The Smell of Rain

A cold March wind danced around the dead of night in Dallas as the doctor walked into the small hospital room of Diana Blessing. Still groggy from surgery, her husband David held her hand as they braced themselves for the latest news. That afternoon of March 10, 1991, complications had forced Diana, only 24-weeks pregnant, to undergo an emergency cesarean to deliver the couple's new daughter, Danae Lu Blessing. At 12 inches long and weighing only one pound and nine ounces, they already knew she was perilously premature. Still, the doctor's soft words dropped like bombs. 'I don't think she's going to make it', he said, as kindly as he could. "There's only a 10-percent chance she will live through the night, and even then, if by some slim chance she does make it, her future could be a very cruel one."

Numb with disbelief, David and Diana listened as the doctor described the devastating problems Danae would likely face if she survived. She would never walk, she would never talk, she would probably be blind, and she would certainly be prone to other catastrophic conditions from cerebral palsy to complete mental retardation, and on and on. "No! No!" was all Diana could say. She and David, with their 5-year-old son Dustin, had long dreamed of the day they would have a daughter to become a family of four. Now, within a matter of hours, that dream was slipping away. Through the dark hours of morning as Danae held onto life by the thinnest thread, Diana slipped in and out of sleep, growing more and more determined that their tiny daughter would live-and live to be a healthy, happy young girl.

But David, fully awake and listening to additional dire details of their daughter's chances of ever leaving the hospital alive, much less healthy, knew he must confront his wife with the inevitable. David walked in and said that we needed to talk about making funeral arrangements. Diana remembers 'I felt so bad for him because he was doing everything, trying to include me in what was going on, but I just wouldn't listen, I couldn't listen.' I said, "No, that is not going to happen, no way! I don't care what the doctors say; Danae is not going to die! One day she will be just fine, and she will be coming home with us!"

As if willed to live by Diana's determination, Danae clung to life hour after hour, with the help of every medical machine and marvel her miniature body could endure. But as those first days passed, a new agony set in for David and Diana. Because Danae's under-developed nervous system was

essentially 'raw,' the lightest kiss or caress only intensified her discomfort, so they couldn't even cradle their tiny baby girl against their chests to offer the strength of their love. All they could do, as Danae struggled alone beneath the ultraviolet light in the tangle of tubes and wires, was to pray that God would stay close to their precious little girl. There was never a moment when Danae suddenly grew stronger.

But as the weeks went by, she did slowly gain an ounce of weight here and an ounce of strength there. At last, when Danae turned two months old, her parents were able to hold her in their arms for the very first time. And two months later-though doctors continued to gently but grimly warn that her chances of surviving, much less living any kind of normal life, were next to zero. Danae went home from the hospital, just as her mother had predicted.

Today, five years later, Danae is a petite but feisty young girl with glittering gray eyes and an unquenchable zest for life. She shows no signs, whatsoever, of any mental or physical impairment. Simply, she is everything a little girl can be and more but that happy ending is far from the end of her story.

One blistering afternoon in the summer of 1996 near her home in Irving, Texas, Danae was sitting in her mother's lap in the bleachers of a local ballpark where her brother Dustin's baseball team was practicing. As always, Danae was chattering non-stop with her mother and several other adults sitting nearby when she suddenly fell silent. Hugging her arms across her chest, Danae asked, "Do you smell that?" Smelling the air and detecting the approach of a thunderstorm, Diana replied, "Yes, it smells like rain." Danae closed her eyes and again asked, "Do you smell that?" Once again, her mother replied, "Yes, I think we're about to get wet, it smells like rain." Still caught in the moment, Danae shook her head, patted her thin shoulders with her small hands and loudly announced, "No, it smells like Him. It smells like God when you lay your head on His chest." Tears blurred Diana's eyes as Danae then happily hopped down to play with the other children.



Before the rains came, her daughter's words confirmed what Diana and all the members of the extended Blessing family had known, at least in their hearts, all along. During those long days and

nights of her first two months of her life, when her nerves were too sensitive for them to touch her, God was holding Danae on His chest and it is His loving scent that she remembers so well.

Next time it's raining and you want to complain that you might get wet, let's be honest, we all do it, why not stop for a moment and take a deep breath in through your nose and see if you too can smell God. If you can't, don't worry, just remember these words that Jesus said, "I am with you always, even until the end of this age" Matthew 28 v 20.

