WEDNESDAY WOMEN'S WALK



A MESSAGE FROM YOUR RECTOR



As Sovereign, The Queen was Head of the Armed Forces, also known as the Commander in Chief of the British Armed Forces. She also had experience of being a wife, mother and grandmother to members of her family that served in the Armed Forces.

Her relationship with the Armed Forces began when, as Princess Elizabeth, she joined the Auxiliary Territorial Service (ATS) in 1945, becoming the first female member of the Royal Family to join the Armed Services as a full-time active member. During her time in the ATS, the Princess learnt to drive and to maintain vehicles.

In addition to awarding various military honours at investitures, The Queen also introduced the Elizabeth Cross. The first medal to which The Queen put her name, this was instituted in 2009 to give special recognition to the families of those who have died on military operations, or as a result of terrorism, since 1948.

As we grieve the loss of the Queen, we have been reminded that she said these words to the world on her 21st Birthday.

I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong.

But I shall not have strength to carry out this resolution alone unless you join in it with me, as I now invite you to do: I know that your support will be unfailingly given. God help me to make good my vow, and God bless all of you who are willing to share in it.

I believe, like many others, that the Queen lived up to her promise, and this verse from the Bible aptly sums her up.

Let love and faithfulness never leave you; bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart. Proverbs Chapter 3 verse 3.

As we have reflected on her incredible life of service and sacrifice, this month, we also remember those who lived their lives in service and sacrifice to this country in all wars. Lest we forget, many of them gave their service and sacrifice fighting for our freedom and died miles from home and loved ones. Why don't we, like the Queen, resolve to devote ourselves to the service of others and to support each other as we do this, asking God to help us wear love and faithfulness around our necks and as tablets on our hearts? BINFIELD LIBRARY NEWS

New tablet device loan scheme for library members

Just like library books, library members can now borrow tablets free of charge. Borrowing a tablet can help if you struggle to access digital equipment and computers and if you would like help getting online for social interaction, education, work, wellbeing and boosting your IT skills.

Library members can borrow a Galaxy Tab A7 tablet device for a period of up to six weeks with the option to extend for a further 6 weeks by agreement.

Contact staff at Binfield Library to express your interest or email bracknell.library@bracknell-forest.gov.uk. Borrowers will need to agree to a loan agreement at the time of collecting - available to pick from all Bracknell Forest libraries.

We will supply you with an introductory guide and library staff can also talk you through the basics of the device, so even if you have never touched a computer before, you can feel confident enough to take your first steps online.

The tablets are pre-loaded with apps to help borrowers enjoy free library e-books or e-audio books, e-magazines and e-newspapers and digital music. Other apps include BBC iPlayer, BBC Sounds, Teams and Zoom for online meetings and YouTube.

If you don't have your own internet connection (broadband, WIFI) we ask you to connect to local WIFI. WIFI (and comfortable

seating) is available free of charge at all our library branches.



BINFIELD ENVIRONMENT GROUP SURVEY

Earlier this year we carried out a survey of our members. Thank you to everyone who took part.

All the responses were positive about the work that Binfield Environment Group currently do. The key findings from the survey were:

- Respondents want BEG to run more led walks. Since the survey closed, we have run bat walks and led walks round all of our survey sites. We will continue to do this, particularly over the summer months.
- To run work parties at different times and on different days. Our main work parties are on the third Saturday of each month, but we will look at changing the timings depending on the nature of the events. We will also run occasional Thursday work parties when we have specific tasks to do.
- To do more to communicate about Binfield's nature both to local residents in general and to young people in particular. We have started contacting local schools and have a couple of ideas for specific projects that we will be pitching to some of these schools. We have also been invited to talk to the Women's Institute, the Binfield Garden Club and a local company about out work and will be using these talks to encourage local people to do more for nature.

Survey responses also made specific recommendations related to taking on land to manage for nature, getting more people involved in litter-picking and doing something to have both more dog-friendly and more dog-free areas.

- Bracknell Forest and Binfield Parish councils are exploring ideas related to managing land for nature. However, we would love to hear from anyone that owns land in the parish which would be suitable for a nature reserve or similar green-space.
- More and more people are getting involved in litterpicking in the parish and beyond. If you would like to join them then please consider signing up to Binfield Parish Council's sponsor-a-street initiative (<u>https:// binfieldparishcouncil.gov.uk/get-involved/</u>).
- As dog-related issues are not in the scope of BEG's work, we have passed the suggestions about dogs on to both councils.

Our next few events will be:

- Saturday November 19th Farley Copse work party. We will be pushing back brambles, holly and ivy to allow more light into the copse and to encourage other plants to grow, and we will be working in the pond.
- Saturday December 17th Wicks Green (Christmas) work party. We will be carrying out a number of tasks across Wicks Green and Silver Jubilee Field to increase the attractiveness of the areas for nature. There might be mulled wine and mince pies.
- Saturday January 21st Wicks Green work party. We will be finishing off tasks in Wicks Green.

Saturday February 18th – Popes Meadow work party. We will be clearing round some of the important trees, planting more trees, and clearing out the ditch.

In addition to our regular events, we are planning to: launch a tree trail; start to attract swifts to nest in the parish; and to do some surveying in the River Cut. We hope to have activities suitable for everyone, so please get in touch if you would like to get involved. 

I believe many of us hadn't heard of Corokias but they have become a wonderful, disease free alternative to Box with its caterpillar problems. Wisley has been trialling them, they are evergreen, frost hardy and certainly worth growing. There are several varieties, all hybrids from just three parents. Mona showed us one which has yellow flowers in spring, one which turns bronze in winter, another with silver leaves and many more. She held us all in thrall with her tales of how she built up the National

Collection and about the people who brought the plants from New Zealand. Mona has written a book and does open her garden. That would certainly be worth a visit. See **monasgarden.co.uk**
