

God, Jesus and Me

the end for a hot chocolate!



We're looking forward to this year and the new opportunities it will bring us!







BINFIELD PATIENT GROUP

Having a stressful day or a bad night's sleep is all part of life. When this happens too often, it could become a problem. Check in with yourself, are any of these common challenges happening?

Stress that feels unmanageable

Everyone reacts differently under pressure. Building your resilience is the first step to coping.

How stress affects your mind and body:

A bit of stress is normal, like during a driving test or before a date. But when it's making you miserable, or affects your physical health, it's time to act. That can mean working on what's causing your stress as well as changing the way you react to it.

When you're stressed, your body releases hormones to help you cope in the moment – for example, by increasing your heart rate. High levels of stress, or over a long period of time, can therefore harm not only your physical health but your mental health too. So, it is important to reduce your stress where you can.

10 tips for managing stress:

- Exercise: go for a walk; it will release natural feel-good endorphins in your brain
- Reduce smoking and alcohol. Try and cut right back as they actually make problems worse.
- Eat well. Eat a healthy diet, including fruit and vegetables... and drink enough water.
- Prioritise sleep. Cut down on caffeine and screen time.
- Practise mindfulness. When you wake up focus on your breathing for a few minutes. Notice how you feel.
- Chill out. Do things that you enjoy and make you feel relaxed.
- Be your own cheerleader. Set realistic goals and reward your achievements.
- Communicate. Know when to say no to things, and don't take on too much.
- Take a break. A change of scenery can help you to relax and gain perspective.
- Seek support. Friends and family can help, or you could join a club, take a course or volunteer.

If you're worried about the effects of stress, don't be afraid to ask for help. Speak to someone you trust, or make an appointment to see your GP.

Trouble falling or staying asleep

Waking up without feeling rested can have a knock-on effect on the rest of your day. One in three people suffer from poor sleep, so here are some tips to help.

Six steps to a sound night's sleep

- Think about how much sleep you need: Aiming to get seven to nine hours sleep each night is about the right amount. Go to bed and wake up at the same time each day (including weekends and free days) to get into a good routine.
- **Dim the lights**: Unnatural light in the evening interferes with your body's 'sleep hormone' called melatonin. Dim the lights in the room at least two hours before you go to bed. This includes phones, tablets and laptops.
- Make time to relax: Stress can affect sleep. Relax before bed to help you to wind down and put aside any stresses from your day. You could try a warm bath or some light reading.
- Adjust your environment: Make sure your room is the right temperature for you and control any noise where you can. An eye mask and ear plugs can be a good investment.
- Make sleep mindful: Get into bed and lie on your back, if this is comfortable for you. Rest your hands on your tummy and take a deep breath in. Feel your tummy rise as you inhale. Breathe in and out for four counts. Repeat 10 times.
- Actively relax your body: Starting with the muscles in your toes, tense and then relax them. Work your way up your whole body, until you reach your forehead. Tensing all your muscles and then releasing them brings relaxation.

Hence, the focus is currently on encouraging pupils to walk or cycle to school rather than getting a lift, and on encouraging all of us to walk or cycle into town. As the scheme expands, the organisers want to encourage people to use other routes around Bracknell and they already promote The Cut Countryside Corridor.

There are also a number of locations where a QR code is displayed that enables you to access the Eco Rewards website. It seems likely that these will be locations for more readers in the future.

If you live in Binfield village you could replace car journeys by walking or cycling to school, or to town, and use the scheme to record your green miles and to estimate the carbon that you have saved. You could also walk to Tesco or to Bracknell Railway Station and tap on the Eco Rewards readers nearby.

Bracknell has a network of tree-lined paths radiating out from the town centre to places like South Hill Park, Larks Hill, and Lily Hill Park. Many of the Eco Reward reader are not far from these green corridors. Next time you are thinking about driving to one of Bracknell's green-spaces, how about walking or riding instead and hunting for some of the Eco Reward readers?

Registered participants are encouraged to use the Eco Rewards website as a shopping portal generating cash-back from many of the retailers. The registered retailers also pay a proportion of the money generated towards the management of the scheme

If you are using the Eco Rewards scheme I'd love to hear your ideas about how its use might benefit Binfield's nature.

We are in the process of preparing a survey to get feedback on what we should do more or less of in future. Please watch out for this survey and give us your thoughts.