New Talk series - 'Ask me anything'



We are still unsure of what 2021 will bring us, but at the moment the youth and kids are currently still meeting online every week, which is almost as good as the real thing.







Binfield Lighthouse Programme News

The Lighthouse Program has continued to support a growing need in the local area. We are now supporting circa 100 people. We are helping individuals, couples and a number of young families, where the current circumstance have hit hardest. We are providing home cooked meals and essential provisions.



Christmas was a particular success. We found sponsorship for all the family lunches, and hampers were delivered enabling the families to

cook their traditional lunch themselves. A further 60 people enjoyed a fully prepared meal which was delivered directly to them on Christmas Day.

Every cloud has a silver lining and fortunately for us we were very grateful for the tremendous amount of donations of foods over December as Lock Down rules became more restrictive. Schools, cafe's, bars, restaurants and the Share program all provided surplus foods that we were able to cook and distribute. The coming together of the local community and diverse organizations can not be under estimated.



December was, and has historically been, the month in which we receive the majority of our cash donations too. A huge thanks to all that have supported us. Monies are being used to purchase meats and the more expensive items that our volunteer cooks use to create well balanced meals.

I would like to call out "danetti" as a particular sponsor of our program. danetti has provided essential items on our behalf and supported us with kit/equipment that has made our lives so much easier and more efficient. This really has been a Godsend as our numbers continue to increase and we rely on voluntary support.

Further good news is that both St Josephs and Newbold Church have joined us with the cooking and delivery of meals. This additional help is fantastic for our client base who will now receive a food parcel on both a Tuesday and a Saturday, across the two deliveries there will be a minimum of 7 home cooked meals per person per week.

On a weekly basis we are delivering approx. 800 meals. It's a tall order!


HOW CAN YOU HELP?



GB Bobsleigh Update

Following the article in last months Beacon, here's an update on how the Bobsleigh season progressed for GB Athlete and local Binfield resident Emily Barrett.

Emily and her pilot Felicity Bee have recently produced significantly improved results from their outing in Winterberg in December. Barrett and Bee, who were racing together for only the second time, finished 8th of 14 sleds at their race on 15th January in Igls, Austria, having been 16 of 17 last time out in Winterberg.

Medical graduate Felicity has only been racing 2-woman sleds for a few weeks having competed solely in monobob last season but she and Barrett beat a number of more experienced outfits, plus the Youth Olympic Champion, in a field that included an Olympic gold medalist and a multiple World Cup winner.

book "Where The Wild Things Are", the protagonist Max travels to a remote island to become the king of the wild things. We don't need to travel anywhere near as far to enjoy Binfield's wild things.

Towards the end of 2020 I realised that some of the most amazing wild things in our area can actually be found in some of the least promising places. A few examples include the newt colony in an abandoned brickworks, the slow worms on a former industrial site and the barn owls in our sewage

works. One of my favourite local places is where a path passes through a line of trees separating open countryside from a newish housing estate. There are always birds going about their business on the housing estate side of the trees, from the small birds searching for food in the hedgerow to larger birds on and above the house, on the lookout for food put out by the home-owners. I am convinced that there are more species of birds in the area now than there were when it was farm fields.

In Maurice Sendak's wonderful children's Binfield Environment Group members have been carrying out regular surveys on a number of sites across the parish. We now have enough data to show that almost twice as many species of birds and a third more species of butterflies are turning up at the new park at Blue Mountain compared with the established park at Wicks Green. One of the reasons for this is the greater variety of habitats at Blue Mountain, some of which are temporarily created as the site is developed. For example, some of the plants sought out by butterflies like to grow in disturbed ground.

> Conservationists are beginning to recognise that some of the sites we try to protect are less valuable in terms of biodiversity than some of the sites we overlook and that some of our interventions are driven more by our own views of what the country should look like rather than good science.

One of the things that I intend to do in 2021, and I encourage you to join me, is to pay a bit more attention to some of the less tidy parts of the parish. Nature thrives in the areas that we neglect, from unkempt gardens to abandoned quarries. I have a couple of sites that I want to survey this year that have been left alone for a year or more.

