A MESSAGE FROM YOUR RECTOR



Credo

Each spring, for many years, I have set myself the task of writing a personal statement of belief: a Credo. When I was younger, the statement ran for many pages, trying to cover every base, with no loose ends. It sounded like a Supreme Court brief, as if words could resolve all

conflicts about the meaning of existence.

The Credo has grown shorter in recent years—sometimes cynical, sometimes comical, and sometimes bland—but I keep working at it. Recently I set out to get the statement of personal belief down to one page in simple terms, fully understanding the naïve idealism that implied.

ALL I REALLY NEED TO KNOW about how to live and what to do and how to be I learned in kindergarten. Wisdom was not at the top of the graduate-school mountain, but there in the sandpile at Sunday School. These are the things I learned:

Share everything.
Play fair.
Don't hit people.
Put things back where you found them.
Clean up your own mess.
Don't take things that aren't yours.
Say you're sorry when you hurt somebody.
Wash your hands before you eat.
Flush.

Warm cookies and cold milk are good for you.

Live a balanced life—learn some and think some and draw and paint and sing and dance and play and work every day

some

Take a nap every afternoon.

When you go out into the world, watch out for traffic, hold hands, and stick together.

Wonder.

Remember the little seed in the Styrofoam cup: The roots go down and the plant goes up and

nobody really knows how or why, but we are all like that.

Goldfish and hamsters and white mice and

even

the little seed in the Styrofoam cup—they all die.
So do we.

And then remember the Dick-and-Jane books and the first word you learned —the biggest word of all—LOOK.

Everything you need to know is in there somewhere. The Golden Rule and love and basic sanitation. Ecology and politics and equality and sane living.

Take any one of those items and extrapolate it into sophisticated adult terms and apply it to your family life or your work or your government or your world and it holds true

and clear and firm. Think what a better world it would be if we all—the whole world—had cookies and milk about three o'clock every afternoon and then lay down with our blankies for a nap. Or if all governments had as a basic policy to always put things back where they found them and to clean up their own mess.

every base, with no loose ends. It sounded like a Supreme Court brief, as if words could resolve all of existence.

And it is still true, no matter how old you are—when you go out into the world, it is best to hold hands and stick together. As I write this I am sixty-five years old. Not so old, really, but I have been around awhile. Kindergarten is a long way back there. What do I know now? The Kindergarten Credo is not kid stuff. It is not simple. It is elemental. What if we all became like children again? (Notice I said like Children, not childish......men!)

In Matthew's gospel we read this in Chapter 18 verses 1-4. At that time the followers came to Jesus and asked, "Who is greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" Jesus called a little child to him and stood the child before his followers. Then he said, "I tell you the truth, you must change and become like little children. Otherwise, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. The greatest person in the kingdom of heaven is the one who makes himself humble like this child.

What if we went back to living out what we learned in Kindergarten, Sunday school or nursery, became like a child again in our outlooks and beliefs, and lived them out? What changes would you need to make?

BOWEL CANCER SCREENING:

Men and women between the ages of 60 and 74 are screened every 2 years. If you are in this age group and have NOT received a screening kit through the post please advise the Bowel Cancer Screening Helpline, (0800 7076060). People above the age of 74 can request a screening kit. Please telephone the Bowel Cancer Screening Helpline for details. The stool sample you give is analysed and followed up. It is extremely important that you take advantage of this screening.

FLU SEASON:

The flu season is now upon us.

If you receive a text message or 'phone call from the Surgery advising you that the flu vaccine is now available, please arrange an appointment at the surgery.

If you believe you should receive a flu vaccination and have not received a text message or 'phone call or have never received a flu vaccine previously, please telephone the surgery to see if you are eligible on (01344) 286264.

AGEING: If you are now 65 or older it is crucial to be as physically active as possible. Walking can improve everything from blood pressure to mental health. Try to keep socially active too. Take the positive decision to join an evening class or club or become a volunteer.

TELEPHONE CALLING 111: 111 is the NHS non-emergency number. It is fast, easy and free and is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Call 111 for the following;

- 1. Fast medical help which is not a 999 emergency.
- 2. If you think you need to go to A&E or need another NHS urgent care service.
- 3. If you are unsure who to call.
- 4. You need health information or reassurance about what to do next.

For immediate, life threatening emergencies, call 999.

PHARMACIES:

<u>Please use your local pharmacy for help and advice regarding minor illness, before seeking help from your GP.</u>

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19):

The main symptoms are:

- 1. A high temperature over 37.8c.
- 2. A new continuous cough.
- 3. A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste.

If you have any of the above symptoms, even if they are mild, you should arrange a PCR test. This test can be completed at home or can be taken for you at one of the many testing sites. The test is sent to a lab for analysis. You and anyone you live with should stay at home and not have visitors until you get your test result.

LATERAL FLOW TESTS should NOT be used if you have any symptoms of Covid. Only take a PCR test that is sent to a lab.

Binfield Garden Club

How quickly the seasons come and go and here we are in Autumn – a beautiful time of year when leaves change from green to gold and vibrant colours. In fact autumn could be seen as a second spring when every leaf is a flower.

