# A MESSAGE FROM YOUR RECTOR & SERVICES



Father Christmas existed many years before Coca-Cola started to use him for its Christmas advertising campaign.

Historians agree that this character

was inspired by Saint Nicholas, Bishop of Myra of the 4th Century, who was famous for leaving coins in the shoes and stockings of poor children. The legend of Santa bringing gifts to the homes of well-behaved children on the night of Christmas Eve became so popular in western culture that many illustrators attempted to bring him to life. Before 1931 Santa looked very different in various places. Sometimes tall and thin, or even like an elf. There was even a scarier version of him.

However, In 1931 Coca Cola was doing the maths on its sales. They noticed something, people bought Coca Cola in the summer, a little bit in the fall, a little bit in the spring, but not in the winter. People just didn't think of it as a winter drink. Coca Cola hired an artist named Haden Sundblum to paint Santa for their Christmas ads. His art work turned Santa into a happy man, with a round face and rosy cheeks, white hair, twinkling eyes and laughter lines. Sundblum version was inspired by a famous poem from 1822 called a visit from Saint Nicholas also known as t'was the night before Christmas.

Then the Coca Cola advertisers found a saint who was about to be decanonized, Santa Claus. They grabbed him and merged him with the story of Saint Nick. The inspiration was also to merge him with Kris Kringle. Kris Kringle was a Danish thief whose job in the day was a chimney sweep. He could pop his shoulders out and fit down a chimney. He would rob your house, and then work his way back up, but you'd have a clean chimney.

They stuck Saint Nick, now Santa Claus, in Coca Cola colours, red and white, made him into an old man, so he could have white hair and beard and rosy checks. Then they stuck him on the bottle. That's why periodically you'll see Sant Claus on Coca Cola bottle or can.

Is Christmas really all about an advertising campaign by Coca Cola? For the correct answer to that question we need to turn to Charlie Brown and Linus.

In a Charlie Brown Christmas, after everyone turns against him because of the Christmas tree he picked, and feeling that everything he does turns into a disaster, Charlie says, "I guess I really don't know what Christmas is all about. Isn't there anyone who knows what Christmas is all about?"

Linus answers, "Charlie Brown, I can tell you what Christmas is all about.

*And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone*



## ECO CHURCH WATCH

As we snuggle into warm blankets, sipping hot chocolate, it seems as though the world has become reduced by darker evenings, less time to walk the dog, for children to play outdoors, to get home to the warm and dry. There was an advertising slogan, 'Small is Beautiful,' and this concept really lifts the mood of winter.

Small, singular leaves silvered and whitened by hoarfrost and, sometimes reduced to translucent filigreed, lacy designs by the loss of chlorophyll, are a natural wonder, so exquisite, so delicate. Then, there are the skeleton husks of umbellifers, such as Cow Parsley or Wild Carrot, dipped in frost. Why not take a photo to share, do a quick sketch, or stitch a lacy leaf design when you spot them?

First time, I saw a small brown wren flittering and hopping around the undergrowth, I was entranced. I put out some mealworms for my new friend who, as a member of a mainly insectivorous species, was very happy whilst I could watch quietly from the window. Another small wonder was the goldcrest, Britain's smallest bird weighing the same as a 20p coin. Aptly named birds, the male's fiery yellow and orange head crest shouts 'look at me!' The female's crest is nearly as bright, as the male's crest, but is all yellow. When catching insects, they will hang upside down to grab them from the

underside of tree branches.

I have been reading 'Late Light' by Michael Malay. As a student and immigrant to Bristol, he made friends with an ornithologist who introduced him to yellowhammers and skylarks. He was hooked and fell in love with nature. Later, he found that development was threatening the countryside and its species. He wrote 'Late Night' to celebrate the forgotten species that are so important to the eco system such as moths and crickets. He wanted to highlight the way the little things effect the larger ones and vice versa, how every species, including us, is linked. In the book, he brings out the magic of hearing crickets, the beat of moths' wings and explains the importance of not forgetting the small species, not only their beauty and interest, but also their impact on the cycle of nature and how we depend on them.

Why not keep a nature notebook, whether on paper or phone, of the beauty and wonder you experience around you on those crisp, cold winter walks? When feeding the birds, look out for and feed the smaller species as well as the larger ones!
