# A MESSAGE FROM YOUR RECTOR



#### A Small White Envelope

It's just a small, white envelope stuck among the branches of our Christmas tree. No name, no identification, no inscription. It has peeked through the branches of our tree for the past 10 years or so.

husband Mike hated Christmas - oh, not the true meaning of Christmas, but the commercial aspects of it: overspending; the frantic running around at the last minute to get a tie for Uncle Harry and the dusting powder for Grandma; the gifts given in desperation because you couldn't think of anything else.

Knowing he felt this way, I decided one year to bypass the usual shirts, sweaters, ties and so forth. I reached for something special just for Mike. The inspiration came in an unusual way.

Our son Kevin, who was 12 that year, was wrestling at the junior level at the school he attended. And shortly before Christmas, there was a non-league match against a team sponsored by an inner-city church. These youngsters, dressed in sneakers so ragged that shoestrings seemed to be the only thing holding them together, presented a sharp contrast to our boys in their spiffy blue and gold uniforms and sparkling new wrestling shoes. As the match began, I was alarmed to see that the other team was wrestling without headgear, a kind of light helmet designed to protect a wrestler's ears.

It was a luxury the ragtag team obviously could not afford. Well, we ended up walloping them. We took every weight class. And as each of their boys got up from the mat, he swaggered around in his tatters with false bravado, a kind of street pride that couldn't acknowledge defeat. Mike, seated beside me, shook his head sadly, "I wish just one of them could have won," he said. "They have a lot of potential, but losing like this could take the heart right out of them."

Mike loved kids – all kids – and he knew them, having coached little league, football, baseball and lacrosse. That's when the idea for his present came.

That afternoon, I went to a local sporting goods store and bought an assortment of wrestling headgear and shoes and sent them anonymously to the inner-city church. On Christmas Eve, I placed the envelope on the tree, the note inside telling Mike what I had done and that this was his gift from me. His smile was the brightest thing about Christmas that year and in succeeding years. For each Christmas, I followed the tradition – one year sending a group of disabled youngsters to a hockey game, another year a cheque to a pair of elderly brothers whose home had burned to the ground the week before Christmas, and on and on.

The envelope became the highlight of our Christmas. It was always the last thing opened on Christmas morning and our children, ignoring their new toys, would stand with wideeyed anticipation as their dad lifted the envelope from the tree to reveal its contents.

As the children grew, the toys gave way to more practical presents, but the envelope never lost its allure. And the story doesn't end there.

You see, we lost Mike last year due to dreaded cancer. When Christmas rolled around, I was still so wrapped in grief that I barely got the tree up. But Christmas Eve found me placing an envelope on the tree, and in the morning, it was joined by three more. Each of our children, unbeknownst to the others, had placed an envelope on the tree for their dad. The tradition has grown and someday will expand even further with our grandchildren standing around the tree with wide-eyes anticipation watching as their fathers take down the envelope.

Mike's spirit, like the Christmas spirit, will always be with

Surely, the true spirit of Christmas is in giving and not receiving. The Bible says, for God so loved he gave....John chapter 3 verse 16. Isn't that why we give presents, because God gave His most precious gift that first Christmas? How can you give to others this Christmas? Maybe you can start your own "white envelope" tradition on your tree this festive season?

We as a church love to give to Alternative Advent, where we ask anyone who can afford it to buy an extra present (not exceeding 10 pounds in cost) for a single parent who otherwise wouldn't receive a Christmas gift this year because they go with out to ensure that their children don't. If you would like to be involved in Alternative Advent we will be collecting the presents from Sunday 21 November to Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> December. The presents can either be given to Luke in church, dropped off at the church office or left on the bench outside the front door of the Rectory. They will then be taken to the Family Intervention Team who then distribute them to the single parents in the area who need them the most. Thank you in advance, and I pray you will have a great time of giving this Christmas.

#### **BINFIELD GARDEN CLUB**

Our final talk of 2021 was a really successful and interesting evening with Harriet Rycroft showing us how to plant pots for winter interest and spring joy. Binfield gardens

should soon be looking more beautiful than ever!

Harriet was head gardener for many years at Whichford Pottery in Warwickshire where the winters are cold and hard so is able to give expert advice. She plants dozens of pots and containers made from a variety of materials and in different sizes, once in autumn and



once in late spring. She says do plant while it's still relatively mild so the plants can put roots down into the compost. A useful tip is to write down what you put in the pots, group them for impact and shelter from the worst of the weather. Put them all where you can see them in winter, the first crocus shoots will come up to cheer you! Don't swipe snow off pot plants, it actually protects

them from the wind and melts slowly to water the plants.

Pack autumn pots with bulbs and some lovely evergreen plants through which they will then poke. Harriet showed us many examples from little conifers to alpine plants, euphorbias and hellebores. Later flowering bulbs like tulips, aliums and camassia go in the deepest, crocus



and iris reticulate nearer the top and then the foliage.

