The Men's Monthly Walk takes place on the 1st Saturday of each month. We start at 7.45am from the car park at Oakmede Shops.



#### **PAUSE FOR THOUGHT**

We have more degrees but less sense, more knowledge, but less judgment, more experts in just about everything, yet more problems.

We have more medicine, but less wellness. We drink too much, smoke too much, spend too recklessly, laugh too little, drive too fast, get too angry, stay up too late, get up too tired, read too little, watch TV too much, and pray far too seldom.

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
# **CHILDREN AND YOUTH**



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


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
