
PRACTICE THE PRESENCE OF GOD

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR RECTOR



EVERYONE IS IMPORTANT

During Mark's first month of college, the professor gave his students a pop quiz. He was a conscientious student and had breezed through the questions, until he read the last one: "What is the first name of the woman who cleans the

school?" Surely this was some kind of joke. He had seen the cleaning woman several times. She was tall, dark-haired and in her 50s, but how would he know her name? He handed in his paper, leaving the last question blank.

Just before class ended, one student asked if the last question would count toward the quiz grade. "Absolutely," said the professor. "In your careers, you will meet many people. All are significant. They each deserve your attention and care, even if all you do is smile and say 'hello'". Mark never forgot that lesson. He also learned her name was Dorothy.



COVID and FLU vaccines for patients of Binfield surgery:

Patients will be contacted in due course.

REPEAT PRESCRIPTIONS:

Whenever possible please order your repeat prescriptions only via the internet on Patient Access or via the NHS app.

NEW PATIENTS:

If you are not yet registered at any surgery and wish to be enrolled at Binfield surgery please visit www.binfieldsurgery.co.uk for further information.

If you do not have access to the internet the telephone number of the surgery is (01344) 286264.

NEW SURGERY AT BLUE MOUNTAIN:

It is expected that the surgery will move from it's present site to the new Blue Mountain site in the early part of next year.

GP PATIENT SURVEY:

325 surveys were recently sent out of which 114 were completed. EASY TO GET THROUGH TO BINFIELD PRACTICE BY PHONE RECORDED 70%. The national average was 53%.

GOOD OVERALL EXPERIENCE OF BINFIELD PRACTICE RECORDED 78%. The national average was 72%.

RESPIRATORY VIRUSES:

Even though restrictions have eased, COVID-19 and other respiratory viruses are still very much with us. We encourage everyone to keep doing all you can to protect yourself, your family and your friends. This includes preventing infection through some very basic hygiene routines and having vaccines and boosters when offered.

Simple steps to help reduce the risk of infection include: wearing a face covering in busy public spaces, washing your hands regularly, meeting friends and family outdoors if possible or keeping rooms well ventilated if meeting indoors, staying at home when you're feeling unwell and respecting other people's decisions.

Binfield Surgery – the new normal.

We were encouraged to avoid face to face appointments where possible throughout the pandemic.

The lessons that we have learned have enabled us to provide you with a more efficient and more flexible service now we can be fully open for business.

We have discovered that around 80% of patient contacts with the doctors can be successfully resolved by remote consultations. This is probably higher than many practices, because of the experience and seniority of the doctors and because of the ability of our patients to communicate effectively over the telephone.

There is no doubt that technological solutions such as the ability to send and receive documents and photographs by text has helped this capability.

We feel that there is no going back to the old ways. We have discovered many advantages for our patients in this new normal way of working.

 Our capacity to manage the workload has increased, as an average phone conversation takes less time than an average

- face to face consultation.
- The capacity of our building and infrastructure has increased.
 You cannot have failed to notice a difference in the ability to park your car at the surgery.
- Most patients appreciate the flexibility that the new system brings. No longer do you have to take time off work to seek our advice. When you do come to see us, you can, to some degree, come at a time of your choosing, as we can also be flexible when we call our patients.
- We can now offer follow up appointments by telephone without insisting that you call us back.
- Irrespective of coronavirus, there are many respiratory viruses that circulate in our population in winter. Was it ever a good idea to pack the waiting room with coughing children close to some frail elderly patients? GP PARTNERS - Binfield Surgery

BINFIELD'S NATURE AND THE SUMMER OF 2022

Over the summer, members of Binfield
Environment Group have continued surveying birds
and butterflies across the parish. We have also discovered other
like-minded individuals surveying bats, reptiles and insects. In
addition, we ran a series of walks to see and hear bats and to
learn more about the four green-spaces that we survey.

During the latter, we saw some special birds, butterflies and dragonflies, and learnt about badgers, specimen trees, aquatic plants, surveying apps and some of the best places to sit and have a quiet moment. One of the surveyors also promised us a future session on the sex-life of the dunnock! This secretive brown bird that visits many of our gardens leads an intriguing polygamous lifestyle.



The hot summer seems to have been good for dunnocks and many of the other birds that breed around Binfield. Generally, the breeding success of many bird species increases in dry summers as long as there is plenty of food around. As many of us have carried on putting out food and water for the birds, the species that visit our garden bird feeders, such as starlings and sparrows, seem to have done well. You may also have seen blue tits and great tits bringing their youngsters to your garden feeders throughout the summer. It is likely that many species, including these two, will have produced multiple broods during the spring and summer.

As long as they have been able to find shelter, food and water, the local hedgehogs seem to have had a good summer too with more people than ever telling us that they have seen them in their gardens or wandering around the village at dusk.

The story may not have been so good for other species. Although the bats that we see most often around the village, common and soprano pipistrelles, are doing ok, there seems to be a decline in observations of some of the rarer species that feed over our ponds and rivers. Warfield Environment Group are working with a couple of other organisations to find out if this is due to an increase in the level of pollution in these water-bodies.

Our surveyors have also seen fewer butterflies this year. We don't yet know if this is a local anomaly or a regional trend. The populations of particular species of butterflies do fluctuate significantly each year depending on the weather at key points in their lifecycle and the availability of the plants that they depend on. What we do know is that some of the wildflower areas in Binfield's green-spaces have not been as floriferous this year. However, butterfly success depends on more than the number of flowers. The caterpillars of particular species are surprisingly dependent on certain native plants and even the adult butterflies are adapted to feed on particular flowers.

By the time you read this, BEG will have started running autumn and winter work parties. These are held on the third Saturday of every month and are generally spent improving green-spaces in the parish for nature.

After the formal meeting and a brief break for refreshments, Shipmates settled down to this month's speaker. An excellent presentation by S/M Martin followed, with the story of the naval arms race among Argentina, Brazil and Chile and a very unusual battleship that never even made it to South America.

Launched in 1913 she was originally called "Rio de Janeiro" by the Brazilians. However, she was affectionately known as the "Big Ship" or the "Giant" by the workers at Armstrong Shipbuilders in Newcastle upon Tyne. She was designed with no less than fourteen 12-inch guns and 20 6-inch guns and was the biggest ship of its kind ever built. However, she was to never join the Brazilian Naval fleet as they eventually couldn't pay for her before she was finished. The shipyard then agreed a deal with the Turkish government, and she was renamed "Sultan Osman 1" by the Ottoman Turks and many changes were made to her internally in readiness to join her new Navy. Sadly, war broke out finding the Turks on the opposite side to the British. So, she was seized by Britain and finally joined the Royal Navy and renamed HMS Agincourt. After some more changes to her internals, she set sail and played a pivotal role in the First World War. Eventually, she was sold for scrap in 1922 but was not broken up until 1924.


