and Collect is one of the latest services introduced by your library during lockdown. Have you tried it already? It is super easy — and completely free!

- 1. Order a book from our library catalogue (<a href="https://capitadiscovery.co.uk/bracknellforest/home">https://capitadiscovery.co.uk/bracknellforest/home</a>). Or call one of the open libraries above. You can reserve up to 10 books.
- 2. Wait for the notification (usually via email) that the book is ready.
- 3. Pick up your book during opening times: Bracknell and Whitegrove Library are open Monday to Saturday, 10am-4pm (but on Wednesday Bracknell is closed), Crowthorne (Monday to Wednesday, 10am-4pm) and Sandhurst (Thursday to Saturday, 10am-4pm).

Things may change after restrictions are lifted, so please check our website or give us a call.

#### How to return or renew your books

If your books are going to be due during the lockdown period, don't worry! You can either return or renew them if you would like some more time.

To return books you can bring them back to one of the four libraries above during opening times. Or you can use the letterbox at Binfield Library to "post" your books through. The correct one is on the side door, in the car park, and it is available 24/7.

To renew your books, you can use either our online catalogue (up to two renewals), call the open libraries or send an email to bracknell.library@bracknell-forest.gov.uk.

However in October 2019 Emily was approached by the GB Bobsleigh Squad and invited to train with them as they prepared for the Beijing 2022 Olympics.

Two months later, Emily had given up her career, committed to full time training and she made her international debut for Great Britain at the European Cup in Winterberg in December 2019.

A fully established member of the GB Bobsleigh squad, Emily and her team mate Felicity Bee now form 'Bob Team Bee' and are currently in Winterberg, Germany training for the European Cup Series 2020. This training is vital for their ultimate goal of the Beijing 2022 Olympics and Emily and Felicity have high hopes for success!

However – there are plenty of challenges still to come and this is not just the international competition. Emily and Felicity are totally reliant on personal and team sponsorship to get them through each season, and there is no external support from any other funding.



Between them, they have to personally fund the cost of training, travel, nutrition, sports equipment and physiotherapy expenses with no external help.







#### A Short Walk round Pope's Meadow and Binfield Village Centre

Binfield Environment Group have been asked to contribute occasional walks to the Beacon. Here is our first

submission, a short walk round Pope's Meadow and Binfield village centre.


This walk includes two grassy paths which can be muddy after rain. For families with buggies it is recommended that you take the shorter route. The walk is approximately 2.5 kilometres long and will take about 30 minutes.

Start at the Pope's Meadow Car Park on St Mark's Road. Pass to the right of the copse that you see down the slope and leave the meadow through the gate at the far right (northwest) corner. Turn right into Murrell Hill Lane. At the top you will pass Whitehouse Farmhouse (a Grade II listed building originally built in the 16<sup>th</sup> Century). Turn left here along Foxley Lane.

After 100 metres turn right at a bollard along a tarmac path that leads to Benetfeld Road. Follow Benetfield Road until you read a tarmac path on the right by a post-box. Take this path, turning left at the next path junction to pass to the left of the tennis courts. The building to your left is the Binfield Parish Council Office and Foxes' Den cafe (A). There is a car park here which you could use as an alternative start.

The path brings you to Benetfield Road again. Turn right and pass Binfield Primary School. Before the road reaches the roundabout turn right along a path to pass to the right of the village library. On the far side of the roundabout you will catch a glimpse of Binfield Place (a Grade II\* listed building, parts of which date to the 16<sup>th</sup> Century). Just after the library turn right and follow the path round the front of the Oakmede Place shops (B) to cross Terrace Road South at the pedestrian crossing. Our route turns left here, but if you want to shorten the walk by 300m or fancy a coffee and cake at Crema (C) turn right and follow the road south (Crema is on the left about 100m further on).

If you are following the main route and have turned left after the crossing, you will come to the roundabout in the village centre. Turn right and follow the road downhill past the Coop (D). This building used to be the Royal Standard public house and some evidence of its former use is still visible. Turn right into Emmets Nest. When this road bends right continue straight ahead down the tarmac lane. Where the lane ends at a wooden gate, cross Emmets Park to join the footpath opposite. At the top of the hill stop and admire the view on your left over to Buckinghamshire, before turning right to



follow the path between wooden fences to eventually come out on Terrace Road South. Turn left. People following the shorter route re-join us here.