Walk around Wicks Green and Billingbear - 3 km

This walk includes two grassy paths which can be muddy after rain. It is not recommended for buggies. Dogs should be kept on leads in the Billingbear section.

Start at the car park on Stevenson Drive. Travelling north from the village centre on Terrace Road North pass The Victoria Arms and turn left at the roundabout onto Stevenson Drive. Follow this road round to the left and immediately after a mini roundabout the gravel car park is on the right.

On the north side of the car park (right side as you drove in) take the gravelled path past an information board and around the edge of the park to the north-west corner. Pass through a small gate and turn right along Wicks Green. Pass Wicks Green Cottages (a Grade II listed building originally built in the

16th century). Take the footpath on the left, into the field opposite the cottages, and follow the right-hand field edge almost reversing your previous direction.

At a T-junction of paths turn right and follow the left hand edge of a much larger field up the hill. When you reach a road (Carters Hill) turn right. After a few metres look right to get a view across Binfield towards Surrey. Carry on along the road and at a drive




Path entrance opposite cottages

on the left turn along it. This drive is also signed as a footpath and part of the Rambler's Route (a black arrow with three heads on a white background). The Rambler's Route is a 26 mile circuit of the countryside around Bracknell, and full details can be found on Bracknell Forest Council's website.

Walk up the drive past Orange Hill House. As the lane bears right, pass through a gap in the hedge on the left and cross the field to a gate and stile. As you cross into the next field enjoy the view to the north-east. Follow the hedge on the left to Billingbear Lane. Turn left and follow the lane through the hamlet of Billingbear looking out for views on your right across the Thames Valley to the north-west.

When the road reaches a T-junction turn left walking on the grass verge past the walled garden of Billingbear House (an 18th Century building in a lovely parkland setting) until you reach the path on the right that you came up earlier. Follow this downhill, going straight ahead when you reach the path junction in the smaller field. When you reach Wicks Green you will see the gate back into the park on your left.

Binfield Garden Club

A belated Happy New Year to everyone with this first report of 2021. We have a glimmer of hope for the future but for now there will still be no meetings face to face. We will be

holding our AGM online in March and are tentatively attempting plans to hold our very popular annual plant sale somewhere outside in May or June.



In January and February of the past years our speakers have covered such interesting subjects including The Healing Power of Plants, antique garden tools and The Woodland Trust. This year, without a meeting, let's think about what to look for outside. Coming into flower will be Witch Hazels, Daphnes,

winter flowering honeysuckles, early magnolias and pussy willow. On the ground look for snowdrops, winter aconites, celandines, primroses and sweet violets.

Also, with the trees still bare, try to identify them by their buds/thorns/catkins/bark/winter tree shape and look on the ground for old leaves and their fruit. Google a Tree Guide App or try the Natural History Museum which provides a PDF of tree identification. On the subject of trees, Ralph has written a very interesting piece about the minarette tree.

"I think that I shall never see a poem lovely as a tree"
- Joyce Kilmer 1913"

If the Spreading Chestnut tree and giant oak are epics of the tree world then the humble minarette is merely an ode or couplet. Nevertheless it can be an attractive and productive addition to even a quite small garden. The tree is purchased as a single upright trunk, quite like a thick runner-bean stick grafted onto suitable dwarf root-stock. There are no branches but only short twigs every 20 cm or so, on which fruit buds will

form. Consequently they need very little space, say a square metre or so, and are happy near walls or fences provided they get some sunshine. Be sure to stake them initially; when I thought it unnecessary in a sheltered spot it proved me wrong and hard work to correct! The tree may well produce fruit from the first year, and after that with an annual prune of new shoots back to 3 or 4 leaves from their base (or completely

where it becomes crowded) it should soon be producing 20 lbs or more of succulent fruit. Be sure to select self pollinators or two compatible varieties. My greengage minarette only ever produced the odd fruit despite cajoling and then threats, and finally had to be consigned to green waste. Our most successful trees have been Beurre Hardy and Conference pears, the former having the edge in both flavour and productivity."



Good luck, and be sure to hear Paul Robeson sing "Trees" on YouTube.

Please continue to take care everyone, and keep up the exercise and fresh air by walking our lovely local lanes. The beauty of spring is on its way and we look forward to the day when our meetings can safely resume and outings to wonderful gardens. 
