



A MESSAGE FROM YOUR RECTOR



Answered Prayer

A mother was getting a pie ready to put into the oven when the phone rang. It was the school nurse. Her son had come down with a high fever and would she come and take him home?

The mother calculated how long it would take to drive to school

and back, and how long the pie should bake, and concluded there was enough time. Popping the pie into the oven, she left for school. When she arrived, her son's fever was worse and the nurse urged her to take him to the doctor.

Seeing her son like that—his face flushed, his body trembling and dripping with perspiration—frayed her, and she drove to the clinic as fast as she dared. She was frayed a bit more waiting for the doctor to emerge from the examination room, which he was now doing, walking toward her with a slip of paper in his hand.

"Get him to bed," he told her, handing her the prescription, "and start him on this right away."

By the time she got the boy home and in bed and headed out again for the shopping mall, she was not only frayed, but frazzled and frantic as well. And she had forgotten about the pie in the oven. At the mall, she found a pharmacy, got the prescription filled and rushed back to the car.

Which was locked. Yes, there were her keys, hanging in the ignition switch, locked inside the car. She ran back into the mall, found a phone, and called home. When her son finally answered, she blurted out, "I've locked the keys inside the car!"

The boy was hardly able to speak. In a hoarse voice he whispered, "Get a wire coat hanger, Mom. You can get in with that."

She began searching the mall for a wire coat hanger—which turned out not to be easy. Wooden hangers and plastic hangers were there in abundance, but shops didn't use wire hangers anymore. After combing through a dozen stores, she found one that was behind the times just enough to use wire hangers. Hurrying out of the mall, she allowed herself a smile of relief. As she was about to step off the curb, she halted. She stared at the wire coat hanger. "I don't know what to do with this!"

Then she remembered the pie in the oven. All the frustrations of the past hour collapsed on her and she began crying. Then she prayed. "Dear Lord, my boy is sick and he needs this medicine and my pie is in the oven and the keys are locked in the car and, Lord, I don't know what to do with this coat hanger. Dear Lord, send somebody who does know what to do with it, and I really need that person NOW, Lord. Amen."

She was wiping her eyes when a beat-up old car pulled up to the curb and stopped in front of her. A young man, twentyish -looking, in a T-shirt and ragged jeans got out. The first thing she noticed about him was the long, stringy hair, and then the beard that hid everything south of his nose. He was coming her way. When he drew near, she stepped in front of him and held out the wire coat hanger. "Young man," she said, "Do you know how to get into a locked car with one of these?"

He gaped at her for a moment, then plucked the hanger from her hand. "Where's the car?"

She had never seen anything like it—it was simply amazing how easily he got into her car. A quick look at the door and window, a couple of twists of the coat hanger and bam! Just like that, the door was open.

When she saw the door open she threw her arms around him. "Oh," she said, "the Lord sent you. You're such a good boy. You must be a Christian."

He stepped back and said, "No ma'am. I'm not a Christian. And I'm not a good boy. I just got out of prison yesterday."

She jumped at him and hugged him again—fiercely. "Bless God!" she cried. "He sent me a professional!"

Would you have seen the young man as God answering your prayer? The Bible encourages you to pray about everything, it says this in the Philippians chapter 4 verse 6. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. Are you paying attention when God answers your prayer?

Finally for now, we are also looking at holding another **Binfield Doorstep Sale Trail** in April. Keep an eye out for a confirmation of the date and how to get involved!









The Lighthouse program remains a critical service for so many in our immediate area. Numbers of those in need of food and basic essentials are on the increase, with an additional 5 adults just in the last week. We are supporting approx. 40 heads in total and 5 dogs! We continue to deliver home cooked meals to our client base as opposed to meals onsite at St Marks.

Newbold Church also deliver foods to the client base over a weekend.

Waitrose awarded us a share of their "Community Matters" funding which will cover food ingredients for 3 weeks, some 450 meals. THANK YOU.

I will be stepping down as the Lighthouse Coordinator at the end of March, though will stay involved as a cook on a weekly basis. I will be returning to the office for my day job, which is based in Paddington and as such I simply will not have the time to dedicate. I am looking for a replacement to train with immediate effect, though the role could be split into component parts. Essentially there are some administrative tasks, coordination with the clients, cooks and drivers. There's also a planning element for the meals ie food shopping and

delivery to the cooks. We also have a need for additional drivers on a Tuesday evening, approx. 1 hour between 5pm and 6pm (flexible) to deliver the food parcels to our clients in the Bracknell area.

Please note we are unable to accept any bedding or clothing. The same applies for any bric-a-brac.

- Volunteers for administrative / coordination roles – 2 hours a week



BINFIELD GARDEN CLUB

At last! The long awaited return to the Memorial Hall for our February meeting!



