## A MESSAGE FROM YOUR CURATE AND SERVICES



In Victor Hugo's novel, *Les Misérables*, Jean Valjean steals bread to feed his starving nephews and nieces. He is caught and sent to prison, serving 19 years after trying to escape. On his release, he is given a yellow passport, which marks him as an ex-convict making him unwelcome

wherever he goes. When he steals some precious silverware from a Bishop who gave him hospitality, to his great surprise, the bishop, instead of accusing Valjean, covers for him, telling the police that he gave him the treasure as a gift.

This generous act transforms Valjean. He repents of his criminal life to become a man of integrity, a philanthropist and the guardian of an orphan, Cosette. The bishop's astonishing gesture of undeserved kindness gives him life!

In a similar way, the gift God gave us at Christmas, His Son Jesus Christ, gives *us* life. His love, with no strings attached, means we no longer need to feel guilty, but are forgiven and free to flourish.

## 1st Binfield Scout Group: Malawi 2024 Expedition

In summer 2024, we as 5 Scouts/Explorers from 1<sup>st</sup> Binfield Air Scouts will embark on a life-changing expedition to Malawi to work alongside *Joshua*, a British charity (<u>www.joshuainmalawi.org.uk/</u>) who believe in 'giving children the best possible start in life through Early Child Development work'. This initiative aims to provide us with a unique cultural experience, while engaging in meaningful community service projects.

*Malawi 2024* will be a transformative experience for us as individuals and as representatives of our Scout group. It will not only broaden our horizons but instil a sense of empathy, leadership, and a commitment to making a positive impact to other young people.

In order to make this project a reality we need to raise £3,750 each. This covers the cost of the training programme, travel, insurance, food, central equipment, and cultural activities.

#### Showing the armed forces you care

Saturday afternoon the sun was shining, and we had a good turnout for the Remembrance Service, at the War Memorial at St Mark's Church. The service was opened by The Royal British Legion, The

Royal Naval Association, 1<sup>st</sup> Binfield Guides and 3<sup>rd</sup> Binfield Brownies Standards paraded in to the march of The British Legion. The service started with a welcome and opening prayer from Reverend Luke Taylor.