Harriet gave us an excellent demonstration, planting up a medium sized pot in her kitchen! Her first advice was to make sure there is a decent hole in the bottom with just one crock over the hole. She said drainage layers are a myth, they take up space which should be compost and they make homes for slugs. Always use the best compost and add slow release fertiliser. Plant bulbs densely, close together but not touching. Harriet put her tulips in a crescent around a conifer and added hellebore Silver Dollar, White Magic muscari and crocus on top to provide a continuous display. Fill the compost to end an inch below the top of the pot and fill that inch with grit to keep the mice off!

Some other suggestions were to plant tulips with grasses and forget me not seeds, Snow Baby narcissi with blue grape hyacinths. And remember, hyacinths are hardy and bloom in March but don't use those prepared for indoors. We all enjoyed Harriet's talk and demonstration so much and came away with many ideas!

Our December 2nd meeting will be a Christmas drinks and buffet social time at the Binfield Club and invitations have been sent to all members — a wonderful chance to end the year and meet up with each other.

January's talk will be by Michelle Cleeve on The Savill Garden where she has been supervisor for many years so do please join us. Check our website binfieldgardenclub.wordpress.com.

#### **REMEMBRANCE WEEKEND 2021**

The weather on Saturday morning was thankfully dry, although we did have a slight shower during the service. The turnout was slightly less for the Remembrance Day Service, at the War Memorial St Mark's Church. A piper

led in The Royal British Legion, The Royal Naval Association, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Binfield Brownies Standards to start the short service. The service was opened by Reverend Luke Taylor. We then had a pupil from Kings Academy Oakwood tell Len Burritt's Story. Len was a member of The Binfield Royal British Legion and had served in WW2. Sadly Len Passed away in October at 103, But has left his



wonderful stories with the children of Meadow Vale school and many

other people. Pupils from Kings Academy Oakwood and Young Leaders from 3<sup>rd</sup> Binfield read poems and prayers. The piper then played Flowers of the forest, while Wreaths were laid from Village Organisations. Luke then read the 92 names from the Roll of Honour, which was followed by the last post and two minutes silence. The service ended with a blessing.

Sunday Morning the standard bearers from The Royal British Legion and The Royal Naval Association, and colour parties from 1<sup>st</sup> Bineild Scouts, 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Binfield Guides and 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Binfield Brownies

lined the path to the church, as the congregation arrived.

The Standards entered to 'I vow to thee my country' and made their way to the alter. A member of Meadow Vale school, who is also a youth member spoke about the 100 years of The Royal British Legion. Then a poem 'Lest We Forget' written by Joan Humphries was read by members of 1<sup>st</sup> Binfield Guides and 3<sup>rd</sup> Binfield Brownies, and prayers read by 1<sup>st</sup> Binfield guides. The Standard Bearers made their way to the Roll of Honour to the strains of 'Lament to a Fallen Soldier', Wreaths were laid and a poppy was dropped for each of Binfields Fallen in All Conflicts. After the Last Post was played the two minutes silence followed .At the end of the two minutes silence Reville was played. The Standards Bearers returned to the final part of 'Lament to a fallen soldier'. The Standards were returned and collection taken to the hymn 'Amazing Grace'. After the National Anthem and blessing the service finished with the hymn 'I cannot tell'. The Collection went to The Poppy Appeal.

2021 has been a good year for Binfield Environment Group. We have been able to run some conservation work parties and other events, which have been supported by a good number of people. Amongst other things, this has allowed us to plant more pollinator-friendly flowers and shrubs

around the parish as well as staying on top of the ever-present menace of litter.

We also have a growing group of surveyors who are monitoring the birds and butterflies across a number of the green-spaces in the parish. These people are going out once a month and walking a pre-defined route so as to record what they see in a relatively scientific way. The data that they are gathering is giving us useful information on how the biodiversity in different parts of the parish compares and how it varies over the course of the year. One way that this is already proving useful is in complementing the information gathered as part of the environmental impact assessments of new developments. We have learnt things we didn't know about Binfield's nature from these EIAs (e.g. where noctule bats might roost) and we have also started to address some of the deficiencies in these EIAs such as that they only record species present at the time of year / day the surveys are conducted.

Blue Mountain continues to be a surprisingly good place to see a wide range of birds and butterflies. In part this is due to the

range of habitat types across the site and the relative maturity of some of these. Piglittle Meadow is a great place for butterflies and birds of prey. The former enjoy the wildflower meadow whilst the latter are easier to spot because of the wide-ranging views from the south-west corner of the site.

We'd like to do more to survey butterflies and other insects across the parish. We will also be investigating how we can make more use of some of the new generation of apps for recording



nature sightings, and how we can access data that users of these apps record in Binfield. If you want to share your experiences or want to help out then please get in touch.

We are in the process of preparing a survey to get feedback on what we should do more or less of in future. Please watch out for this survey and give us your thoughts.