There was a quiet buzz (pardon the pun!) of anticipation as we welcomed Jo Eddon who came to tell us "All about Honey Bees". We were well rewarded with an interesting insight

into the life of the honey bee and the care which Jo and husband Nigel provide. Together they run "Honeys of Henley" a thriving local business in which they use their knowledge, passion and care to collect and process honey using traditional methods. Jo told us how she talks to the bees as a way to keep herself (and the bees) calm but always wears a beekeepers suit to protect herself just in case. She described Nigel as a Bee Whisperer who preferred not to wear the protective suit.

The bees live in hive colonies called apiaries in various locations so they can collect nectar from a wide range of plants throughout the Chilterns and Thames Valley area. This includes wild flower meadows, orchards, soft fruit farms and vineyards. They prefer to fly just 150 to 750 yards from their hive but are known to go as far as 3 miles. If nectar sources become scarce they may even travel further afield.

Jo brought with her a hive to show us the inner workings and explained where the bees stored the nectar while it turned into honey on frames of wax sheets. It is the excess honey left

over after nurturing developing new bees that is harvested and put into jars for sale. The process is entirely natural and the only treatment used is filtering to remove any wax debris during the extraction process. We had the opportunity to buy some honey – set or runny - which proved very popular and also candles made from old wax melted down.

This was a most enjoyable and very positive start to our ongoing season of meetings and talks which we hope will continue to be held in the Memorial Hall. The next meeting is on **3rd March** with speakers Angela & Graham O'Connell from the National Gardens Scheme on "The Perils and Pleasures of opening your Garden".



Hedgerows are amazing things. They are havens for wildlife. They are dividing lines in our landscape. They are historical artefacts. And, they are carbon stores. However, hedgerows are under constant threats from natural factors, neglect, or destruction in the name of progress.

The older a hedge, the greater the diversity of species that can be found in the hedge and nearby. However, a younger healthier hedge may be more biodiverse than an older neglected hedge. A healthy hedge also has a positive effect on nearby crops, as it acts as a home of pollinating insects and predators of insects that are harmful to the crops. This results in some crops doing better within a certain distance of hedges.

Some of Binfield's most remarkable nature relies on hedgerows from the threatened hedgehog to the increasingly rare yellowhammer. Even the house sparrow, whose numbers have declined dramatically since the 1960s, depend on hedges. These sociable birds like to rest in impenetrable shrubs creating what my brother calls "shouty bushes". Our hedgerows also provide routes through the landscape for birds, animals and insects. A gap in a hedge can cause these natural travellers significant problems.

We use hedges to divide up our world, separating our gardens and our fields. Many of the older hedgerows in our parish are reminders of the history of how we have divided the countryside up into parishes, boroughs etc.

Two years ago I had my first go at hedge-laying. It was incredible to find out how resilient hedgerow plants are and how an apparently drastic haircut can result in a burst of growth which makes the hedge better for wildlife and better as a barrier between fields.

Bracknell Forest Council has nominated 2022 as the Year of the Green Corridor. This gives us a chance to celebrate our hedgerows. At the time of writing, Binfield Environment Group has planted more than 40 trees and shrubs to fill gaps in the hedges around Wicks Green. We have also started mapping the hedges across the parish with the aim of surveying them. If you want to find out more, or get involved, then please contact us.

There is very little legislation protecting them but there is an obligation on developers to preserve notable hedges. One of the things that we can do as a local community is to keep an eye on local developments, and if there is likely to be a hedgerow impacted, to make sure that an appropriate comment or objection is made to Bracknell Forest Council to ensure the necessary protections are in place.

WORRIED ABOUT YOUR MEMORY?

HOW CAN YOU TELL IF MEMORY PROBLEMS ARE A SIGN OF SOMETHING SERIOUS?

Forgetting why you went upstairs or feeling that a word is 'on the tip of your tongue'. We've all done it — and most of the time, small memory slips aren't serious. Many people find that their memory becomes less reliable as they get older.

However, memory loss can also be an early sign of dementia. This is especially true if you:

Struggle to remember recent events, although you can easily recall things from longer ago.

Find it hard to follow conversations or programmes on TV.

Forget the names of close friends or everyday objects.

Struggle to recall things you have heard, seen or read recently.

Regularly lose the thread of what you are saying.

Find yourself putting objects in unusual places – such as your keys in the fridge.

Feel confused, even in a familiar place, or get lost on familiar journeys.

Find that people start to notice or comment on your memory loss.

What should I do next?

If you're worried about your memory, talk to your GP or to ALZHEIMERS. It is important to find out the reason for the problems as there may be treatment or support available that can help.

Earache (middle ear infection 8 days
Sore throat 7 – 8 days
Cold 14 days
Cough or bronchitis 21 days
