

MARCH ECO CHURCH WATCH

March is often proclaimed by stormy, windy weather, hence its

Roman name derived from the god of war. The Saxons called it Hlyd Monath or stormy and rugged month. As the month progresses, we feel spring moving in, seeing and hearing the changing season as Wordsworth observed when on 'the first mild day of March' he heard a robin heralding spring, 'the redbreast sings from the tall larch.'

It is also the month of two important saints, St David and St Patrick. As a student in Wales, I learnt not only to appreciate the beauty of Welsh music and culture, but also the influence of St David. Although of royal birth, David was known for his humbleness in preaching. This lives on in his own recorded words of 'to do little things,' (Gwnewch y pethau bychain.) In other words, we can all do our bit for our community and environment. It all counts, whether we pick up rubbish on the path or plant bee friendly plants in the garden.

Sometimes, the small and humble grow and create an expansive network like the growth of the wood-wide web in a forest. In the Gambia, Isatou Ceesay, noticed the increasing amount of rubbish piling up in her community, harming people and animals. Vegetables failed to grow as rubbish covered and polluted the soil. She was determined to train to help her

community with recycling which led to a project generating income for local women. From collecting up plastic waste, making the environment safer, they recycled usable plastics to make bags and jewellry which they sold, enabling them to become financially independent. This 21st Century heroine is a modern 'Saint,' inspiring and enabling her community to improve their environment, their lives, and the lives of their children. The project has grown from clearing up waste in one local community, to disposing of waste in four separate communities, besides creating jobs for marginalised people and forest preservation.

During March, the 'little things' we can do are to plant catmint, hyssop and lavender for the bumble and honeybees. March thorough to September are important months for bees who fly when the temperature reaches above 10 degrees Centigrade. March is also the month of some of the most beautiful yellow flowering wild-flowers such as celandine and wild primroses. Grow lesser celandines in your garden as they are a valuable source of nectar and pollen for emerging bumblebees. Grow Primula vulgaris, or wild primrose, sourced from garden

centres, for pollinators such as bees and for moth caterpillars. Plant primroses in a shaded cool spot. You will benefit nature, your family and community. *Kate Ellison-Bourne*



This included a local Armed Forces Veterans' Hub, run by Royal Berkshire Fire & Rescue Service, at Newbury Fire Station and the "laying up of the old Branch Standard and dedication of new one" in Northamptonshire (Rushden).

The Branch Standard was Paraded at two Remembrance Services in Binfield on 11th & 12th November with a Branch S/M laying a wreath at each service. A Poppy Wreath was also laid at the service in Bracknell, arranged by BTC, and was attended by eight S/Ms. A fourth wreath was laid at our local CWGC grave for a WWII Sailor in Binfield.

Three days Charity Collecting in December at a local Tesco resulted in £1402-74 being received in donations, £1050 of which has so far been donated to other "naval" charities, including the local Maidenhead Sea & Marine Cadet Unit. Dates have already been arranged for more collecting in December 2024 as well as a day in June.