Pass Daruchini (E), formerly the Roebuck public house, and Newbold College, the Seventh Day Adventist Church. Before the junction with Popeswood Road cross what is now St Marks Road and continue along it, passing St Marks Church on your left. Your starting point, Pope's Meadow is a little further along the road.

#### Challenges, Achievements, Centenary Hopes

As the Royal British Legion looks forward to celebrating 2021 as its centenary year there is much to remember from 2020, the year

countless millions might prefer to forget.

From veterans and their families finding themselves in debt and facing emergency situations, to breaks and relief from mental and physical stress, RBL initiatives have provided vital support for the Armed Services community.

Centred around adaptive sport and adventurous training activities, the Battle Back Centre in Lilleshall continued to aid the recovery and rehabilitation of wounded, injured and sick serving and ex-Service personnel, whilst support also remained available for those experiencing the challenges of unemployment or



problems with mental health, alcohol or substance abuse.

Providing help to live independently has proven invaluable to families preparing for the transition from Service to civilian life. Across 21 counties a Legion team has carried out minor home adaptations and basic maintenance, including the installation of care phones — a telephone-based unit that can be used to summon assistance in an emergency.

Last year £4.7m was spent on providing 5,741 people with a much-needed short-term break at one of the award-winning RBL Break Centres. And 793 residents across the Legion's six national care homes received high-quality personal nursing

and dementia care. One in six people over 80 suffers from dementia in the UK today, and it is estimated that by 2025

the figure could reach more than a million. Specialist Admiral Nurses, developed in partnership between the Legion and

Dementia UK, are offering information and advice to family carers living with dementia sufferers within the Armed Forces community.



A dedicated website called Moneyforce was set up to improve understanding of financial matters like interest charges and the purchase of property, issues which can prove confusing to personnel leaving the Armed Services. Despite their being closed since March as a result of Covid-19 measures, more than 90,000 people received expert guidance when visiting the 16 British Legion Pop-in Centres across the UK last year.

Binfield RBL Secretary Denise Fuller (01344 426885) would welcome all applications -- not necessary to have any ex-Service connection -- to join the parish's 95-year-old Legion Branch and support the world-renowned charity's work among the Armed Forces community.

The approach of a Festive Season unlike any other in peacetime prompts the Royal Naval Association to ask its member Shipmates to pay special attention to those who are the most isolated and at risk of loneliness and diminishing mental health.

Bracknell RNA Chairman S/M Mike Daley welcomed 21 members to the November meeting conducted by the 'Zoom' virtual system which has proven a successful means of keeping Branch Shipmates in contact with each other.

Branch Secretary S/M June Boddrell reported that the latest issue of the *Semaphore Circular* included an article by retired RN Commander Tom Sharpe, OBE on the complexities of bringing a QE Class aircraft carrier into harbour and another on the involvement of the Fleet Air Arm in the 1940 Battle of Britain. Shipmates were reminded how the 2020 Cenotaph Remembrance Parade had been drastically downsized by the Government due to the Covid-19 regulations, resulting in 30 veterans replacing the 10,000 plus who normally took part in the parade.

It was announced that the National Council had approved a raft of membership benefits for WWII veterans in recognition of their service to the country and S/M Secretary June will be applying on behalf of Bracknell S/Ms Sid Negus and Alexander Lloyd for a free and Life Membership, respectively, now available to them. Branch Treasurer S/M Martin Powell

told the meeting of a slight increase in the continuing healthy funds since last month; S/M Social Secretary Lynne Daley had nothing to report owing to Coronavirus restrictions affecting visits and events.

Any other business included concern that reports of the Binfield Memorial Hall VJ Day commemoration had attributed the event to the RNA instead of Binfield Royal British Legion Branch. Several Shipmates belong to both organisations and it was noted that efforts would be made to avoid future confusion. An entertaining 'Dits' Corner included an item on the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the decisive Royal Navy victory at the WWII Battle of Taranto, poems from S/M Nigel Carpenter and anecdotes from S/Ms June and Martin.

When Branch business was concluded, Shipmates were enthralled by personal reflexions by Vice-Chairman S/M Nigel Carpenter on his Royal Naval career which culminated in achieving the rank of Lieutenant in the Regulating Branch (RN Police) and serving as Naval Provost Marshal for Scotland and Northern Ireland and then Provost Marshall, Gibraltar, where he was in charge of all three Services' police forces.