Appropriately, our members have just enjoyed a really inspirational zoom talk by Daniele Altieri entitled The Garden That Never Sleeps. He reminded us that although from October most of our garden goes to sleep, we mustn't forget it for the four months of winter, just sitting inside by



the fire looking through plant catalogues. Plan carefully and we can extend our garden's interest and beauty whatever the cold weather.

Daniele suggests taking a photo of our garden in the summer, filter it to black and white and you can see the structures already there. For example, roses will soon just turn to bare sticks for 5 or 6 months so surround them with something beautiful underneath and around - snowdrops and early daffs combined with the foliage of cyclamen hederifolium (their flowers come later) and then the roses will take over again. Hydrangeas, while they are bare, could also have snowdrops underneath with Islas red hellebores. Ground cover plants can be left as foliage for Iris reticulat to grow through. Combine spring daffs and grape hyacinths with the emerging leaves of peonies which will then take over.

Structure is of vital importance - leave your obelisks and supports to stand empty for interest and plant the lovely bright colours of Cornus, especially Cornus midwinter fire.

Grasses come into their own in the winter, evergreen ceanothus and evergreen ferns look stunning and do leave the seed heads of hydrangeas and sedum to look beautiful with frost on them.

Throughout the cold months, take advantage of lovely scented plants, Daphne Odora,



hamamelis, sarcocca, viburnum bodnantense Dawn and winter honeysuckle. Daniele reminded us not to plant them down the end of a muddy path, but by our doors, windows and gates! He showed us many lovely examples of all his suggestions and also recommended visiting Hilliers Arboretum, Hampshire for the very best of winter gardens and also Great Dixter in February.

We were all certainly inspired by Daniele's ideas and photos and hope to make more of our winter gardens from now on.

Our programme of speakers has been updated on our website and although the next few will still be on Zoom, new members are always welcome to join us. Sadly no tea and cakes, raffle or bric a brac but lots of interest on your screen especially with a glass of wine in hand! We have a full programme for 2022 and will hopefully be back to normal by then.

October 7th will be a talk *Learning to look after and love your soil* and November 4th will be *Planting containers for winter colour and spring joy.*



LIGHTHOUSE UPDATE



The Binfield Lighthouse Program continues to support the needy with food parcels. Our numbers have reduced over the summer months as other places have begun to operate and get back to normal. FoodBank is now fully open and this has made a significant difference to people that can go direct for supplies and provisions.

The lighthouse Team deliver a minimum of 4 homecooked meals per week and Newbold Church deliver 3, so all of our client base have a meal for every day of the week.

We will not be operating an overnight shelter this year, as Bracknell Council and the Rough Sleeper Team will work directly with clients to ensure there are no homeless in the immediate area. This does mean that people will be temporarily housed in B&Bs whilst waiting for a more permanent solutions. We will help these people as access to kitchens can be very limited.

Current donation needs include:

- Cereal bars
- Long life part cooked bread
- Tinned meat and fish
- Fresh fruit vegetables (in date for Tuesday delivery)
- Fruit juices
- Dog food



Binfield's butterflies 2021

I am stood transfixed by a buddleia bush in the September sunshine. It is alive with butterflies. Every flowering branch has at least two. I try to take some pictures, but I fail to capture the colours or the contrast that comes from the butterflies jostling for position and opening and closing their wings. Most of the butterflies are tortoiseshells or peacocks but there are a few red admirals and large whites on the bush as well.

For butterflies, this year has been almost the opposite of last year. The warm spell at the start of 2020 led to large numbers of early butterflies and predictions of a butterfly summer that never materialised. This year a cold wet start resulted in smaller numbers of early butterflies, but a generally settled July and August has seen more late season butterflies than the last couple of years. Initial results from the UK Butterfly Monitoring Service (www.ukbms.org) say that numbers of gatekeepers and graylings, both late season species, are at levels that haven't been recorded for years. My buddleia bush suggests that the same may be true for other species.

The grayling is one of my favourite butterflies. Look closely at the picture and see if you can spot the butterfly. These heath-land specialists have the most amazing camouflage on their underwings. When they alight on stony ground or tree trunks they are almost impossible to see. On a warm sunny day in August or early September, the open parts of Bracknell Forest, such as Hut Hill, are good places to see them. They can also be found on the south facing slope at Amen Corner South. I have been told, by someone who managed to keep a straight face, that they also align themselves with the sun to cast the smallest possible shadow. I'm not sure about that, but I do now check every time I see one land.



Butterflies are a good indicator of the health of our countryside because they tend to specialise in particular habitats and particular food-plants. The grayling needs coastal or heath-land habitat and its caterpillars feed on a small number of grasses found in these open habitats. They seem to thrive where there is some level of disturbance such as from cattle or ponies.

I might write another piece about butterflies when the results from the Big Butterfly Count are published. Until then, let's all enjoy the last butterflies of the year when the sun brings them out.


September the Bracknell Branch of the Royal Naval Association is also looking to kick the new sessions off with a bang and, as usual, our Social Secretary didn't disappoint.
